PRASAR BHARATI – THE CORPORATION

1.1 Introduction:

Prasar Bharati is India's Public Service Broadcaster with the largest reach. It is an autonomous body set up by an act of Parliament and comprises Doordarshan (Television network) and All India Radio (Radio Network) which were earlier under the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Govt. of India.

Prasar Bharati was established in 1997 by an act of Parliament with a mandate to organise and conduct public service to inform, educate and entertain the public and to ensure a balanced development of broadcasting in the country.

1.2 Objectives

The major objectives of the Prasar Bharati Corporation as laid out in the Prasar Bharati Act, 1990 are as follows:

- To uphold the unity and integrity of the country and the values enshrined in the Constitution;
- To promote national integration;
- To safeguard citizen's rights to be informed on all matters of public interest by presenting a fair and balanced flow of information;
- To pay special attention to the fields of education and spread of literacy, agriculture, rural development, environment, health & family welfare and science & technology;
- To create awareness about women's issues and take special steps to protect the interests of children, aged and other vulnerable sections of the society;
- To provide adequate coverage to diverse cultures, sports and games and youth affairs;
- To promote social justice, safeguarding the rights of working classes, minorities and tribal communities.
- To promote research and expand broadcasting facilities and development in broadcast technolgoy.

The Prasar Bharati Board

The organisation, is governed by the Prasar Bharati Board, which comprises a Chairman, an Executive Member (Chief Executive Officer), a Member (Finance), a Member (Personnel), six part-time Members, a representative of the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting and the Directors General of All India Radio and Doordarshan as ex-officio Members. The Chairman is a part time Member with three years tenure. The Executive Member has a tenure of five years, subject to age limit of 65 years. Member (Finance) and the Member (Personnel) are whole time Members with six year tenure, subject to the age limit of 62 years.

The Prasar Bharati Board meets at least six times in a year.

ORGANISATION SET UP

The Prasar Bharati Board functions at the apex level ensuring formulation and implementation of the policies of the organization and fulfilment of the mandate in terms of the Prasar Bharati Act, 1990. The Executive Member functions as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Corporation. Officers from different streams working in the Prasar Bharati Secretariat assist the CEO, Members (Finance) and Member (Personnel) in integrating actions, operations, plans and policy implementation as well as manage the budget, accounts and general financial matters of the Corporation.

Prasar Bharati Marketing offices located at centres such as New Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai, Bangalore, Jalandhar and Hyderabad look after all marketing activities of both All India Radio and Doordarshan.

Prasar Bharati also has a unified vigilance set up at the headquarters, headed by a Chief Vigilance Officer.

The Directors General head the Directorate General of All India Radio and Doordarshan.

ALL INDIA RADIO

Director General, All India Radio is responsible for the overall administration of the entire Akashvani network consisting of 277 stations and 433 broadcast transmitters of which 148 are MW (Medium Wave). 237 FM (Frequency Modulation) and 48 SW (Short Wave) transmitters as on 01.04.2012. In the performance of the duties of the Director General, the following offcers assist:

PROGRAMME WING

The Director General is assisted by Additional Directors General in the Headquarters and in the regions in matters relating to programming and content creation. The Headquarters of the Regional ADGs are situated at Kolkata (ER) Mumbai (WR-I&II), Lucknow (CR-I), Bhopal (CR-II), Guwahati (NER I&II), Chennai (SR-I), Bangalore (SR-II), Delhi (NR-I) and Chandigarh (NR-II).

ENGINEERING WING

In respect of technical matters of All India Radio, The Director General is assisted by the Engineer-in-Chief and Additional Directors General (Engineering) posted in the headquarters and in the Zones. A Planning and Development Unit in the Headquarters assists the Director General in respect of Development Plan Schemes of All India Radio. The Civil Construction Wing (CCW), headed by a Chief Engineer looks after the civil construction needs of the department. CCW also caters to the needs of Doordarshan.

ADMINISTRATION WING

A Deputy Director General (Administration) assists the Director General on all matters of general administration while Additional Director General (Programme), in administration of Programme personnel. A Director looks after the Engineering Administration of All India Radio, while another Director (Admin. & Finance) assists DG in matters of administration and finance.

SECURITY WING

A Deputy Director General (Security), is assisted by Assistant Director General (Security) and a Deputy Director (Security) on matters of the security and safety of AIR installations, transmitters, studios, offices, etc. The Security needs of Doordarshan are also looked after by these officers.

AUDIENCE RESEARCH WING

There is a Director, Audience Research to assist the Director General in carrying out surveys on the programmes broadcast by various stations of All India Radio.

Activities of Sub-ordinate Offices of AIR in Brief

There are a number of subordinate offices of All India Radio performing distinct functions. Broad activities, in brief, are given below:

NEWS SERVICES DIVISION

News Services Division works round the clock and broadcasts over 647 news bulletins both in the home and external services. The bulletins are in Indian and Foreign languages. This division is headed by Director General, News. There are 44 Regional News Units originating regional news and providing inputs for National/Regional news.

EXTERNAL SERVICES DIVISION

The External Services Division of All India Radio broadcasts in 27 languages – 16 foreign and 11 Indian languages. These services are radiated for an aggregate duration of 72 hours daily and are projected to over 100 countries.

TRANSCRIPTION & PROGRAMME EXCHANGE SERVICE

Transcription and Programme Exchange service looks after exchange of programmes among the stations, and building and maintenance of sound archives and release of prestigious recordings of music maestros their marketing.

RESEARCH DEPARTMENT

The functions of the Research Department include Research and Development of equipment required by AIR and Doordarshan, investigation and studies relating to AIR and Doordarshan, Development of Prototype models of R&D equipment for limited use field trials in the network of AIR and Doordarshan.

CENTRAL STORE OFFICE

The Central Stores Office located at New Delhi performs functions relating to procurement, stocking and distribution of engineering stores required for the maintenance of technical equipment at All India Radio Stations.

STAFF TRAINING INSTITUTE (PROGRAMME)

The Staff Training Institute (Programme) was setup in 1948 at the Directorate.The institute is now located at Kingsway Camp, Delhi and imparts in-service training to Programme Personnel and Administrative Staff and induction course for the newly recruited staff and short duration refresher courses. It also conducts departmental examinations for administrative staff.

In addition, there are Regional Training Institutes at Bhubhuneshwar, Hyderabad, Shillong, Lucknow, Ahmedabad and Thiruvananthapuram.

STAFF TRAINING INSTITUTE (TECHNICAL)

The Staff Training Institute (Technical), part of the Directorate since 1948, now functions at Kingsway Camp, Delhi. The Institute organizes Training Courses for the engineering staff of All India Radio and Doordarshan from the level of Technician to the Superintending Engineer. It also conducts Departmental, Qualifying and Competitive Examinations. There is one Regional Staff Training institute (Technical) at Bhubaneswar.

CBS CENTRES & VIVIDH BHARATI

There are 37 Vividh Bharati-cum-Commercial Broadcasting Service (CBS) Centers including exclusive VB Centers. The CBS centers are responsible for marketing of airtime on Primary channels and on Vividh Bharati channels. The CBS centers coordinate with the apex sales office Central Sales Unit, located in Mumbai for airtime sale, billing, accounting, client service, agency registration etc.

DOORDARSHAN

Director General is the head of Doordarshan who is assisted by Deputy Director Generals in the programme wing, Engineer-in Chief in Engineering Wing, Additional Director General (A&F) in Administration and Finance Wing and Additional Director General (News) in News and Current Affairs Wing.

PROGRAMME WING:

Like All India Radio, Deputy Directors General (DDGs) looks after all aspects relating to programme conceptualization, production and acquisition at national, regional and local level. They are assisted by Directors/Deputy Directors (programmes). These officers belong to programme cadre of Doordarshan.

NEWS WING:

The News Wing of Doordarshan is responsible for procurement, editing and production of all news and current affairs programmes broadcast on Doordarshan Channels at the national and regional level. Director General (News) heads the News wing of Doordarshan.

Engineering Wing:

Engineering wing is headed by Engineer-in-Chief. He is assisted by the Chief Engineers and Directors at Directorate and the zonal offices which are located at Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai and Guwahati. Engineer-in-Chief is responsible for overall maintenance of technical activities including planning, system design, project implementation, operation and maintenance, human resource and training.

Administration & Finance Wing:

The Administration & Finance Wing of Doordarshan is headed by Additional Director General (ADG), who also functions as Internal Financial Advisor and he assists the Director General on all matters of general administration, personnel management, budget & plan coordination and finance. ADG is assisted by the DDGs/Deputy Directors of administration and finance.

Prasar Bharati through All India Radio and Doordarshan provides maximum coverage of the population and is one of the largest terrestrial, networks in the world. The immense social responsibility of the Prasar Bharati- AIR and Doordarshan is in consonance with the potential of the network as it reaches vast masses of the people throughout the country. Over the years, Prasar Bharati true to its role as India's Public Service Broadcaster has been successful to a great extent in fulfilling its statutory mandate as enshrined in Section 12 of the Prasar Bharati Act.

Doordarshan and All India Radio are perhaps the only media which are safeguarding the citizen's rights to be informed freely, truthfully and objectively on all matters of public interest, national or international, and presenting a fair and balanced flow of information including contrasting views without advocating any opinion or ideology of its own. Through its various programmes, the Organization has always strived to uphold the unity and integrity of the country and the values enshrined in the constitution.

The organisation has been paying special attention to the fields of education and spread of literacy, agriculture, rural development, environment, health and family welfare and science and technology. It has been providing adequate coverage to the diverse cultures and languages of the various regions of the country by broadcasting appropriate programmes. It has been broadcasting appropriate programmes keeping in view the special needs of the youth, status and problems of women, social justice, welfare of working classes, special needs of minorities and tribal communities, protecting the interest of the children and vulnerable sections, etc.

The need for a public service broadcaster like Prasar Bharati has further increased in view of more than 800 channels that are concentrating on commercial programming only. Prasar Bharati is the only counter balancing force in a highly commercialized electronic media environment. In fact, the ethical norms and guidelines developed by Prasar Bharati over a period of time are serving as bench marks for the industry.

Prasar Bharati – Policy Initiatives

The Prasar Bharati Board held six meetings during the year (2011-2012) (i.e. 102nd to 107th) in which a number of policy and administrative decisions were taken. The decisions were aimed not only at fulfilling the public service mandate of the organisation but also enabling it to meet challenges passed by the competitive scenario as well as rapid technological advances. Some of the significant decisions taken during the year are given here under:

- Introduction of e-auction system for allocation of Channels on DTH platform.
- Expansion of the capacity of Doordarshan's DTH platform.
- Allocation of Rs 300 crore to AIR for setting up of new AIR FM Radio stations.
- Set up of PB Secretariat organisation.

to project, promote and propagate the rich cultural heritage of our country. AIR Music Competition is a regular feature of AIR to reach and hunt new talent among youth. For the year 2011, this competition was held at Delhi and Chennai for Hindustani and Carnatic Music respectively.

CARNATIC MUSIC

The financial year i.e. April 2011 to March 2012, commenced with the Trinity and Other Vaggeyakara Music Festival which was held at Chennai from 15th to 17th April,2011. In this festival both young and prominent artists featured to enrich the occasion. Tyagaraja Compositions were rendered by Smt. Geetha Rajshekhar, Ramnadpuram Srinivasa Iyengar Compositions by Sri DV Mohanakrishna, Shyama Shastri Compositions by Smt. Vijayalakshmi Subramanian, Iraiman Thambi Compositions by Cheppad Sri AE Vamanan Namboodiri, Muthuswamy Dikshitar Compositions by Sri A Sadashivam, Jayachamaraja Wodiyar Compositions by Dr. Nagavalli Nagaraj. FARM & HOME BROADCAST

Farm & Home section of the Directorate General of All India Radio guides, monitors and supervises the programming activities for rural listeners specially designed to cater to the day to day seasonal needs of the farming community in Hindi and different regional languages/dialects from more than 188 Radio stations across the country.

AIR has expanded its Agriculture Broadcasts with the launch of an exclusive project on Mass Media support to Agriculture Extension entitled 'Kisanvani' from Feb. 2004, in collaboration with the Department of Agriculture & Cooperation, Ministry Of Agriculture, to keep local farmers informed about the daily market rates weather reports and day to day information in their respective areas at micro level. Presently Kisanvani is being broadcast and relayed from identified 96 AIR stations across the country.

Workshops

In the fiscal 2011-2012, Directorate General, All India Radio has also conducted six Appraisal and Refresher workshops for its Kisanvani programme producers in collaboration with Department of Agriculture and Cooperation, Ministry of Agriculture. The workshops were successfully conducetd at Guwahati, Chennai, Ahmedabad, Bhubneshwar, Palampur, and Patna to improve upon the programme quality and content.

Environment

In view of its importance, wildlife and forest conservation is treated by AIR as a challenge and emphasis is given on development activities as well as social rituals. All India Radio projects the success of governmental initiatives, which take place in forestry, wildlife conservation and ecological balance. World day to combat desertification is also observed by AIR stations every year to create awareness about land degradation and desertification.

HEALTH & FAMILY WELFARE

Health programmes form regular part of broadcasts of All India Radio. The subjects covered are: Raise in marriage age, delay the first child, space between two children, terminal methods, maternal care, child survival, women empowerment, promotion of inter-spouse communication/male responsibility, neutralizing male preference syndrome, medical terminal of pregnancy, promotion of institutional legal provisions, management of reproductive tract infections (RTIs) and sexually transmitted infections (STIs), Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (Regulation and Prevention of Misuse) Act- 1994, AIDS,drug abuse, breast feeding, child right, child labour, girl child, disability, T.B. leprosy and reproductive child health etc.

PROGRAMMES FOR CHILDREN

AIR broadcast programmes from almost all its stations for children of three categories, viz, programmes for children between the age of 5 and 7 years and 8 and 14 years age, and special programmes for rural children.

Women Programmes

These programmes cover subjects related to socio- economic development of women, health & family welfare. Food and nutrition, scientific home management, women entrepreneurship, education, adult education, women empowerment, gender issues etc. Special programmes focusing on the status and importance of the girl child are broadcast throughout the year to create social awareness to welcome the girl child's birth.

These programmes also aim at creating social awareness about the rights and privileges of

women through the propagation of legal literacy.Different traditional folk forms are used to communicate specially with the rural women audience,

TRANSCRIPTION & PROGRAMME EXCHANGE SERVICE

The Transcription Service started on 3rd April 1954 and entrusted with the main function of preparing transcription of speeches of high dignitaries with special reference to the President and Prime Minister of India. This unit was also performing the duty of processing of vinyl discs labeled "AIR-TS records" for preservation of recordings for future broadcast. The designation of service was changed to "Transcription & Programme Exchange Service" on 1st April 1959 and the office was placed under the independent charge of a "Director". As the processed records eventually proved to be uneconomical, the processing work had to be closed down in June 1967 and new modes of preservation like analogue magnetic tapes etc. came into use. Informal Archiving had been there in the country, but as an organized activity, the job was assigned to this unit later.

This office has the following functional units -

- a. Central Archives
- b. Programme Exchange Unit (Internal & Foreign)
- c. Transcription & President/Prime Minister's speeches
- d. Refurbishing Unit
- e. Commercial Release & Marketing

f. Digital Sound Archives

Releases From Air Archives "Akashvani Snageet" And Marketing

Since April 2003 All India Radio's Central Archive releases music albums under the banner "Akashvani Sangeet". So far we have released 66 albums Two CD'S of Vidushi Sharan Rani were released on 10 Feb 2012.

SOUND ARCHIVES

The Sound Archives of All India Radio can be called as the National Audio Archive of the

Nation as it is the treasure house of precious recording of more than 16500 hours containing music and spoken word recordings in different categories. It is the largest library of Indian Music recordings and it possesses more than 12000 tapes of Hindustani, Carnatic and various folk traditions.

The library preserves a separate collection of Mahatma Gandhi's speeches including the first and the last prayer speeches of Mahatma Gandhi recorded on 11th May 1947 at Sodepur Ashram, Calcutta and 29th January 1948 at Birla House, Delhi respectively. The only broadcast of Mahatma Gandhi from AIR Delhi dated 12 November 1947 is also preserved. Three Thousand analogue tapes of the recordings of Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru are also preserved in AIR Archives.

Voice recordings of other eminent personalities like Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Dr. Radha Krishnan, Rabindranath Tagore, Subhas Chandra Bose, Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, Sardar Patel, Sarojini Naidu etc. have also been preserved. Apart from this, award-winning radio dramas, features, documentaries etc. and memorial lectures are available in the library. The library contains recordings of all the Presidents and Prime Ministers of India.

RADIO AUTOBIOGRAPHY

In the category of Radio Autobiography & eminent personalities, we have more than 252 recordings of eminent personalities from various walks of life. With the input from different AIR stations we identify the people of eminence to be recorded and after getting the approval from the Directorate, these Radio

Autobiography are recorded.

ARCHIVES DIGITAL LIBRARY

A special project was launched to Digitize all Archival recordings in 2001 and the project was completed in 2005. By this Akashvani has become one of the major digital libraries in the broadcasting network with modern tape numbering system in tune with the internationally accepted norms.

Programme transferred into digital medium are approximately 16400 hours. Break up of recordings transferred into the digital format is as follows:-

At present the accessioning of the digital library is completed. In the Second Phase of the digitization, which began in 2008, approximately 500 hours of recordings have been digitized. There are approximately 5000 hours of programme in analogue tapes that are to be transferred to the digitized format in the Second Phase of digitization.

PROGRAMME EXCHANGE LIBRARY

The main purpose of this unit is to exchange good quality programmes among the stations as per their requirements. In PEU library approx. 8000 tapes containing the recordings of music and spoken word programmes are preserved for this purpose.

Besides, containing both music and spoken word items in different Indian languages PEU library is also preserving the Language Lessons in Bangla, English, Gujarati, Kannada, Malayalam, Marathi, Oriya, Sanskrit, Tamil and Telugu. PEU has a separate reference library of Folk and Tribal Music in all principal languages and dialects of our country.

TRANSCRIPTION UNIT

One of the main functions of functions of this service is to transcribe the recording of speeches delivered by President and Prime Minister and preserves them in the form of volumes in chronological order.

It is obligatory on the part of AIR stations to record all the speeches delivered in public functions by the President and Prime Minister. Tapes containing recording of speeches along with transcripts are received by T&PES from various concerned AIR stations. The bound volumes of all transcription are prepared and kept in the archive. All the speeches of President and Prime Minister are preserved in the CD form with detailed data entry.

REFURBISHING UNIT

In order to refurbishing the vintage music recordings in Archives, this was installed some years back with the assistance of United Nations Development Programme, Hundreds of hours of recording of music and recordings of Mahatma Gandhi, Pandit Nehru etc. were refurbished here. At present this unit takes care of the audio quality of the recordings being released by AIR and Doordarshan Archives.

NEW WEBSITES

A website, containing speeches of National Leaders like Mahatma Gandhi, Pandit Jawahar Lal Nehru, Smt. Indira Gandhi & Shri Rajiv Gandhi, was designed so that speeches of these great leaders can be heard by the public all over the world. The website will also contain visual clips of these leaders which are being made available by Doordarshan.

All India Radio is in the process of developing a professional website which will have not only the information of Akashvani Sangeet albums but also about the availability of recordings in All India Radio Archives.

COMMERCIAL WING

The onus for generating revenue for All India Radio lies on its commercial set-up. In spite of the fast changing scenario in the field of Radio Broadcasting during the last few years, Commercial Wing of All India Radio through its Central Sales Unit at Mumbai, 15 main Commercial Broadcasting Service Centers located in different parts of the country, 10 Marketing Divisions at Mumbai, Delhi, Chennai, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Kochi, Thiruvananthapuram, Guwahati & Jalandhar has been able to augment the overall commercial revenue of the organization year- after-year along with maintaining its basic identity as a Public Service Broadcaster.

MARKETING DIVISION

The overall revenue generation of Prasar Bharati has been growing remarkably ever since Marketing Divisions came into being way back in late 90's. To step up in-house marketing and the need for a more strategic way of earning revenue paved the way for opening up of Marketing Divisions by Prasar Bharati in major cities. The first Marketing Division was established in Mumbai and at present Marketing Divisions are also functional at New Delhi, Chennai, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Guwahati, Kochi, Thiruvananthapuram & Jalandhar. The Divisions located in Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai are designated as zonal hubs.

STAFF TRAINING INSTITUTE (PROGRAMME)

The Staff Training Institute (Programmes) of Prasar Bharati situated at Kingsway Camp, Delhi, is responsible for training of in-service personnel working in various stations of All India Radio & Doordarshan. It was declared as a subordinate office of DG, AIR, New Delhi with effect from 01.01.1990. Subsequently other six Training Institutes namely, STI (P).Bhubaneswar & Regional Training Institutes at Ahmedabad, Hyderabad, Lucknow, Shillong & Thiruvananthapuram came into force in different zones covering the entire region of the

country with a module to impart training to the staff of AIR & Doordarshan. The training centers located at different places, are controlled by the STI (P), Delhi for coordination of various training programmes.

All India Radio is the first electronic media in the country where Announcers/Presenters/ Comperes and News Readers have set the style in presentation. Based on this unique expertise, Staff Training Institute (Programme) has specifically designed courses for the performers in broadcast media. VANI Certificate Course is one such course which is helpful in honing the skills of Presenters, etc.

The five day VANI (Voice Articulation and Nurturing Initiative) Certificate Course is conducted by AIR Stations. Candidates for this course are selected after auditions at each station and then trained. Total no. of courses conducted during the period was 77 in which 1277 participants were trained.

Mass Communication (Practical Training)

Internship (Practical training) is imparted to the students of mass media of recognized institutes/universities on payment at Capital/Regional Stations.

Air India

STI (P), Delhi executes Voice Culture Training Programme for Cabin Crew of Air India with a view of developing competence that has become a crucial issue for establishing a smart work force that can achieve a competitive success. A five/four days' comprehensive programme based on myriad aspects of Voice Culture involves both theory and practical exercises helping trainers to hone their skills. An amount of Rs.4, 36,787/-(Four Lakhs Thirty Six thousand & Seven hundred & Eighty Seven) was earned through these courses in the year April 2011-March 2012.

IGNOU

STI (P), Delhi in collaboration with IGNOU, is conducting practical training for the students of IGNOU undertaking PGDAPP (Post Graduate Diploma in Audio Programme Production) and PGDRP (Post Graduate Diploma in Radio Prasaran). These practical trainings are conducted at various identified stations of All India Radio. During the reporting period none of the course was conducted.

Revenue Earned

STI (P), during April 2011 to March 2012 has earned net revenue of Rs. 60, 19, 555/-(Rupees

Sixty Lakhs Nineteen thousand Five hundred & Fifty five only) from various externally paid courses such as VANI, Air India, IGNOU etc.

77 in-house Workshops and training courses were conducted during the year by the training institutes. Some of the important courses conducted were **Basic Legal Knowledge for Programme officers, Leadership Skills, Challenges in Public Service Broadcasting, Kisan Vani, Management Development Programme, Art of Presentation, Digital Convergence, Stock Characters & Radio Programming, Training the Trainers, Voice Culture & Communication etc.** The Administrative courses were also held for the Administrative staff as well as for staff posted in programme and Engineering wing of AIR and Doordarshan and include subjects like, **RTI and Record Management, Disciplinary Procedures and Departmental Inquiries, Financial Management, Advance Computer Applications, Copyright and Intellectual Property Rights, Station Management, Office Management, Handling Court Cases so on and so forth.**

Some of the courses like Hard Disc Based recording System, Digital Audio Production & Editing, Digital Production & Post Production for Radio were also conducted in collaboration with STI (T).

Courses on **Polio Eradication in Collaboration with UNICEF & Conflict Sensitive Reporting in collaboration with AIBD** were also held during period under report

EXTERNAL SERVICES DIVISION

All India Radio entered the realm of external broadcasting shortly after the out break of the Second World War on 1st of October, 1939 – when it started a service in Pushto for listeners across- what was then the country's North-West Frontier. Since then the External Services Division of AIR has been a vital link between India and rest of the World, specially with those countries where the interest of India are intertwined because of Indian population, staying in those countries. Indians, who left their home decades ago in search of better life today live on every part of the globe and are still interested to know what "The Country of their Birth" holds for them. Naturally External Services Broadcast has been projecting the Indian Point of view on matters of National and International importance through its various programmes.

External Services Division of All India Radio ranks high among the External Radio networks of the world both in reach and range covering about 100 countries in 27 languages.

AIR, through its external broadcasts aims to keep the overseas listeners in touch with the ethos of India. The languages in which AIR reaches its foreign audience are English, French, Russian, Swahili, Arabic, Persian, Pushto, Dari, Baluchi, Sinhalese, Nepali, Tibetan, Chinese, Thai, Burmese, and Bhasha Indonesia. The services in Hindi, Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam and Gujarati are directed at overseas Indians, while those in Urdu, Punjabi, Sindhi, Saraiki, Kannada and Bengali are meant for listeners in the Indian Sub-continent.

The broadcasts follow a composite pattern and generally comprise of News Bulletins,

Commentaries, Current Events and Review of the Indian Press. Besides Newsreel, Magazine Programmes on sports and literature, talks and discussions on social economic, political, historical, scientific and cultural subjects, Features on Developmental Activities, important events and institutions, classical folk and modern music of India's diverse regions, form a major part of total programme output.

External Services Division continues to supply recordings of music, spoken word and composite programmes to about 25 foreign broadcasting organizations under the existing Cultural Exchange Programmes.

External Services Division's transmission directed to SAARC countries, West Asia, Gulf and South East Asian countries continue to carry the 9.00 p.m. National bulletin in English originally meant for Home Services. This apart, External Services Division continues to beam all across the globe commentaries on contemporary and relevant issues and press reviews in all its transmissions.

FUTURE POLICY INITIATIVES.

REVAMPING: Revamping of some of the ESD's foreign languages services i.e. Nepali, Tibetan, Baluchi, Dari and Pushto and those towards Gulf countries are under consideration.

DTH SERVICE: 24 hrs. Urdu Service of External Services Division is available on air through DTH w.e.f. 28.06.2006. Plans are being made to have more Services on air through DTH.

MEA's ROLE IN EXTERNAL BROADCAST:

Efforts are on to strengthen the Services to make the impact of the messages more meaningful in different parts of the globe and also to involve the MEA more in the programme areas to indicate priorities and back up for the funding of the External Broadcast.

However, it is worth mentioning that MEA has arranged guest TAs for Baluchi, Dari and Pushto services of E S D.

The first batch came in May 2009 and the 3rd batch of 8 guests T/As have arrived in November 2010. The guest TAs are working in our units as well as are gaining experience from our

services.

With growing prestige of India in the world, an increasingly important role is envisaged for External Broadcast for times to come.

NEWS SERVICES DIVISION

The News Services Division, of All India Radio broadcasts 647 bulletins daily for a total duration of nearly 56 hours in about 90 Languages / Dialects in Home, Regional, External and DTH Services. 312 news headlines on hourly basis are also being mounted on FM mode from 41 AIR Stations. 1371 news based programmes are also broadcast in a month from NSD and its Regional News Units (RNUs). The programmes focus on issues related to common man and development initiatives taken by the Government.

NSD caters to the information needs of people of different regions across the country through its 44 RNUs. These Units mount 177 regional news bulletins daily in 76 regional languages / dialects for over 23 hours duration in home services and 10 news bulletins in 6 languages in external services for over 1 hour duration. Besides above news bulletins, RNUs also broadcast

Headline bulletins on FM Rainbow and other frequencies are also broadcast per month by RNUs.

Comprehensive coverage of assembly elections in Assam, West Bengal, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Puducherry was done regional news bulletins and national news bulletins during 2011 by RNUs at Guwahati, Silchar, Kolkata, Kurseong, Trichy, Chennai, Pudducherry, Kochi and Thiruvanathapuram.

The News Services Division maintains a multilingual news website www.newsonair.nic.in to reach a wide cross-section of the people in the world including the Indian Diaspora living abroad. Besides accessing latest National, State, International, Business and sports News, visitors can listen to audios of 165 news bulletins / news based programmes in 28 regional languages including English and Hindi. The scripts of over 90 news bulletins are also available in 27 languages on the website. The website also provides a huge archive of News and Audio Bulletins / programmes in searchable format which is very useful for the public. RSS feeds are provided for each of the news items on the website. Podcasting facility is also available for visitors who can access audio bulletins on their handsets / computers.

In order to further strengthen the USP of NSD website, 12 more regional bulletins were added to the website from April 2011 to Dcember -2011. The popularity of the website also increased during the aforesaid period as average number of daily hits increased by 34 % from 13,656 in April-2011 to 20,836 in December -2011. The Website Cell has set in motion redevelopment of website with the support of NIC to provide additional features on the website and further enhance the security of the website. Appropriate action was taken on the feed back received from the listeners by giving regular replies to them. Some of the suggestions given by the visitors were taken on board and incorporated in the website.

NSD also provides news to its listeners through News-on-Phone (NOP), SMS and Electronic Display Board. Latest news headlines are made available to listeners on phone from 14 AIR Stations in 10 languages.

SPECIAL PROGRAMMES PREPARED AND BROADCAST BY NEWS SERVICES DIVISION OF ALL INDIA RADIO, NEW DELHI:

1. The News Services Division organizes daily and weekly programmes on news, current issues and other issues relating to common people, which need to be communicated for general awareness. Generally, NSD highlights the policy programmes and achievements of the government. The daily programmes broadcast on such themes are Spotlight/News analysis/Samayaki. The weekly programmes include Money Talk, Public Speak, Charcha Ka Vishay Hai, Vad Samvad, Surkiyon Se Parey, Current Affairs, Human Face, Interview of the Week etc., besides organizing four features daily which are used in various bulletins and news related programmes. Major issues/events which were covered in various news bulletins and news-based programmes of Talks & Current Affairs Unit, Feature Unit of NSD during the year are as follows:

 Flagship programmes of the UPA government including Mahatama Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act, (MGNREGA), Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, Midday Meal Scheme, Empowerment of Women, National Rural Health Mission, (NRHM), Jawaharlal Nehru Urban Renewable Mission, (JNURM), Rajiv Awas Yojna, Right to Information, (RTI), Integrated Child Development Scheme, (ICDS), and Bharat Nirman.

In order to gather the qualitative and quantitative feedback of various programmes broadcast by the various stations, All India Radio has a wide network of 38 Audience Research Units across the country. Based on the feedback, programmes are planned, produced and modified according to the needs, tastes and aspirations of the people. Thus, listener friendly and quality programmes are aired for the wide spectrum of audiences.

Various types of research methodologies are used by the Audience Research Units of All India Radio to gather qualitative and quantitative feedback. Some of the important research methodologies used is as under:-

- i. Listeners' letter analysis
- ii. Programme content analysis
- iii. Focus Group Discussions(FGD)
- iv. Field surveys
 - a) Radio Audience surveys
 - b) Quick feedback studies
 - c) Feed forward studies
 - d) Telephone surveys
 - e) Panel Studies

1. Listener's letter analysis: A large number of letters are received from the listeners for the various programmes. These letters are sorted & analyzed. Accordingly, programmes are planned, designed and modified.

2. Content analysis and FGD: Further in an effort to constantly improve upon the quality of programmes, the contents of the programmes are analyzed with the help of the panel of the experts on the subject. Focus Group Discussion with the panel of experts are also held time to time to check the quality of the programmes.

3. Field surveys:

a) Radio Audience Surveys: Radio Audience Surveys are undertaken on regular intervals

Progressive Use of Hindi

Hindi Unit of DG AIR (Hq) is devoted in following the Official Language Policy of Union of India and Implementation of Official Language Policy and has been continuously trying to implement all orders/directions of Home Ministry, Official Language Department in all AIR Stations/Offices and achieving targets fixed in Annual Programmes. During the year 2011-12 besides regular works related to implementation of Official Language Policy, Hindi Unit performed various tasks to speed up implementation of Official Language Policy:-

Hindi Diwas/Hindi Pakhwara organized in year 2011-12

In year 2011-12 DG AIR (Hq) celebrated Hindi Pakhwara from 14.09.2011 to 29.09.2011. During this period 16 competitions were organized. In organizing competitions during the Pakhwara, special emphasis was given on participation of more and more Non-Hindi speaking Officials/Personnel in these competitions. In view of this, separate competition were organized for Non-Hindi Speaking Officials/Personnel in large numbers participated in these competitions. 80 winning Officials/personnel were honored with prizes and certificates. An expenditure of Rs. 95,500/- was incurred on these prizes.

ADMINISTRATION

1. Reservation for SCs/STs/OBCs

PrasarBharati has taken all requisite measures for implementation of reservation in respect of SCs/STs/OBCs categories. All relevant policy directions and instructions issued by Nodal Ministries/Departments for giving reservation and other benefits to SCs/STs/OBCs in Government Services and personnel matters were circulated to all the offices and field units of AIR for necessary compliance. Liaison Officers for SCs/STs to oversee implementation of statutory instructions for safeguarding the interest of the concerned staff, in pursuance of O.M. No.36038/1/2008-Estt.(Res.) dated 19.11.2008 Special Recruitment Drives as on 01.07.2004 and subsequently as on 01.11.2008, in pursuance of Ministry of I&B's letter No.A-14011/01/2009-Admn-1 dated 14.01.2009, were initiated. All the capital stations have been instructed to nominate Liaison Officer for SC/ST and fill up the backlog vacancies for SC/ST. Most of the Capital Stations have nominated Liaison Officer.

2. Public Grievance And Redressal Mechanism

Grievance redressal and access mechanism has been set up at the Station Level, Zonal Headquarters level & the Central Headquarter level in accordance with the guidelines of Department of Administrative Reforms&Public Grievances. Information and Facilitation Counter setup at all offices of AIR. Regular status reports on disposal of grievances are being submitted to the Ministry of I&B. In the year of 2011-12, i.e. total grievances received were303, out of which 302 were disposed of & remaining 1 is under process. Dy. Director General (A) is nominated as the Staff Grievance Redressal Officer of this Directorate.

3. Implementation on Right to Information Act 2005

All AIR Stations have broadcast a number of programmes in different formats to inform the people regarding various provisions of the Right To Information Act,2005 in order to empower people and contribute to transparency and accountability in governance. Programme Heads of all AIR Stations have been asked to highlight the salient features of this Act in the

programme. This Act has also been covered under Flagship Programme since September, 2008. AIR will continue with the publicity of this Act in future also.

In AIR 60 CPIOs and 6 Appellate Authorities in Directorate and 295 CPIOs and 20 Appellate Authorities at field level have been designated for implementation of RTI Act. In the year 2011-12 (from 01.04.2011 to 31.03.2012), 658 RTI applications were received and were replied within the stipulated time. 292 appeals were received by the Appellate Authority during the period (from 01.04.2011 to 31.03.2012) and all were disposed of.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT:-

AIR has a vast network consisting of 320 stations/offices spread all over the country. There are about 17853 personnel working in three streams viz. Progaramme, Engineering &Admn. in AIR. In All India Radio, the percentage of the women in group 'A' & 'B' & 'C' is above 24.6%. The Chairman of PrasarBharati is a lady. There is a female officer working as Director (A) in Admn. Wing in DG, AIR besides many lady officers in SAG, JAG, STS, JTS, levels of Programme and Engineering. All AIR Stations/Offices have been instructed to set up Women Cell to look in-to the grievances/ complaints of sexual harassment vide this Dte.'s Circular No. 1/29/2008-WC/WL dated 23.09.2008. The Women Cell has been set up at all AIR Stations/Offices accordingly.

Reservation for Persons with Disabilities

1. The Constitution of India ensures equality, freedom, justice and dignity of all individuals and implicitly mandates an inclusive society for all including the persons with disabilities. The Government of India enacted "The Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995", in the effort to ensure equal opportunities for persons with disabilities and their full participation in nation building.

2. PrasarBharati has taken all requisite measures for implementation of reservation for PWD. All relevant policy directions and instructions issued by DOP&T from time to time are being followed.

ENGINEERING

A. Growth of Network & Coverage

All India Radio is one of the largest broadcasting networks in the world. At the time of independence there were six Radio Stations and 18 Transmitters (6 MW & 12 SW) which covered 11% population and 2.5% area of the country.

By 31st March, 2012 AIR network has grown to 277 stations and 433 transmitters (148 MW, 48 SW & 237 FM) which provide coverage to 99% of the population spread over 91% area of the country. Graphics showing growth of AIR Stations and Transmitters over the five year Plans are enclosed.

B. Highlights of the Activities during the year:

1. Since last year, the number of stations has increased from 241 to 277 and number of transmitters from 385 to 433.

2. Special Package for J&K

(i) **Phase-I** of Special Package for expansion & Improvement of AIR services in J&K has been implemented. There are now 16 AIR Stations and 25 transmitters (MW 14, FM 8, SW 3) in J&K. 99.52% of State's population is now covered by Radio Signals.

(ii) **Phase-II** – The scheme was approved to provide additional diesel generators and UPS for the existing Stations of AIR to further strengthen the Captive Power supply. This will help in ensuring continuity of broadcast service during power supply failure and also during emergency or natural calamity.

(iii) **Phase-III** – Government's approval for Phase-III of the special package amounting to Rs.100 crores was received on 18th August, 2010. Administrative approval for procurement of equipment & departmental activities also issued.

The scheme includes setting up of four FM & five TV High Power Transmitters. In addition to this, 4 numbers of Low Power 100 Watt FM Transmitters have also been included in uncovered regions. Sites have been identified and acquisition is in progress. Tender action is under process for procurement of transmitters.

3. Phase – II of North-East Special Package:

Special Package for expansion & improvement of AIR services in North East and Island Territories is under implementation. The Package includes:

(i) Acquisition of sites:

New sites were required for setting up the 19 new FM stations. There has been delay in offer of sites and demand notes by the State Governments.

Before April, 2010, sites had been taken over at 15 places at Bomdila,

Changing, Khonsa & Daporijo in Arunachal, Golpara, Karimganj & Lumding in Assam; Cherapunjee in Meghalaya; Champhal, Kolasib & Tuipang in Mizoram; Phek & Wokha in Nagaland, Nutan Bazar & Udaipur in Tripura.

- During the current year, site at Zunehboto (Nagaland) has also been finalized and payment made. This site is expected to be taken over shortly.
- As on date, three sites at Anini (Arunachal Pradesh), Tamenglong (Manipur) and Ukhrul (Manipur) are still pending to be acquired for want of allotment of sites by the concerned State Govts.
- At Tamenglong, alternate Site has been offered. Survey team will visit the site after improvement in law & order situation. At Ukhrul, side will be transferred after the existing office of district SP shifts to the new building which is not yet ready. Site at Anini is yet to be offered by the State Govt. Matter is being pursued.

(ii) Civil Works:-

- a. Security fencing
 - Construction of fencing completed at 12 places i.e. at Lumding, Tuipang, Udaipur, Nutan Bazar, Daporijo, Kolasib, Bomdila, Khonsa, Champhal, Goalpara, and Cherapunji & Wokha.
 - Work in progress at 2 places at Phek & Changlang. Work awarded for Karimganj.
- b. Transmitter building
 - Technical area of Transmitter building is ready at 8 places at Tuipang, Nutan Bazar, Udaipur, Goalpara, Daporjio, Lumding, Champai & Kolasib and departmental works have been taken up. Transmitters installed at 6 places with interim antenna. Tower work awarded. Installation in progress at two places.
 - Building Work at 7 places is in progress at Khonsa, Cherapunjee, Wokha, Phek, Karimganj, Bomdila and Changlang.

(2) Silchar – 5 kw FM Txr. & Gangtok – 10 kW FM Txr.

- Civil Works for the FM transmitter at Silchar and Gangtok are complete and departmental works are in process.
- For Silchar 5 kW FM transmitter received in Delhi & being dispatched to site and for Gangtok 10 kW FM transmitter installed and measurement in progress.

(3) 100 W FM relay transmitters at 100 places – Installed at 89 places. Work is in progress at 3 places. Work at 8 places will start after getting clearance from the State Govt. (2 in Arunachal) and improvement in law & order situation (4 in Manipur & 2 in Tripura).

(4) Chinsurah – 1000 kW MW Txr. (Replacement of existing 1000 kW MW Txr.) – Transmitter received and under installation.

(5) Kavaratti – 10 kW MW Txr. (Replacement of 1 kW MW Txr.) – Transmitter received and under installation.

(6) Digital Satellite New Gathering Systems (3 Nos) – Purchase order placed on 12.711.Delivery is expected by December 2011.

(7) In order to strengthen the Zonal Office at Guwahati, a proposal to provide Permanent Office accommodation & Staff Quarters for NE Zone at Guwahati has been approved.

(8) Permanent Studio facilities equipped with Digital equipment and computerized Hard Disc Work Stations for recording, dubbing; editing & playback are being provided at Jaipur (Raj) & Tawang (Arunachal Pradesh). Order placed for procurement of 16 Nos. of digital Transmission consoles & 17 Nos. of digital Recording consoles procured.

C. New Initiatives:

1. Digitalization of AIR network is one of the Major Thrust Areas of draft 11th Plan. Government has approved the scheme of AIR Digitalization of Transmitters, Studios Connectivity in AIR Network at a cost of Rs.898.32 crores. This includes the following:

- Digitalization of 98 studios & connectivity.
- Replacement of 31 old MW Transmitters by new DRM MW Transmitter at Existing Stations.
- Upgradation of MW DRM Txr. with Captive Power Plant at Arunachal-China Border at 3 places.
- Replacement of 10 kW MW Mobile by MW DRM Txr. at 6 places.
- Conversion of 36 compatible MW Txr. to DRM Mode.
- New 1 kW/5 kW FM digital compatible Txr. at 24 places.
- 100 Watt FM Dgigital Compatible Txr. at 100 locations for extending FM coverage in uncovered rural and semi urban areas (at existing AIR/LPT sites of DD) and connectivity.
- Replacement of old FM Txr. at rmote & border areas at 34 locations with the same power & 6 nos. of 1 kW MW Txr. by 10 kW FM Txr.
- Replacement of 5 SW Txr. by DRM SW Txr.
- Augmentation of Archival facility at Delhi & creation of Archival facility at Chennai, Mumbai, Kolkata & Hyderabad.
- Augmentation of 44 existing New Units and Creation of 7 New Regional News Units.
- Opening of New-on-Phone service from 16 places & augmentation of existing News-on Phone services at 13 places.
- Digital Studio Txr. links.
- 3 New Captive Earth Stations at Tiruchirapalli, Madurai & Dharwad.
- 2. Augmentation of Staff Training Institute (Technical) and Staff Training Institute

(Programme) including regional training institutes – SFC proposal was approved by the Ministry at a cost of Rs.20 crores on 31.08.2010. The schemes include augmentation of facilities at STI(Tech) Delhi & RSTI(Tech) Mumbai, Construction of Hostel Accommodation at STI(P) Tiruvananthapuram, Hyderabad, Lucknow & Ahmedabad. Civil requirements are being finalised in coordination with CCW. Equipment specifications finalised.

3. Office Accommodation/Staff Quarters at Guwahati and Hostel Accommodation at Srinagar – SFC proposal approved by Ministry at a cost of 20 crores. The estimate for staff quarters at Guwahati & Hostel at Srinagar has been sanctioned & work awarded. The estimate for office accommodation at Guwahati sanctioned and work awarded.

D. Activities of 'AIR Resources':

Prasar Bharti had started 'AIR Resources' as an independent center to generate revenue by providing consultancy and turkey solutions in the field of broadcasting and utilizing the vast resources of All India Radio & Doordarshan hardware, human resource and technical expertise.

It has provided consultancy & turkey solutions to IGNOU for establishment FM Transmitters for their Gyan-vani stations at 37 places in the country. It has also leased out land, building and tower to IGNOU stations. Prasar Bharati has also undertaken the operation and maintenance of these FM Transmitters.

- Infrastructure like land, building and tower is being shared with private FM broadcasting on rental basis. Presently under the Phase-I scheme of private FM broadcasting of the Ministry of I&B, 09 private FM Channels in three cities are operational. Under the Phase-II scheme, 219 FM Channels are operational in 86 cities. The cellular mobile operators are also sharing Prasar Bharati infrastructure for their services.
- Prasar Bharati is also earning revenue by providing on site and institutional training in various disciplines of broadcasting.
- 'AIR Resources' has generated gross revenue of Rs. 57.40crore during the period April, 2011 to March, 2012.

E. Activities of IT Division:

- Webcasting services of All India Radio: AIR is broadcasting through its terrestrial radio transmitter network. These programmes will be made available by AIR throughout the world on internet using Webcasting. The 11th Plan approved scheme for Provision of Webcasting services of AIR is under implementation. Initially, one channel has been planned for live streaming as a pilot project.
- 2. Online Court Cases Monitoring System: The development of an online system for monitoring the court cases in Prasar Bharati has been taken up. The basic

version of the system has already been developed. The system will enable online updation of the status of court cases by various stakeholders and generating various reports for both AIR and Doordarshan.

3. Development of new AIRNET : The existing online system for sharing of information between various offices of AIR has become old and lack support for new technology. The development of a new AIRNET online system has been taken up meet the new requirements.

Staff Training Institute(Technical)

Staff Training Institute (Tech.) at Delhi is the apex training centre to cater to the training needs of all the engineering personnel of All India Radio and Doordarshan. Regional training institutes have also been set up at Bhubaneswar &Shillong to augment the training facilities.

The Institute at Delhi was established in 1948 and has since grown into a centre of excellence for technical training in electronic media. A well-organized library and a computer centre with advanced multi-media equipment are available as part of the institute.

The institute conducts training courses for departmental candidates as well as for candidates of similar foreign organizations. Workshops at different field offices are also held. The institute conducts departmental competitive examinations for promotions in the subordinate engineering cadres.

Regional Staff Training Institute(T),Bhubaneshwar conducts training courses mainly for East Zone & South Zone. The institute conducts training on various topics like Audio video measurements, Audio/Video editing, Radio/TV Transmitters, stress management, computer networking, computer awareness, TV studio, Equipment & lighting, refreshers course, OB, Earth Station, DSNG etc.

Regional Staff Training Institute (T), Shillong conducts training courses mainly for North-East Zone. The institute organizes training on Radio/TV transmitters, TV Studio, Hard-disc based recording, system & virtual studio, IT awareness, computer network, Digital Earth Station/DSNG/DTH, refresher course etc.

a. Details of training courses conducted and no. of persons trained

- b. Outside courses conducted by STI(T) faculties at various centres/Kendras are 27.
- c. International participation:

Four participants from Bhutan Broadcasting Corporation attended the "Refresher Course for Tech." for the period from 09-20 May 2011 on payment basis.

- d. Summer training of four/six weeks durationwas conducted by STI(T), Delhi for 246students of Degree/Diploma in Engineering.
- 2. Revenue generated by STI (T) Delhi.
 - Revenue to the tune of Rs. 7, 70,998/- was generated by conducting training courses for 246 students of degree and diploma in Engineering during May-June 2011.
 - A course was conducted on FM Radio Transmitter for 10 candidates of UP Polytechnic from12-16 February 2012 and revenue of Rs. 1, 37,500/- was generated.

3. Hostel Facilities at STI

Hostel at STI, Delhi has five blocks with furnished 124 rooms. 20 rooms are with double-bed with attached bath and air-conditioned (deluxe rooms) and 60 rooms are with single-bed with attached bath and air-conditioned (semi-deluxe rooms). Rest 44 rooms are single non-attached (with common bathroom). It has an air-conditioned dining hall with a capacity of 64 members. Kitchen with all modern cooking facilities provides full day meals at a very reasonable rate.

STI(T) hostel generated revenue of Rs. 21,62,770/- during the year.

4. Staff Welfare activity:

- i. Cable TV connections & refrigerators were provided to the deluxe rooms of hostel.
- ii. A book-library of containing 40 Technical books was started in hostel. These books are utilized by the trainees during their stay at Hostel.

Annual Report related to Research & Development for the year 2011-12

Research Department of All India Radio & Doordarshan is a premier national R&D organisation involved in research and development activities in field of Sound and TV Broadcasting. Following are the main achievements of this office for the current year.

 - The AM Telemetry system had already been tested for its normal operation on PSTN and GPRS/GSM link at AIR Kota. During the period the application software has been modified to incorporate the changes/suggestions like fire alarm etc. made by CE (NZ) and DG: AIR.
 - The conversion of application software (GUI) from Linux OS to MS Windows OS using Visual basic code.
 - Modification, fabrication and testing of Modulation Card carried out in the lab.
 - The lab testing of modified software completed.

Procurement of hardware for Advance Telemetry System is under process.

(ii) FM Telemetry Group

After development and commissioning of GSM based FM Telemetry System in the last week of March 2011 at AIR Kurseong, further modifications in the FM Telemetry system have been made using the TCP/IP protocol so that it can be used at any place having LAN connectivity. Net connect serial to Ethernet server devices were procured and configured and few experiments have been carried out in the lab for implementing the serial to Ethernet connectivity between Transmitter Controller and PC.

Application software (GUI) for TCP/IP connectivity in visual basic has been developed and tested with the local area network. Further experiments carried out with the Internet. Study is also going on to implement the system with R&S make FM Transmitters. The necessary modification in hardware and software carried out. Further debugging & modifications in the application software also completed.

(iii) Telemetry Group for Unmanned VLPTs :

Research Department has developed a GSM/SMS Based Remote Monitoring and Control System for Unmanned VLPTs. Two such units have been installed in DMC Nasik and two associated VLPTs Junnar and Karjat. The system is working satisfactorily. Resetting of Automatic Switching Unit and power supply facility has been introduced through SMS. Further modifications in application Software and Hardware completed as per requirements of DMCs.

(iv) Remote Monitoring and Control system for 100 watt FM transmitters:

The developmental work on 'GSM/SMS based Remote Monitoring and Control system for 100 watt FM transmitters, completed. Testing of system also completed. Further modifications carried out.

(B) Antenna lab

- Work carried out for better return loss and tested 10 KW High Power FM antennas using symmetrical splitter.
- Study and related specifications and standards defined to develop a setup for performance measurement of state of the art cost effective cross field antenna for medium wave transmitters.
- Antennas fabricated for DRM reception for fixed place as well as mobile vehicle.
- The design & development of 20 KW to 40 KW high power FM antenna using RF Coaxial splitter (Rigid line) for 4 bay & 6 bay cross V antenna is under progress.

(C) Propagation Lab

During the period from April,11 to March 2012 the lab has carried out following propagation related studies.

- Regular monitoring of DRM transmission in Full DRM/Simulcast / Multicast mode.
- Active participation in DRM⁺ showcase cum workshop by DRM consortium at Akashwani Bhawan & assisted as well in reception survey of DRM⁺ Transmission by providing mobile van & other survey equipment.
- Reception survey of AIR MW Transmitters (Delhi A, Delhi B) at Nangli, for satisfactory reception of signal within 1 km radial distance as desired by the AIR Directorate.
- Reception survey of AIR MW Transmitters (Delhi C, Delhi D & National Channel) at Mall Road, for satisfactory reception of signal within 1 km radial distance as desired by the

AIR Directorate. Later on the survey extended upto 5 km, 10 km, 15 km, 20 km & 25 km for further study.

Further study on DRM Transmission is going on.

(D) Acoustic Group

Research Department of All India Radio and Doordarshan has vast R&D experience in the field of acoustic engineering. The acoustic laboratory continuously engaged in carrying out various acoustic measurements of AIR & DDK stations, testing and evaluation (NRC, STC, FIIC etc) of acoustic materials including evaluation of electro-acoustic transducers viz. microphones and speakers in accordance with existing national and international standards. Further up-gradation of Acoustic measurement infrastructure is in process under plan project.

Earning / Receipt

During the year 2011-12, an amount of Rs 287780/- is received from various firms against testing charges of acoustic material/transducers till 31 March 2012.

Departmental Acoustical Measurement of AIR Stations

Acoustic measurements at AIR Jaipur and DDK Chandigarh were carried out and Report submitted to the authorities at Zonal office, Station/Kendra and DGAIR.

(E) International Monitoring & Receiving Station, Todapur, New Delhi

International Monitoring & Receiving centre situated at Todapur, Inderpuri, New Delhi, is responsible for carrying out broadcast signal monitoring of MW, SW and DTH signal carrying internal and external services of AIR. The activities carried out during the period 2011-2012 are detailed below:-

1. Frequency Checking of MF & HF Transmitters of AIR

- (a) Carried out monitoring of all SW & MF transmitters, viz. Kingsway, Khampur, Aligarh, Bangalore, Gorakhpur, Chennai, Panaji, Mumbai, Chinsura, Rajkot, Jalandhar, Tuticorin, Guwahati which carry external, internal and Vividh Bharti services of All India Radio with the following objectives:-
 - (i) Performance of the transmitters i.e. breakdown, modulation, distortion, cross talk, excessive frequency deviation and
 - (ii) Checking the correct scheduling of programme and their technical quality.
- (b) Carried out monitoring of regional shortwave transmitters located at Lucknow, Bhopal, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Shimla, Srinagar, Leh, Jammu and Mumbai.

2. Clear Channel watches and Indentification of Interference of Shortwave Channles

of AIR

Clear channel watches and identification of interfering stations of All India Radio channels carrying internal, external, Vividh Bharti services were carried out regularly. The observations from these watches were used for taking remedial action. Special monitoring of various channels was carried out for arriving at a decision before finalizing each seasonal aerial/frequency schedule for programme finalization on Republic Day, Sports, National events, VVIP broadcasts and other important events. During 2011-2012 special watches and VVIP transmission monitoring were carried out as per details below:-

3. Monitoring of RN Channels/FM Channels

- a) Monitored all seven RN channels of INSAT-3C originating from Broadcasting House, New Delhi. These channels were monitored round the clock on hourly basis daily.
- b) Monitored all the regional RN channels (7 stations) thrice daily for overall performance.
- c) Monitoring of both the FM channels of Delhi station is being done on hourly basis daily.

4. D.T.H. Radio Monitoring

Regular monitoring of 21 Nos of D.T.H. Radio channels were carried out on hourly basis daily. The abnormalities observed were communicated to concerned stations and National Channel immediately for taking necessary action and the report emailed.

5. Monitoring of the Transmissions of Foreign Organisations

Technical monitoring of the transmissions of countries beamed towards India was carried out regularly on a reciprocal basis. Periodic reports were prepared and sent to respective broadcasting organizations by email.

CHANNELS AND PROGRAMMES

The phenomenal growth achieved by All India Radio through eight decades has made it one of the largest media organisations in the world. Now in the new millenium, it has about 277 stations and 433 transmitters. To serve the communication needs of the plural society that India is, the network expanded gradually imbibing new technologies and programme production techniques. All India Radio's services are being digitalized.

OBJECTIVES

To provide information, education and entertainment, for promoting the welfare and happiness of the masses (Bahujana Hitaya Bahujana Sukhaya), All India Radio strives to :-

- a) Uphold the unity of the country and the democratic values enshrined in the constitution.
- b) Present a fair and balanced flow of information of national, regional, local and international interest, including contrasting views, without advocating any opinion or ideology of its own.
- c) Promote the interest and concerns of the entire nation, being mindful of the need for harmony and understanding within the country and ensuring that the programmes reflect the varied elements which make the composite culture of India.
- d) Produce and transmit varied programmes designed to awaken, inform, enlighten, educate, entertain and enrich all sections of the people.
- e) Produce and transmit programmes relating to developmental activities in all their facets including extension work in agriculture, education, health and family welfare and science & technology.
- f) Serve the rural, illiterate and under-privileged population, keeping in the mind the special needs and interest of the young, social and cultural minorities, the tribal population and those residing in border regions, backward or remote areas.
- g) Promote social justice and combat exploitation, inequality and such evils as untouchability and narrow parochial loyalties.
- h) Serve the rural population, minority communities, women, children, illiterate as well as other weaker and vulnerable sections of the society.
- i) Promote national integration.

THREE TIER BROADCASTING

To realise its objectives AIR has evolved over the years, a three-tier system of broadcasting namely national, regional and local. It caters to the information, education and entertainment needs of the audience through its stations in this country of continental dimension and with a plural society. They provide news, music, spoken word and other programmes to almost the

entire population of the country, Its vast reach especially in the rural and tribal areas make it the primary and sometimes the only source of information and entertainment.

National channels broadcast national programmes which are heard on the Medium Wave in most part of the country. Recently it has started airing on Short Wave also. The regional and Sub-regional stations provide the second tier of broadcasting giving programmes in the regional languages and promoting regional cultural facets. In addition FM Channels at Metros cater to the modern needs of the people primarily the youth. The Vividh Bharati has also been shifted to FM broadcasting system at 37 places. There are 86 Local Radio stations on FM mode set up to cater to the needs and tastes of audience of small towns in various parts of the country. Community radio centers were set up at 5 places in the North Eastern India to serve the local tribal population.

REGIONAL CHANNELS

Regional Channels of AIR are located mostly in the state capitals and in the major linguisticcultural regions of every state. Altogether 116 such channels are spread over 29 states & 6 UTs states and Union teritorries of the country. The public service broadcasting arm of AIR, the Regional Channels put out infotainment programmes with the objective of enriching the lives of their listeners. The Reional Channels, broadcast largely on the Medium Wave frequency, follow a composite programming mix. They also promote art and culture with a major emphasis on Indian classical music. Around 40 percent of total broadcast on primary channels comprises music, which includes Classical music, light, folk, film and music of various other languages. News and Current Affairs programmes constitute 20 to 30 percent of the broadcast time. Radio plays and drama, health & family welfare programmes, programmes for women and children, farm and home programmes aimed at empowering rural masses are the other important segments of Primary Channels. These Channels being the most accessible of all the AIR channels, strive to reach their audience in the language most understood by all.

LOCAL RADIO STATION (LRS)

Local Radio is comparatively a new concept of broadcasting in India. Each of the station serving a small area provides utility services and reaches right into the heart of the community, which uses the microphone to reflect and enrich its life. What distinguishes Local Radio from the regional network is its down to earth, intimate and uninhibited approach. The programmes

of the local radio are area specific. They are flexible and spontaneous enough to enable the station to function as the mouthpiece of the local community.

FM RAINBOW

FM Rainbow channel of All India Radio was launched at a time when radio listening was declining especially in big cities. People representing higher economic strata of the society thought it out of fashion to listen to radio programmes which, according to them, were addressing to the needs of average middle/low income radio listeners. Tehcnological improvements made in the field of sound recording tempted young music lovers to opt for other modes of music players because reception quality of these songs on AM mode was not as lively as it was in stereophonic cinema halls or on digital electronic equipments. FM radio filled this gap effectively by ensuring disturbance free high quality music to its listeners. Even the presentation style of the compere on FM channel was transformed to suit the changing needs of listeners. Inter personal chatting style of the comperes caught the pulse of youth and allured them to come closer to their radio. In it's round the clock b'cast, radio listeners were served with a recipe of whole new gamut of entertainment. Soon FM radio acquired the status of modern radio because it was speaking in their style and providing them listening pleasure. The old glory of radio was restored once again at least in terms of listening percentages.

At present AIR have 237 FM transmitters across the country, by which it covers 29.18% of the area and 41.43% of the population of the country. Out of these, FM Rainbow channel is available at 21 places i.e. at Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Kolkata, Bangalore, Lucknow, Panaji, Jalandhar, Cuttack, Kodaikanal, Tiruchirapalli, Coimbatore, Vishakhapatnam, and Vijayawada. Besides this Delhi Rainbow is also relayed fully from Mussorie, Kanpur, Aligarh, Kasauli, Kurseong, and Shillong and partly from Hyderabad, Panaji, Dharamshala, and Bhatinda. The FM channel airs Pop music, Film songs, and Classical & Devotional music, New Headlines etc. The advantages of FM channel over Medium Wave channel and Short Wave are:-

- * High Quality sound.
- * Stereo transmission.
- * Greater freedom from interface and noise.
- * Uniform day and night coverage.
- * Capacity to provide value added service.

FM GOLD

FM Gold channel was on air on 1st September-2001 at Delhi as a niche infotainment channel with 30% of News and Current affairs component and 70% of entertainment programming. The duration of FM Gold channel is at present 18hrs daily as against the round the clock b'cast of FM Rainbow. At present FM Gold channel is available in four Metro's i.e. Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai. This additional channel gave its listener an option to choose between the two besides listening to other parallel running AIR and Private FM stations in the area. This channel is trying to provide information interlinked with entertainment and being information update on Traffic, Airlines, Railways, Weather report etc.

DTH SERVICE

DTH Radio Channel is a Satellite Service meant for listeners who own a T.V.set. DTH Service is available through the DTH platform of Prasar Bharati with uplinking facilities at Todapur, Delhi. It is not a terrestrial broadcast service and DTH programme cannot be tuned in the ordinary radio receiver sets. DTH will cover the entire country as well as neighboring countries. DTH is a 24 hour service broadcast digitally. The programming is planned in such a way that the repetitions are kept at minimum.

DTH Service provides different language channels available in every nook and corner of the country. The most significant aspect of DTH broadcast is its digital quality. The following channels are available on DTH.

- 1. Hindi : AIR Delhi is the originating station, Programmes from other Hindi stations having linkage facilities, with Delhi i.e. AIR Lucknow, AIR Jaipur, AIR Bhopal, AIR Shimla and AIR Patna find a place in Hindi DTH Channel.
- 2. Gujarati : AIR Ahmedabad is the originating station. Gujarati programmes from Vadodra, Rajkot, Bhuj and Surat are accommodated in Gujarati DTH channel.
- **3. Marathi :** AIR Mumbai is the originating station. Programmes from Nagpur and Pune form the part of Marathi DTH channel, besides F.M Rainbow and F.M Gold.
- **4. Bengali** : AIR Kolkata is the originating station. Programmes from Kolkata 'A', F.M Kolkata and Siliguri are the contents of Bangla DTH channel.
- 5. Telugu : Uplink station is AIR Hyderabad. Besides Hyderabad main station programmes, CBS Hyderabad, Vijayawada, Cuddapah, Visakha-pattanam are other programme contributing stations
- Tamil: Uplink station is AIR Chennai. Programmes from Chennai F.M Trichy, Pondicherry, Madurai, CBS Chennai, FM Rainbow Chennai are included in Tamil DTH Channel.
- 7. Kannada : AIR Bangalore is the anchor station. Programmes from CBS Bangalore, F.M Rainbow, Dharwad, Mysore, and Mangalore are included in Kannada DTH channel.

National Channel

National Channel of All India Radio works as a night service from 6.50 p.m. to 6.10 a.m. the next morning. Services of National Channel Started on 18th May, 1988.

Having the entire area of India as its zone, the programme composition of the Channel has been designed to make it representative of the varied cultural mosaic and ethos of the Nation as a whole.

National Channel serves in three languages - Hindi, Urdu and English with vast variety of programme on Science, Health, Sports, Literature, Humour, Current Social Issues, and Cultural Heritage so as to enrich *the vast knowledge of its listeners. Education, Culture and Social Economic Development are the focal points of VIVIDHA* programme broadcast in Hindi and English on alternative days. Similarly an Urdu programme Manzar is broadcast daily. Magazine programme on economics, science, sports, music and literature are broadcast on regular basis. Career guidance, Current Affairs and Social issues are taken up in the weekly programme FOCUS. In other weekly programmes personalities from different fields are featured in the programme of Senior Citizens and Mulaquat. Issues related to various aspects of life and health are taken up in an interactive radio counselling programme Hello Zindagi. The programme Hanste Hansaate is broadcast twice week.Classical music (Hindustani & Carnatic) and regional music are broadcast daily in fixed chunks.

In order to involve listeners and ensure their active participation in the programme activities, programmes of their messages / requests are broadcast six days a week including the programme Jai Jawan for soldiers.

Hourly news-bulletins, alternatively in Hindi and English are broadcast only from the National Channel throughout the night. Whenever the Parliament is in session, National Channel broadcasts recording of the "Question Hour" for the benefit of the listeners.

During the Holy Month of 'RAMZAAN' a special 50 Minutes. programme "Sahargaahi" is broadcast daily (4.10 a.m to 5.00 a.m.) in which emphasis is given to human values and Indo-Islamic culture.

National Channel has imparted training to IGNOU students for Diploma in Radio Programmes.

The programme of National Channel is available on its MW transmitters at Nagpur (1916 M - 1566 KHz) and Delhi (246.9 M - 1215 KHz) with shortwave support in 31 Meter Band (9425 KHz and 9470 KHz).

DOORDARSHAN

Television broadcasting started in India in September, 1959 on an experimental basis at Delhi. Regular TV service was later started in 1965. Doordarshan came in to existence in April, 1976 when TV got delinked from AIR and a separate Directorate of Doordarshan was formed. Colour TV and National networking through satellite were introduced in 1982. Over the years, Doordarshan has not only expanded its network throughout length and breadth of the country but also kept pace with new technological developments in the field of broadcasting. Doordarshan is presently operating 35 satellite channels. It is also providing free-to-air DTH Service (Ku-band) in the country. For A & N islands, which do not receive Ku band signals, DTH service in C-band with a bouquet of 10 channels is in operation. Doordarshan became a part of Prasar Bharati which came in to existence in November, 1997. Today, Doordarshan is counted among the leading broadcasting organizations of the world. Growth of Doordarshan since its inception is given at Annexurel.

For terrestrial coverage 1415 transmitters of varying power are in operation. 1242 DD 1 transmitters (108 transmitters relay Regional programmes during entire duration of transmission; 169 DD News transmitters; and 4 Digital transmitters). See Annexure III for Statewise distributions of transmitters. In terrestrial mode, DD 1 Channel covers about 92% population and 81% area of the country. Terrestrial coverage of DD News Channel is estimated to be about 49% population and 26% of the area.

For Programme production, there are 66 studio centres in the country. These include 17 major Studio centres at state capitals, a Central Production Centre at Delhi, a Regional Production Centre at Guwahati and 47 other Studio centres located at various places in the country. Statewise no. of Studio centres is given at Annexure-II. Out of 66 Studio Centres, 22 are fully digital & 31 are partially digital. The remaining 13 studio centres are analogue. With the completion of the ongoing projects, all studio centres will become fully digital with the exception of 4 Studio centres. The remaining four Studio centres are planned to be digitalized during 12th Plan.

Doordarshan Network

DD: National

DD: National channel is the largest terrestrial network in the world covering about 92% population and 81% land area of the country. DD: National is the no. 1 channel in the country in terms of absolute viewership. The channel lends a healthy mix of entertainment, information and education. The service is available in terrestrial mode from 05.30 a.m. till midnight. In the satellite mode it is available round the clock. The telecast time of different programmes of this composite public service channel is so devised that it caters to the needs of different viewers at different timings.

In the year 2011-12 all major National Events of the year like Republic Day Parade, Independence Day celebrations, Presidents and Prime Minister's address to the joint session of parliament, important parliament debates, Presentation of Railway and General Budget. Question Hour in Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha, etc. were covered live. Along with coverages, massive campaigns were provided to various Govt. Departments, developmental programmes, socially relevant special programmes e.g. Pulse Polio Campaign, Anti cancer, leprosy, Tuberculosis, dengue, Swine Flu and other health related issues, special campaign for primary education for all, AIDS, consumer education, Road Safety and free legal aid to weaker section of the society were the major planks of the telecast.

Some of the popular evening serials telecast on DD: National were Bunty Bubbly Ki Mummy, Mere Desh Ki Beti, Hum, Ek Aangan Ke Ho Gaye Do, Muawazaa Madad Ya Abhishaap, Shama, Mangalsutra-Ek Maryada, Kaisi Yeh Zindagani, Aashiyana, Sankatmochan Hanumaan, Yahan Ke Hum Sikandar, Kanaphusi, Magar Ke Nagar, Janani, Noorie, Hum Aise Kyoun Hai etc. Besides, Gramin Bharat, Panchayati Raaj and Paryavaran Darshan were also telecast.

As a run up to Commonwealth Games Delhi 2010 a series of sports programmes were telecast in prime-time slots on DD-National from March 2010 to September 2011. ICC Cricket World Cup 2011 series, 34th National Games, Wimbledon & Roland Garros Tennis (French Open) were also covered on Doordarshan.

In order to revitalize the channel the Self Finance Commissioning was introduced in the year 2005. This scheme was meant for the mid-prime-time slots and prime-time slots in the National channel. Introduction of programmes under SFC has resulted in enhancing the quality and content of the programme, thus leading to remarkable increase in viewership and also substantial increase in revenue for Doordarshan.

DD News

DD News is the only bilingual news channel in the country. Launched on November 3, 2003, Doordarshan News Channel has been fulfilling its role as a public service broadcaster. Having the unique distinction of being the only terrestrial-cum-satellite news channel, DD News reaches the non-cable, non-satellite homes which account for the major portion of the population. It is also the news channel with the largest reach in the country and among the market leaders in the "All Homes" category.

The channel in its programming mix is covering a wide canvas of issues dealing with Politics, Business, Sports, International news events, Parliament proceedings, health issues and Science and Technology, Central Government Flagship Programmes, Crime etc. Inputs from remote areas are made available for telecast through broadband based FTP link. Extensive coverage was given to Bihar Assembly Elections including live inputs from Correspondents deputed in a manner- so as to cover the major districts of the state and highlight poll related issues.

Special coverage of J & K and North –eastern states, and extensive exclusive coverage of the Sikkim earthquake were the prominent highlights for the year. Addresses of Indian Prime minister in Afghanistan Parliament and in India Africa summit in Ethiopia were shown LIVE on DD News.

The newsroom operating on a 24x7 basis throughout the year was instrumental in bringing the latest to the millions of DD News viewers across the country. The newsroom, the nerve

centre of the channel generated news bulletins by its experienced editorial team in English, Hindi, Urdu, Sanskrit and also for the Hearing-Impaired. Doordarshan News telecasts a fifteen minutes daily bulletin for the Hearing-Impaired at 0615 hrs.

The Business News Desk covered a number of issues related to economic policy decisions of the government, developments in the corporate world, personal finance, international economy and stock markets in its daily news coverage 'Business Wrap' from Delhi in the evening and 'Business Hour' from Mumbai in the afternoon. Union Budget, Union Railways Budget, RBI's Monetary Policy announcement were telecast live along with discussions with experts from diverse fields. The foreign visits of Prime Minister, Finance Minister, Commerce & Industry Minister to G20, BRICS meeting and IMF meetings were given coverage through inputs from our correspondents. Personal finance related issues were taken up in the weekend programme ' Money Mantra'. The stock market analysis and phone-in based queries were replied to in the weekend programme 'Market this Week' and 'Bazaar Iss Hafte'.

Viewers are enlightened through programmes like 'Jaanane ka Haq' on 'Right to Information Act, 2005'. 'Mere Desh Ki Dharti' on flagship programmes, 'Mehnat Rang Layegi' on career and employment opportunities in different fields and 'Ehsaas' on various socio-economic issues.

The inaugural Asian Hockey Championship Tournament in China won by India's men's team was extensively covered along with field reports through special arrangement. Wide coverage for the first ever F1 race held in the country – 'The Buddha International Circuit' that brought laurels to the country - was organized.

DD News receives large chunk of news stories and footages through FTP (File Transfer Protocol) by using internet. In order to improve and simplify the workflow, one of the latest Canopus NLEs was connected on the LAN of FTP. This facilitated receiving of all FTP content directly on NLE's timeline and allowing immediate editing of the received content including voiceover, if required.

In addition to the above, the same NLE has also been configured with AVN (Asia Vision News) FTP system for receiving and sending AVN contents directly to and from the news automation system. This also allows sharing DD News content amongst all AVN countries by uploading the content through same NLE.

In order to meet the requirement, one dedicated internet lease line was obtained from MTNL and was passed through a protected firewall & well configured proxy server for security, administrative control and immunity from virus threats and connected on ENPS network. This facilitated internet access on ENPS systems with negligible virus threats and thus allowing journalists to take any story picked up from internet directly on to ENPS through cut & paste.

DD News has 26 functional Regional News Units across the country. These RNUs telecast 109 bulletins daily in 19 languages/dialects.

Weather News is an important component of DD News channel. A two minutes weather capsule including forecast in Hindi and English was telecast thrice a day during the year.

Doordarshan News website <u>www.ddinews.gov.in</u> provided the latest news updates. It has registered good response from within and outside the country. The website has pages dedicated to the following categories-Entertainment, Science and Technology, Social, Health,

Weather report of four metro cities (New Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai & Kolkata), A Daily Poll Question (on a current Topic where viewers can answer in either Yes or No).

Top Story and the four Headlines of the Homepage are linked to the official government of India website (<u>www.india.gov.in</u>) as and when news is to be updated in the (<u>www.ddinews.gov.in</u>) website. The website carried special dedicated page catering to the following events in 2011

- State Assembly Election result (Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal & Pondicherry – in April-May, 2011)
- 2011- ICC Cricket World Cup (February to April, 2011)

DD Bharati

Launched on 26th January, 2002 DD Bharati Channel focuses on literature, theatre, art, crafts, paintings, sculpture, architecture, travelogue classical dance & music programmes performed by top grade artists of national and international repute. Cultural heritage, monuments and places of historical and religious importance, life & works of eminent poets & writers etc. are also being telecast in this band. The Channel was revamped from June 7th 2010. Since the channel is carrying programmes on Art, Literature and Culture, an eight hours loop has been introduced, which is being telecast thrice a day.

DD Bharati has telecast the Classic feature films upto October 2011 at 20.00 hrs on every Thursday & Sunday.

DD Bharati channel has attracted sponsored programmes given below: -

- (a) "Sindhu Darshan" highlighting the Sindhu culture and traditions once in a week upto June-2011 and twice a week after that upto October 2011.
- (b) "Sanskrit Bhasha Sikshanam" in Sanskrit Language by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi, thrice in a week.

In-House Programmes: - DD Bharati has produced a prestigious programme titled "Shabd Shatabdi" on the literary legends like "Agyeya", "Nagarjuna", "Kedarnath Agrawal", "Faiz Ahmed Faiz", Gopal Singh "Nepali" & "Shamsher Bahadur Singh" to mark their birth centenary year. After this a series of "Shatabdi Smaran" was produced on the Literary Legends mentioned above by DD Bharati before the invited audience at different DD Kendras like Jaipur, Patna, Allahabad, Varanasi & Delhi.

The other literary programmes produced in DD Bharati include: Patrika, Srijan and Kala Parikrama, Debate on the making of Indian Constitution, Spl Prog on the occasion of Birth and Death Anniversary of eminent personalities.

Live Events & Coverages: - DD Bharati has been telecasting "Live" events of music, dance & literary programmes from all across the country such as : Sachal Tirth Vaagarth-Nishantketu-Swati-Satkar Granth-30th April 2011 at Delhi, centennial Birth Anniversary of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore 2011- 6th May 2011 at Dhaka (Bangladesh), International Seminar of

Launched on 15th August 2006 DD:Urdu became 24x7 channel w.e.f. 14th November 2007. First notification for commissioning of DD Urdu programmes was issued in 2009 followed by second notification in 2011. 616 proposals were received in response to first notification and 430 proposals were received in response to second notification. These proposals were examined by the Evaluation Committee from 26th December, 2011 to 24th February, 2012 and 580 proposal for commissioning of DD Urdu got approval.

Major telecasts of DD Urdu in 2011-12 are as under:

DD-India

Doordarshan opened its windows to the world by launching its international channel on 14th March, 1995. The Channel, initially known as DD-World was renamed DD-India in 2002. The programming offers international viewers an update on the Indian social, cultural, political and economic scenario. DD-India was launched with a mission "to build bridges of communication with Indians living abroad and to showcase the real India to the entire world through programmes of high quality that will inform, educate and entertain people in the highest traditions of public service broadcasting."DD-India carries News bulletins, Features on Topical Events, Entertainment Programmes, Feature Films, Music and Dance, Serials, Documentaries, News and Current Affairs, Events and Tourism. 15 minutes news bulletin in Urdu, Gujarati, Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, Sanskrit and Punjabi are telecast all over the world.

A free to air round-the-clock channel DD-India is uplinked from New Delhi. DD-India was being uplinked on Intelsat Satellite and was reaching 86 countries throughout the world till the agreement with Intelsat expired on 5th March, 2011. However, since DD-India was also being uplinked on INSAT-4B, C-Band, it is now reaching 38 countries listed below which are within the footprint of INSAT-4B.

Asia

Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Brunei, Darussalam, China (Partly), Cambodia, Hong Kong, Israel, Malaysia (Partly), Myanmar, Laos, Nepal, Pakistan, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Vietnam, India.

Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia (Partly), Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan (Partly), Ukraine, Uzbekistan (Partly).

Middle East

Bahrain, Iran, Iraq, Kuwait, Oman(Partly), Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, Turkey (Partly), United Arab Emirates, Yemen (Partly).

DD-India is also available on Doordarshan's satellite DTH service DD Direct Plus.

A strategy of distributing the channel and to have footprint all over the world is under way in consultation with MEA.

DD-India is taking vigorous steps to enrich its programme content by refurbishing its fixed point chart. At present 8 hours programme loop is being telecast and the same is being repeated twice in 24 hours to suit the prime time zones of the world.

DD Sports

Sports Channel of Doordarshan was launched on 18th March 1999. The transmission of the channel was increased from 10 hours to 12 hours a day from April 25, 1999 and considering the popularity of the channel the transmission hours has been extended to round the clock from June, 2000. The channel has brought to its audience commendable programmes/ coverage of sports events during the year some of which are:

- 2. Delhi Half Marathon

In addition to this DD Sports has given coverage to the various National level Sports events held in India. Important in-house productions have been:

- (a) One-hour live programme "SPORTS HOUR" in English & Hindi (30 mts. each) featuring National & International sports events.
- (b) Programme "Sports Pulse".
- (c) O.B. coverage as well as live running commentary of various Sports events of National & International repute.
- (d) Pre/Post Discussion Programme on the ODI Cricket Series played between India and England.
- (e) Live studio discussion on Asian Champions Trophy Hockey 3/9/11 to 11/9/11 in China.
- (f) Live studio discussion programme "Caribbean Tour" on ODI cricket series played between India vs. West Indies from 04/06/2011 to 16/06/2011.
- (g) Live discussion programme on "Sultan Azlan Shah International Hockey Championship" from 05/05/2011 to 15/05/2011.

Ever since the Sports Broadcasting Signals (Mandatory Sharing with Prasar Bharati) Act, 2007 was notified on 19th March, 2007 Doordarshan has been telecasting sports events of national importance on its National channel and free to air DTH network in compliance of the Sports Act.

A decision had been taken to introduce the system of cash outflow for covering non-Olympic and traditional sports. It was also decided to continue covering sport events organized by the different sports rations and association with whom DD has entered in agreement to pay rights fee.

In view of the public service mandate of Prasar Bharati to promote sports, PB from time to time exempted the cash outflow principle in respect of the following: -

- Armed and Para Military Forces
- Games of disabled
- Education and cultural institutions.
- Sports in rural areas National or Regional level
- Promotion of Women Sports / events irrespective of discipline

- Events held in remote areas like J&K, North East States, Himachal Pradesh, Ranchi, Chattisgarh, Andaman Nicobar and Lakshadeep.
- Live coverage of National Games 2012 in Thiruvananthapuram from February 2012.
- London Olympics 2012.

Regional Language Satellite Channels (RLSC)

Doordarshan is presently operating 11 Regional Language Satellite Channels, which telecast programmes round the clock in Regional/ Local Languages of the state. These telecasts are available on terrestrial mode in the state during regional transmission and in the satellite mode at other times to the viewers. These programmes are also available in the satellite mode to the outside state viewers. Programmes for RLSC originate at Regional Kendras in regional languages and dialects and most of the programmes are area specific. 11 regional channels are:

DD-Sahyadri:

Launched on 15th August, 1994, DD Sahyadri is a Marathi language Satellite Channel, which became round the clock channel in 2000 on satellite mode. Sahyadri Channel is available on Terrestrial Support also from 6.00 to 9.00 am (except on Sunday) & 15.00 to 20.00 hrs.

Supported by Doordarshan Studios in Mumbai, Pune and Nagpur, DD Sahyadri is a household name in Maharashtra, largely because of its programmes with high production values. Despite stiff competition from private satellite channels, DD Sahyadri holds its own platform with acclaimed serials, informative programmes, public debates and film based programmes. DD Sahyadri also felicitates eminent citizens and personalities of Maharashtra for their contribution in different fields by honoring them with different Sahyadri Awards like Navratna Awards, Manik Awards, Sahyadri Marathi Cine Awards, Navjyoti Awards, KrishiRatna Awards and Hirkani Awards.

DD Sahyadri is the only Public Service Broadcaster among all Marathi TV Channels available in Maharashtra. The Channel devotes more than 46 % of its time to telecast informative, educative and other Public Service Programmes.

DD Sahyadri is uplinked from Mumbai through INSAT-3A Satellite in C-Band and can be viewed in the entire footprint area of INSAT-3A. It is also available on DD-Direct Plus.

Podhigai Channel

Regional Language "Tamil Satellite Channel" 'Podhigai' started functioning from Pongal day i.e., 15.1.2001 with round the clock transmission. Considering the genre of programmes telecast it is coined as 'infotainment Channel'.

Important in-house productions telecast during 2011-12:

Podhigaiyin Kaalai Thendral, Needhi Mandra Seidhigal, Seidhigal, Emergency Action, Suvaiyo Suvai(recipe), Ellaame Sangeethamthaan, Nam Virunthinar, Thullatha Manamum Thullum, Kara Saram (Talk show), Vaaliba Vaali, Vaniga Thagavalgal, Theneer Neram, Konjam Kavidhai Konjam Theneer, Azhagukalai, Endrum Inimai, Sirippu vedigal, Ponvilayum Bhoomi(Agriculture), Hello Ungaludan(phone-in-live) Suththamum Soozhalum, Konjum Salangai and Kannabiran Kadhaiyamudham.

Live coverage of Saturn Transit, a famous temple festival of the UT of Puducherry, was done with DSNG from Thirunallar (Karaikkal) on DD Podhigai on 21st December 2011 for one hour with commercials.

DD Girnar

The Satellite Regional Language Service (SRLS) in Gujarati known as DD-11 started on 01.10.1993 by uplinking from Delhi and the same service got uplinked locally from 15.08.1994. The channel was named DD-Girnar from September 15, 2008. 24 Hours (round the clock) transmission on Regional Satellite Language Service started with effect from 01.05.2000. It covers 86% area and 87.0% population of the state. The channel reach of DD-Girnar is 29.1 with 2.3% share in all TV homes. The Annual programmes of Rathyatra, Janmashtami and Kite Festival were covered live. It has successfully established its credentials as a production house by undertaking production on different contemporary issues and Govt. schemes.

On the occasion of the Silver Jubilee Year of Doordarshan Kendra, Ahmedabad, DD Girnar instituted "1st Girnar Shiromani Puraskar – 2012" for Achievement and significant contribution to Gujarat in the fields like Film, Theatre, Music, Literature, Women of Substance, Social service, Industry, Agriculture, Sports etc.Ground Event recording was done on Thursday, 19th April 2012 at Rabindranath Tagore Hall, Ahmedabad.

DD Kashir

Though terrestrial transmission of four hours daily service started from 27.03.1995 but the identity of "DD Kashir" as a separate Regional Satellite Channel got established with its formal inauguration on 26.06.2000. DD Kashir is a satellite channel with 24 hrs. of daily transmission through terrestrial x-mitters located in different parts of the valley.

Programme of DD Kashir are simultaneously telecast on DD 1 for four hours from 1600 hours to 2000 hours on weekdays i.e. Monday to Saturday. Important programmes of DD Kashir are:

Sadhbavana, Janoob Asia, Khabarnama, PTV Sach Kya Hai, Hum bhi mounah mein zubaan rakhtay hain, Halat-e-Hazara, Pakistan Reporter, Kashmir Now, Kashmir Nama, Sarhad Ke Do Rukh, Date line Kashmir, Tarz-e-Hayat, Darceeha, Such to yeh Hai. Good Morning J&K – a morning show programme have programme inputs from all the 3 regions of J&K State, i.e; Jammu, Kashmir and Ladakh. It cater to all sections of population highlighting cultural heritage, religious tolerance and national integration to attract greater viewership.

DD Malayalam

Launched on 15th August, 1994 DD Malayalam became a round the clock service in 2000. The channel is supported by Doordarshan studios in Thiruvananthapuram, Trissur and Calicut. In the terrestrial mode DD Malayalam reaches nearly 100% population of Kerala. DD Malayalam is available all over the country and in 68 countries across the Globe.

DD Malayalam has been able to make deep inroads into the information and entertainment market with the introduction of new genre of programmes like live current affairs debate, live quiz shows, live and interactive health programmes, live musical shows, stock market analysis, women's programmes, youth shows, children's programmes, morning shows, cultural magazines, film based programmes etc. while maintaining all the special audience and target group programmes intact.

DD Chandana

Launched on 15th August, 1994 DD Chandana is the Kannada language Satellite Channel. Supported by the Doordarshan studios in Bengaluru and Gulbarga, it became round the clock satellite channel in 2000 and its coverage expanded to more than 30 countries from 24th March, 2003.

The Kendra has started some innovative programmes as channel driver like Kannada Film songs based programme – 'Madhura Madhuravee Manjla Gaana' and special programmes during religious/national festivals. The telecast of live/deferred /recorded versions of these have also become a source of revenue generation for the Kendra.

• A special programme to welcome New Year, 2012, was telecast on the night of 31st December, 2011.

The programmes 'Belagu' and Anta Heli Quiz are popular among viewers. Further these are ideal programmes to show case the achievements of known/unknown veterans and even youngsters in the respective fields. This platform aims to introduce new talents to viewers.

Programmes like Hello Chief Minister, Hello Minister, Hello Lokayukta, Hello Police Commissioner are in the process for telecast.

Programmes in Kannada language constitute 99.3% of the total telecast while other languages (Urdu, Kodava, Konkani & Tulu) constitute 0.7 %.

DD Bangla

DD Bangla started with C-Band up-linking system from a temporary Earth Station set up on 20th August, 1992 through satellite reaching 36 countries in this continent. But DD Bangla programmes started from Kolkata on 15th August, 1994. 24 hours transmission of DD Bangla started from 1st January, 2000. Morning Bengali News Bulletin at 06.45 hours was introduced from 26th January, 2000. Digital Up-linking of DD Bangla Satellite Channel took place on 1st April, 2004. DD Bangla has been playing an important role in preserving and furthering the cultural heritage of Bengal and has been a popular TV channel among the Bengali audience of the country.

DD North-East

For the benefit and development of North-Eastern region, DD North-East was launched on 15th August, 1994 and it became 24 hours channel from 27th December, 2000.

Programme Production Centre (NE), DDK, Guwahati is the platform from where Doordarshan is offering uninterrupted programme service round the clock. Coverage area of DD North-East (DD-13) is extended to all the seven North-Eastern States and also Sikkim which has now come under the network of PPC (NE), DDK, Guwahati. Apart from PPC(NE), DDK, Guwahati's in-house programmes, contribution of different DD Kendras of the region constitute the telecast of DD North-East originating from DDK, Guwahati between 5.30 PM to 8.00 PM (Monday to Friday) and 3.00 PM to 8.00 PM (Saturday and Sunday) including News. DD North-East covers 76.6% of the area and 84.6% of the population of the entire North-East region.

The programme of DD-13, i.e. the North-East Satellite service is widely viewed in the region particularly in the rural areas. These programmes are available in the DTH mode also.

PPC (N.E.), DDK, Guwahati received the prestigious Gandhian Philosophy award, 2010 for the programme, Mukti Sangram, produced by Debabrata Goswami in 2011-12.

Activities during 2011-12:

- A special North-East talent search musical reality show was successfully produced by PPC (NE), Doordarshan in 2011-12. Participants from the entire north eastern region took part in the mega reality show. The grand finale of 'Sursangam' was telecast live from the Pragjyoti ITA Centre, Machkowa on 3rd December, 2011. The winners of Sursangam were awarded cash prize of Rupees One lakh, Rupees Seventy five thousand and Rupees Fifty thousand to the first, second and third prize winners respectively. This cash money was sponsored by different local organizations.
- A special programme of Hindi Songs as a part of Golden Jubilee celebration of Doordarshan was telecast live on 23.06.2011.
- Doordarshan kendras functioning in the North-East region are:

1) DDK:Aizwal

Just before the commencement of IXth Asiad Games, a 100W, LPT was installed at Tuikhuahtlang near Aizawl in October' 1982.At that time, it was covering Aizawl town and

surrounding villages by relaying programmes originating from Delhi. That LPT was upgraded to 1 KW, HPT in 1989. Another 100 W LPT was setup for DD-Metro transmission which started on 12.06.1995 and later on converted to DD-News. PPC started functioning w.e.f.12.6.1995 with local transmission of one hour from 1800 to 1900 hrs which was extended later on. RNU started its service with Mizo news bulletin w.e.f. 26.01.2003.Both DD-1 and DD-News were upgraded to 10KW and 1KW and became operational from April 2004. Because of increase in coverage area the transposer was closed and dismantled.

2) DDK: Gangtok

The Kendra is co-located with 2 HPTs for DD-National and DD- News, each radiating 1KW power. It is available in entire Gangtok city and its Suburbs. The Kendra is having 5 VLPTs in Mangan in North district, Gazing in West district, Namchi in the South and Rangpo and Singtam in East District of Sikkim for relaying DD National. It produces programmes on Agriculture, Bharat Nirman, Sikkim Round, Swasth Bharat each of 30 minutes duration & Musical programme of 15 mts duration. Most of the programmes are OB based. Telecast timing of the Kendra from Monday to Friday is 6.00 PM to 7.30 PM. It covers 80.4% of the area and 95.7% Population of the State. The Language of the programmes is Nepali.





Meeting with the parliamentary Committee on Rajbhasha was held at Gangtok.

3) DDK: Tura

Local transmission at DDK: Tura started on experimental basis from 26th January, 1993, but was commissioned later on 21st May 1993. Telecast of local Programme began from 31st May, 1993. Second channel DD-2 was inaugurated on 16th December 1995 and Metro HPT was inaugurated on 19th August 2000. At present DDK: Tura is telecasting programmes from 5.30 PM to 7.45 PM on weekdays(Monday to Friday) with intermittent News at 7.15 - 7.30 PM. The Kendra relays 15 minutes "City Scan" from DDK: Shillong at 7.45 PM .90% of the programmes are in Garo languages comprising Folk Music/ dance of Hajong, Rava , Koch, Boro etc. Kendra is producing programme in Bengali, Hindi and Nepali language also.

Revenue earned by the Kendra for the financial year 2011-12 is: -DCD- Rs.3,00,000/- and In-house- Rs. 84,033/-

Programmes produced by the Kendra during the year 2011-12:

- Live telecast of two hours musical programme on the occasion of NE Directors Conference in collaboration with AIR Tura.
- Kalyani A local Health care programme.
- Roving Eye- ENG- Weekly News based programme.
- Youth Programme and Children Programme.

- Agriculture & Flagship Programmes.

4) DDK: Shillong

Shillong got its first 100W LPT in the year 1983-84. In 1990, a new transmitter of 1 KW was installed at Laitkor Peak. DDK, Shillong was later commissioned in 1993. In 2004, the 1 KW transmitter was upgraded to 10KW. The reception in and around Shillong has greatly improved and the coverage area has widely expanded with this upgradation of transmitter power,. It covers 95.1% geographical area and 97.8% population of Meghalaya. It has a 2 ½ hours transmission time on all weekdays, and 5 hours on Saturdays & Sundays. The Kendra gives emphasis on local language programmes.

The Vision for the channel:

- To make DDK Shillong programmes available on the satellite & DTH platform
- To Launch regional services from DDK Shillong for 5 hours duration, i.e. 3.00- 8.00
 PM

Important Programmes telecast

- Hoisted a series of concerts showcasing the finest talents of the state at the remotest corners like Jowai and Mawkyrwat to mark the 50th anniversary of Doordarshan.
- Launching of Dedicated Health Programme-Kalyani II.
- Tribute to Bob Dylan on his 70th Anniversary.
- Six Episode series on 150th Anniversary of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore.
- All Shillong Inter School Extempore Competition.
- Youth programme "Sound & Substance" an extempore competition featuring students from all the prominent Educational Institutions of Shillong highlighting the inherent talent of the youths of the region.

5) DDK: Silchar

Doordarshan came to Barak Valley on 04.12.1984 and relayed programme from Delhi through its LPT. Operation of HPT started on 26.09.1987. DDK, Silchar started telecasting locally produced 30 minutes programme from its studio from 30.04.1993, which was enhanced to one hour from 03.09.1995 and again to 2 hours(from 1800 - 2000 hours) from 01.08.2000 excluding relays of North East News bulletin in English and Assamese Batori of DDK Guwahati between 1900 and 1930 hours. Local transmission was further extended to 2.30 hours w.e.f. 02.07.2004.Kendra started earning commercial revenue from 30.10.2008.The Kendra has earned a revenues of Rs. 14,53,401/- during the financial year 2011-12.

Achievement and activities of the Kendra:

The Kendra has produced special cultural programmes on Bengali New Year, English Year ending, community and ethnic festivals, special documentary on renowned Saint Fakir Makha Shah.

Some popular programmes telecast from the Kendra are:

Ain-Kanun (live Phone-in- programme on legal advice), Swastha Charcha (live Phone-in programme on Health), Mukho-Mukhi (Interview based programmes with famous personalities in the field of politics, administration etc.), Haste mana (Hilarious skits).

6) DDK: Dibrugarh

Formal inauguration of LPT for DD took place on 09th September, 1984 at Dibrugarh, which was upgraded to HPT on 31st March, 1988 for transmitting DD programmes in different parts of the state. A full fledged DD station came into existence on 31st May, 1993 with the inauguration of DDK; Dibrugarh. It has a 10KW HPT for DD-I and 100W LPT for DD News services. The studio has a 3 Camera set-up. Total coverage Area of the Kendra is 21,706 Sq. kms.

Some popular programmes telecast from the Kendra are:

- One weekly News Magazine covering all important activities of the area
- "Hello Doctor"
- Mukta Manch (interaction with audience on burning issues)
- "Hello Murchana"
- 'Mukha Mukhi'
- Govt. sponsored "Flagship" programmes

7) DDK: Itanagar

LPT Itanagar was commissioned in 1982 which was upgraded to 1KW in 1991.Full fledged functioning of the Kendra started from 05.02.1996.It covers 82.7% area and 89.7% population of the state. Kendra produce 92% of its Programme in -house and a few are commissioned

and sponsored from outside for telecast.

The Kendra has earned revenue of Rs. 11 lakh during the financial year 2011-12.

Activities during 2011-12:

- Coverage of All India Governors Gold Cup Football Tournament.
- Telecast of the messages of Governor and Chief Minister on the occasion of Republic Day and Independence Day.
- Organised a Crop Seminar under the scheme "Mass Media Support to Agriculture Extension"

8) DDK: Agartala

TVRC Agartala started functioning from October, 1982, which was upgraded to HPT on 05th December, 1986. It was finally inaugurated on 27th January, 1987. For programme production, Studio was inaugurated on 20.11.1992 but the telecast of Local Programme started from the year 1995. News in Bengali & Kokborok language/dialect started from 18th December, 2005. The telecast timing of the Kendra is from 5.30 PM to 8.00 PM from Monday to Friday and 3.00 - 8.00 PM on Saturday.

9) DDK: Kohima

DDK: Kohima started Relaying DD-I (National) with LPT (100W) installed in AIR Complex, Kohima from 1982. It was upgraded to 1KW HPT on 18th October, 1987. Formal Commissioning of PPC, Kohima took place on 22nd December, 1995.From 01st May, 2003 transmission of local programme was increased to 2 hrs duration daily. It also started telecasting 10 minutes local News bulletin from 01st May, 2003. Power of DD transmission was upgraded from 1KW to 10 KW on 01st April, 2004. From 22.03.2012 digital uplinking facility has been upgraded from single carrier mode to two carrier mode. All the studios and Earth Stations are operating in Digital Domain. It covers 71.5% area and 72.4% population of the entire state.

The Kendra has earned revenue of Rs. 3.0 lakh during financial year 2011-12

Some of the important programmes telecast during 2011-12 are:

Flagship Programme, Prog on Health Care, Sr. Citizen and Differently-Abled, TV Report/Western Music, Devotional Songs in English, Folk songs/Dances, General development Prog. (CP/IHP), Women's for a (CP/IHP0-1.3, Youthnet (CP/IHP)-2,4(Wednesday), Songs in Naga Dialects, Colours (Entertainment Programme), The North East News, Reliving the week etc.

DD-6 (ODIA)

RLSC for Odisha known as DD-6(ODIA) was commissioned on 2.11.1993. However, it was made a 24-hour channel on Utkal Diwas (01.04.2001). At present, DD-6(Odia) channel is

getting terrestrial support of 55 hrs 30 minutes transmission per week and the rest 112 hours 30 minutes duration transmission is available exclusively on Satellite mode. Most of its programmes are produced at Bhubneshwar, Sambalpur and Bhawanipatna. Language-wise programme composition of DD-6(ODIA) shows that Odia constitute 96.57% of the total programme telecast followed by Commercials/Promos/Fillers(2.39 %) and Hindi Samachar from Delhi (1.04%).

Activities of DD-6(Odia) during the period 2011-12 are listed below:

"Utkal Pragyan Samman-2011", Live telecast of Rath Yatra of Lord Jagannath, Lord Balabhadra & Devi Subhadra and Bahuda Yatra of Lord Jagannath Live from Puri.The Suna Besha (Golden Attires) of the deities was telecast Live from Puri on 12.07.2011 for a duration of 3 hours. The Foundation Day Programme of Doordarshan entitling "Saptaranga" was telecast on 15.09.2011 in a befitting way.

DD Punjabi

DD Punjabi was launched on 06th August, 1998 and became 24 hour channel from 05th August, 2000. This Channel was initially 2+1 simulcast in Analogue mode, till 22nd March 2004 when this channel was converted into digital transmission channel. This is a 24 hours non-stop Punjabi channel which is seen widely in India and other countries where the footprints of satellite INSAT 3A and Satellite INSAT 4B are available. DD Punjabi is also available in DTH platform on Satellite INSAT 4B.

In terrestrial mode DD Punjabi has almost 100% reach in the state of Punjab. Doordarshan Kendra Jalandhar is the main source of supply of Punjabi programmes for telecast on DD Punjabi Channel. The 24 hours transmission of DD-Punjabi is divided into 5 parts under the titles Amrit Vela, Sajjri Saver, Day Time Transmission, Evening Transmission & Night Transmission. This channel also carries programmes such as Sports, Live Events and programmes of entertainment.

Other programmes telecast during 2011-12 are: Qanooni Nukte ,Ajj Da Masla , Doctor Nu Milo, "Khirki" (magazine programme of one hour telecast live at 14:00 hrs. for Middle East).

DD Punjabi earned a revenue of Rs.10.51 crore during the financial year 2011-12.

DD Saptagiri

DD Saptgiri is Telugu language satellite channel supported by Doordarshan studios in Hyderabad, Vijayawada and Warangal. It was launched on 10th October, 1993 and became a round the clock service in 2000. The channel started its website from 23-04-2009 for the benefit of its viewers.

Some important programmes telecast on DD Saptagiri are as under:

- Muthyala Saram :- special programme `Muthyala Saram' (Garland of Pearls) based on patriotic songs
- Launching of a New Logo from 6.10.2011 on the eve of Dussehra festival.

Covered ITF Tennis Tournament (deferred Live), Kabaddi Premier League (KPL), Indian Volley Ball League (IVL), Polo Season-2011, Tollywood Stars Cricket (on DD-Saptagiri), Sr. National Indian Style Wrestling, National Ranking Table Tennis Tournament, 57th Sr. National Ball Badminton Championship for men and women (deferred live), ITF Future Tennis Tournament, India vs Australia Women's T-20 Series.

Other sections of Doordarshan

DD Commercial

Doordarshan Commercial Service is responsible for booking of advertisement and sponsorship normally through accredited and registered agencies and also on direct placement on advance payment without agency commission. New Commercial units have been setup at Regional Kendras, where such facilities were not available. Doordarshan also accepts scroll advertisement at HPT and LPT where there is no origination of Programme. Total revenue earned through commercial section for the year 2011-12 is Rs. 1128.48 Crores.

Development Communication Division

Doordarshan set up Development Communication Division in March, 2001 to enhance revenue from Govt. agencies. Direct marketing, eliminating middle-men (private agencies), pro-active approach, dynamic marketing tools & strategies, and on-time launch & completion has paid rich dividends with continuous growth in revenue to Development Communication Division. During the year 2011-12, the division recorded over 1300% increase in revenue since inception. Also 1664 programmes were produced by 16 Kendras in 10 languages & dialect.

It has provided platform for creation of partnerships with State Governments for in-house productions. The model has been replicated in setting up of Agricultural & Narrowcasting Cell with more and more govt. and non-govt. agencies seeking partnerships with Doordarshan for production & telecast of socially relevant programmes. This year our partnership with UNICEF for the popular serial "Kyonki Jeena Isi Ka Naam Hai" continued further.

WHO selected India's longest running health campaign 'Kalyani', (an in-house production of Doordarshan) as one of 15 top global "innovations" that advance the work of women and children health during the year. The programme, for its unique impact was exhibited by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare at International Trade Fair at Pragati Maiden. The campaign has been expanded to 21 states in 13 languages and 17 dialects.

Narrowcasting

"Mass Media Support to Agriculture Extension", introduced in 2004 has three-tier approach"

- 1. On the National Channel: Country specific Agriculture programmes are telecast Monday to Saturday from 6:30 AM to 7:00 AM.
- On 18 Regional Channels: State specific Agriculture programmes are telecast five days a week (Monday to Friday) on the Regional Language satellite Channels (RLSS), from 6.00 PM to 6.30 PM.

3. In "Narrowcasting" Mode: Area specific information, produced twice a week, is being telecast five days a week (Monday to Friday), in the evening through PGFs and Regional kendras over 180 transmitters across the country, catering to area-specific information need of the farmers of more than 140 districts across the country.

All aspects of Agriculture, Horticulture, Veterinary Sciences and Fisheries are included in the programmes. Weekly live Phone-in programmes, Information on weather and Crop seminars are important features of these programmes. It also provides Agriculture News Bulletin, Mandi Bhav Bulletin (market prices), publicity of minimum support price (MSP), campaign on seed treatment during kharif and other information provided by the DAC, Minister of Agriculture in each Krishi Darshan.

The date-wise schedule of programmes of the 55 production centers to be telecast each day are uploaded on a specific portal (www.dacnet.nic.in/csms), for extension workers, planners and educated farmers.

Paryavaran Darshan

Doordarshan has implemented the scheme "Mass Media Support to Environmental Awareness" supported by Central Pollution Control Board in DD-National and 18 Regional kendras during 2011-12. It focuses on various environmental issues specific to respective regions in respective languages. In view of capacity building a two day workshop was organized at Delhi by CPCB for the producers of Paryavaran Darshan.

Central Production Centre(CPC)

DD Sports

- (a) Telecast of 24X7 hrs. transmission
- (b) In-house production of one-hour programme "Sports Hour" in English & Hindi of 30 minutes. each which comprises coverage of Sports events of National & International repute.

- (d) In house production of fortnightly programme "Sports Pulse".
- (e) Live Studio Discussion on Pre Game Shows/Interview of Indian Wrestlers for London Olympics-2012.

Robocon (Robotic Contests) in India started by Doordarshan in 2002 with just four participants. This number swelled to 58 during the National Robocon 2011.

International Robocon 2011

The International Robotic Contest, 2011 was held at IMPACT Arena Bangkok, Thailand in which 19 Engineering Colleges from 18 countries participated. The Theme for Robocon 2011 declared by MCOT was "Lighting Happiness with Friendship".

Film Section

To make the telecast more attractive and better in terms of packaging and marketing, Doordarshan has branded the feature films slot as "Friday Houseful" to show latest blockbusters, "Saturday Jubilee" to show superhit popular films, "Retrospective" to show films of eminent film makers/artists/theme based films on Sundays, "Bioscope" to show old classic & popular films in serialized manner from Monday to Wednesday. Recently "Paa", "Wake Up Sid", Do Knot Disturb", Oye Lucky Lucky Oye", "Aladin", "Arth", "Love Aaj Kal", "Ghajini", "Rajneeti", "Udaan", "Jab We Met", "I Hate Love Story", "Ajab Prem Ki Gajab Kahani", "Khuda Ke Liye", "Tees Mar Khan", "Dabangg", "Jodha Akbar" were shown on Doordarshan in various categories mentioned above. Similarly films based on literary works were telecast under the title "Safar Shabd Se Celluloid Tak" in the Retrospective Slot.

National Awardee Regional Films

Doordarshan telecasts two national award winning regional language films every month. These Swarna Kamal (Golden Lotus) and Rajat Kamal (Silver Lotus) award winning films are procured on multiple telecast rights for three years and telecast on DD-NNW on 2nd and 4th Sunday at 11.30 PM. "Periyar", "Naan Kudavul", "Vimukti", "Vasundhara-The Earth", "Shob Choritro Kalponik" (Bengali), "Thanmatra", "Periyar", "Chuuta Chheda" which bagged national award were shown recently. New Film Guidelines 2007: New Film Guidelines 2007 have been revised under which the Films are being procured centrally by Film Section for telecast on all the channels of Doordarshan under royalty category.

Tentative Plan for the coming Year: Seeing the good response of films received under New Film Guidelines, Doordarshan plans to invite offers for latest blockbusters to enhance the revenue and increase viewership. Process to procure latest blockbusters as a package from the eminent film makers like M/s Yash Raj Films, M/s UTV etc.

Guidelines for award winning regional language films as well as commercial regional films for telecast on NNW and Regional Kendras are also being formulated.

Hindi Section

To ensure the compliance of the Official Language policy and instructions relating to the progressive use of Hindi, there is separate Hindi Section in the Doordarshan Directorate. The main activities of the section during the year 2011-12 are:

- 1. All documents under Section 3(3) of the Official Language Act 1963, were issued in bi-lingual form and all letters received in Hindi were replied to in Hindi.
- 2. Four meetings of the Official Language Implementation Committee were held during the year to review the position of the compliance of the Official Language policy in the Directorate.
- 3. Hindi workshops were organized from time to time to create awareness among the officers/employees regarding Official Language Hindi and to motivate them to do their work in Hindi.
- 4. Released sixth issue of Directorate's Hindi in house magazine 'Darshan'.
- 5. Organized Hindi Fortnight from 01st to 15th September, 2011. Various competitions were held and cash prizes given to the successful participants during this period.
- 6. Seven Hindi magazines published by various Doordarshan Kendras were awarded shields/trophies under the Best Magazine Award Scheme during the year.

PR Unit

A complete guide to Doordarshan Programmes "DD This Week" is published from PR Unit and circulated to all Media units including agencies like PTI, UNI, All Newspapers and DTH Platforms for their Electronic Programme Guides. PR Section updates the Doordarshan Website on daily basis to keep the viewers updated on programme information.

Illuminative Bill Boards are installed on the Boundary Walls of Doordarshan. Media interaction with Press is arranged when required.

DD-Archives

Archiving is a continuous process in any broadcasting agency as important recordings are preserved for future telecast and of course for generation next and Indian broadcasting is no exception to it. Doordarshan is the biggest and was the first Audio Visual platform of Information, Education & Entertainment. It has a history of more than 50 years. But there was no provision to protect the rare and valuable programmes telecast through its various channels over the years. From 1959 to 2003 DD Archives was more or less a storehouse and archiving was only a process of not erasing recordings which were deemed to be important by individuals. Doordarshan Archives reinvented itself in 2003 with a new approach and prepared itself to meet the challenges of Audio Visual Digital World.

DD Annual Awards

Doordarshan instituted DD Awards in 2001 to recognize and felicitate thematic, aesthetic, technical excellence of in-house Programmes. The main objective of these awards is to promote a competitive spirit among the staff for quality and innovative productions. The annual award function is designed as an opportunity for learning and moral boosting among the talented producers from different Kendra. Awards were given in 34 categories were awarded on the maiden award function. The 10th DD Annual Award presentation ceremony was held in Delhi on 25th May,2011 wherein awards were given in 32 categories. The Hon'ble Minister of Information & Broadcasting announced a new category Innovative Ideas & Innovative Treatment based best Commissioned Programme for Doordarshan Annual Award-2011 which was later finalized. Revenue of Rs. 80 lakhs was earned in the 10th Doordarshan Annual Award ceremony.

Audience Research

Audience Research Unit of Doordarshan with its 19 field units located at Doordarshan Kendras all over the country is involved in Research studies on various aspects of broadcasting since 1976. During the year 2011-12, the Unit contribution is as follow:

- Analysis and reporting of TAM TVR on weekly basis.
- Preparation of annual report of Prasar Bharati for 2011-12 and Ministry of I&B for the year 2011-12.

- Report finalized on "Impact of DD, Pvt. Cable & Satellite channel on women and family in India".

Administration

Budget Section makes the Budget Estimates for each financial year for Doordarshan after obtaining the Budget Estimates from all the Kendras/DMCs/HPTs/LPTs, spread all over the country. During the financial year 2011-12, major initiatives and activities of the Budget Section is as follows:

- Periodical review meetings are held to review the trend of Plan and Non Plan expenditure with a view to ensure the proper utilization of the Budget.
- Material for the preparation of the 'Outcome Budget' is consolidated and sent to Prasar Bharati.
- The sanctioned Budget Grant allocated by Prasar Bharati were distributed to all the Kendras/DMCs/HPTs/LPTs, proportionate to their requirement projected by them.
- At the time of submission of Revised Estimates for the year, proposals were called for from the Kendras/DMCs etc. and the Revised Budget Estimates for the Doordarshan as a whole was consolidated and forwarded to Prasar Bharati.
- The Revised Estimates allocated by Prasar Bharati was distributed to all the Kendras/DMCs/HPTs and LPTs.
- Monitoring of the Plan and Non Plan expenditure by the HQrs in respect of all the field units by obtaining monthly expenditure statements from all the concerned and the same was consolidated and forwarded to Prasar Bharati.

The Programme production centres across the county telecast programmes in Regional/Local

languages in their respective coverage zones. Brief descriptions of these Regional/Local Doordarshan Kendras and its activities during 2011-12 are as follows:

DDK:Delhi

Doordarshan Delhi is the primary Kendra of the country and has the credit of not only originating and launching television in India in September, 1959 but also of presenting the National Transmission to the rest of the country since its inception. Programmes initiated by the Kendra in its early days, about half a century ago like Krishi Darshan and Chitrahaar continue to have relevance today and are still household names in India.

It is responsible for 24 x 7 hour transmission of DD-I and DD Bharati while simultaneously functioning as a regional centre for Delhi, its adjoining areas and LPTs scattered in remote areas of the country.

The Kendra is also the pivotal central hub which originates over 150 live outdoor broadcasts annually on the National Network. Besides being carried terrestrially by all other Doordarshan kendras, many of these events being of national and international importance are also utilized by satellite channels based in India and other international channels.

All important international sporting events telecast on Doordarshan, including events of special interest featuring India viz. One Day Cricket matches, Davis cup matches, Hockey tests etc. were down linked by the Kendra and then transmitted to the rest of the country.

The Kendra also coordinates the daily three hours playout for DD HD Channel from 19:00 to 22:00 hrs and the state-of-the art archiving and restoration equipment with playback facilities of DD Archives at Akashvani Bhawan. In addition, the Kendra provides technical facilities and support for DD News.

Special mention can be made of Republic day live coverage – 2012. In 2011, using optical fibre networks, the Kendra connected for the first time in its history, 5 cameras deployed with the first OB set up at India Gate with the second OB Van set up at Rajpath. The OB set up at Amar Jawan Jyoti, India Gate which had hitherto been utilized for only the first five minutes, thus became an integral and continuous part of the rest of the parade from Rajpath.

In 2011, Doordarshan Kendra, Delhi was able to innovate its production plans and get a panoramic view of the Parade and the tableau by installing a Jimmy-zib camera at the saluting base of Rajpath. Thus, for the first time ever, an overhead camera was used to provide shots of the parade from a height enabling Doordarshan to show pictures of what was happening inside the tableaux to the viewers not just from the side-on perspective, but also to provide additional top down and frontal views.

DDK, Kolkata

Doordarshan, Kolkata was commissioned on 9th August, 1975. The service range was increased from 50 kms to 80 kms in March, 1978. Colour transmission including outside coverages through OB Van started on 6th June, 1983. Inauguration of 2nd Channel at Doordarshan, Kolkata for one hour daily programme took place on 19th November, 1987. From 4th September, 1988 morning transmission was introduced. Duration of 2nd channel programmes increased to 2 hours from 19th November, 1988 and to 3 hours from 26th January, 1990(07.30 hours to 10.30 hours). The first full-fledged Digital Studio came into operation from December, 2001. Second Digital Studio came into operation from January, 2002. Programmes in Bangla occupies first position with 96.3%, followed by Music/Dance Programme (1.2%), Urdu (1.1%), Hindi & Nepali (0.7% each) during 2011 – 2012. DDK, Mumbai

Doordarshan Mumbai came on Television map of India on 2nd October 1972. Another channel DD Metro was Commissioned on 1st May 1985. But Marathi Programmes were available to Maharashtra through commissioning of Regional Service from 9th August 1986. Going through various stages DDK Mumbai today has become one of the major centres in India and during the year 2005-06, Digitalization of Studio Production took place. At present DDK Mumbai manages transmission of two 24 hours channels namely DD National and Sahyadri (RLSC). With overall technical and production development, DDK Mumbai is in a position to produce more than 70 % in-house programmes. The programmes are telecast in Marathi (85.7 %), Hindi (2.4%), and (Sindhi 0.7%) languages. It covers 77.5 % area and 87.1% population of the State.

DDK, Chennai

Satellite link was established in the year 1982 to facilitate downlinking of National Programmes transmitted from Delhi Kendra along with colour transmission. HPT with 10 KW was commissioned on 14th January, 1987 at Kodaikanal Hill top to relay the Programmes to reach the far-flung areas. DTH service was commissioned on 16th December 2004. At present, Regional service in Tamil language is being relayed by 10 HPTs, 54 LPTs and 7 VLPTs to serve the entire Tamilnadu state.

This Kendra provides VTR service support to other Kendras in the south zone. The services of the Kendra were extended to DDK Madurai, DDK Coimbatore and DDK Pudhucherry.

DDK, Hyderabad

Inaugurated on 23rd October, 1977, partial colour transmission of Doordarshan Kendra,

Hyderabad began from 05-01-1983. News in Telugu (Varthalu) and commercial service started by the Kendra in November and December, 1983 respectively. Regular colour transmission started from 06th January, 1986. The Studios were shifted to its own premises at Ramanthapur, Hyderabad on 27-11-1988. It took almost 11 years for the Kendra to go for Digital mode of transmission (from 15-08-1999). Digital Uplinking System was commissioned on 13-10-2003. Now the service has been extended to the entire state and some parts of the country as well as the world. As per 2011-12 fixed point charts, language wise programme produced by the Kendra is as follows:-

Telugu (97.7%), Urdu (1.5%) and Hindi (0.8%).

DDK, Ahmedabad

The First 1KW MW TV transmission started functioning on 15-03-1977 in Gujarat at PIJ village under the banner of Kheda Communication Project with Programme production facilities at Space Application Centrel (ISRO), Ahmedabad for 30 minutes. From 19.11.1983 the existing 10 KW Transmitter at Thaltej, Ahmedabad started radiating Doordarshan Programmes with

temporary mast of 100ft. (on reduced power of 1KW). The existing Doordarshan Studio along with required production facilities was commissioned on 02-10-1987. Though it started with telecast of only 10 Minutes News and 30 Minutes Hardcore Agriculture programme at its inception, the Kendra is now putting out round the clock telecast, i.e. 24 hours.

Commercial Service was introduced at Doordarshan Kendra, Ahmedabad on 7th January 1988. The much-awaited Regional link up of the Kendra was inaugurated on 30.12.1992. On 01.05.1994, DD-2 Metro transmission was inaugurated at Ahmedabad which was converted to 24 hours DD News Channel with effect from 3rd November, 2003. The programmes of this Kendra are being relayed by 8 HPTs, 61 LPTs and 3 VLPTs situated in Gujarat, Daman & Diu covering 93.8 % of area and 94.7 % of State population.

The Kendra's programme complexion includes News and Current Affairs, Education, Entertainment, Film based, Informative, Health and Family Welfare, Rural Development, Agriculture, Women, Children, Youth, Cookery Shows, Beauty tips, Humorous, literary and Art Programmes in addition to development Stories, Telefilm, Music, Dance, Plays/Serials, Science and Technology/Environment, sports, Quiz and Linguistic Minority programmes like Sindhi and Urdu as also a programme in Hindi.

Revenue generation by the Kendra during 2011-12 is Rs.4,86,82,648/-

For the first time "Scroll advertisement Awareness" display & Displaycum-Sale counter for Archival DVD's/ CD's was arranged for the public.
 - Rathyatra was telecast live.

DDK, Jalandhar

Programme production of DDK, Jalandhar began ever since its inauguration on 13th April, 1979. However, full fledged functioning of the Kendra began with the commissioning of a 10 KW transmitter on 01.06.1981.Now the centre at Jalandhar with its network of relay

transmitters at Amritsar, Bathinda, Fazilka, Pathankot, Gurdaspur, Ferozpur, Abohar, Patiala, Talwara and Chandigarh covers whole of Punjab as well as parts of the adjoining states of Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, J&K and Union Territory of Chandigarh. The Kendra originates 31 Hrs. 30 Mts of programmes, per week .Bulk of the programmes produced by the Kendra are in regional language, i.e; Punjabi (87.5%). In addition to this, programmes in Hindi, Urdu, Haryanvi, Himachali and Dogri are also telecast to cater the needs of the neighbouring states.

The Kendra originates about 50 different programmes every week which include plays, features, variety programmes, programmes of legal hints, health & hygiene, environment, agriculture, humorous programmes, art, aesthetics, cultural heritage, folk lore, literature, current affairs, sports development, science & technology and a galaxy of other subject meant for general as well as various specific audiences. It telecast 93.4% In- House productions and 6.6% sponsored programmes. News and Current affairs programmes are telecast round the clock by DD News channel of Jalandhar.

Revenue earned by the Kendra during 2011-2012 is Rs. 4,92,93,065/- (excluding DCD)

DDK, Lucknow

Doordarshan Lucknow, the 7th Kendra came on the television map of the country on 27th, November 1975. Since its inception the Kendra has made significant contribution to accelerate socio-economic development and in promoting national integration & communal harmony, art & craft, artistic & cultural activities, sports etc. in the state. The transmission timings are 10:00 AM to 10:30 AM (Monday to Friday) for ETV (Deeksha) and 04:00 PM to 08:00 PM (Monday to Saturday) and 06:30 PM to 08:00 PM (Sunday) for general programmes. The fully automated Regional News Room of DDK Lucknow is playing very vital role covering the largest state of the country since (15th August.2005). Hindi is the main Language of the region and occupies more time (81%) followed by Urdu (3%). This Kendra telecast 47% In-House

productions 31% sponsored Programme and remaining (22%) others. It Covers more than 90.4% area and 96.4% population of Uttar Pradesh. The Kendra is also coordinating with other PGF of UP & Uttaranchal and is acting as a Nodal agency for entire Hindi Belt.

DDK: Bhubaneswar

The Upagraha Doordarshan Kendra (UDK) at Cuttack came into existence in August, 1974 to feed programmes for Satellite Instrumental Television Experiment (SITE). An HPT was commissioned at DDK, Cuttack on 10.3.1985 for relaying programmes telecast through the INSAT-B for the viewers around 80-100 KMs radius of its transmission zone. The regional programme up-linking facilities were made available to Orissa network from 7.9.1991 which enabled regional programme transmission by all HPTs/LPTs in the state. The new DD complex at Bhubneswar was commissioned on 19.11.1992. First Live Telecast of Car Festival on Regional Network took place in 1992. Similarly Commercial Service started with effect from 18.09.1994. At present DDK Bhubneswar covers 88.7% of the land area and 93.3% population of the state. On the other hand DD-News has coverage of 12.4% of land area and 25.3% population of the state.

The Regional News Unit (RNU), DDK, Bhubaneswar has been telecasting four Bulletins, two Prime Bulletins with 15 minutes duration and News Headlines at 3.00 PM and 5.00 PM with

2 minutes duration. The unit also produces Parikrama – a Live Programme on News and Current affairs of 28 minutes on every Thursday at 5.02 PM.

Revenue earned by DDK, Bhubneshwar during 2011-12 is Rs. 10,79,62,958 (including Rs. 5,02,97,200 from DCD).

Activities of the Kendra during 2011-12:

- Special Programme "Utkal Pragyan Samman-2011" of One & Half hour duration was organized before an invited audience and telecast live from the Kendra on 1st April'2011 on the occasion of Utkal Diwas and Anniversary Day of DD-6(Odia).

DDK, Jaipur

The first television programme was viewed by the people of Rajasthan on 1st August 1975 under the SITE Project in the districts of Kota, Sawai Madhopur and Jaipur. On 1st June 1987, Jaipur Doordarshan Kendra was set up at Jhalana Doongri and transmission started from 6th July 1987. Initially the Kendra produced only 30 minutes of programmes and this was gradually increased to about 4 hours. The LPTs located at Ajmer, Udaipur, Jodhpur and Bikaner and HPT at Bundi are well connected since 2nd October. 1993 with DDK Jaipur via satellite for transmission of programmes. On 01.05.95 telecast of DD-2 programmes commenced from Jaipur using a 100W LPT which is now telecasting DD News since 2000 from a 10 KW HPT. The reach of the News channel is 11% by area and 32% by population. Most of the programmes are telecast in Hindi and local languages of Rajasthan.

Presently the Kendra originates over four hours of daily programming (25 hrs and 30 minutes weekly) in Hindi and Rajasthani. Programmes are also telecast in Sindhi, Urdu, English and Sanskrit. Regional News bulletin of 15 minutes duration in Hindi started from 11th February, 1990 and that in Rajasthani language started from April, 2000. At present the Kendra originates two news bulletins daily one in Hindi and another in Rajasthani and feeds important stories for the national bulletins including regular contribution in Rajyon Se Samachar at 17.40 hrs daily on DD News.

The reach of DD-14 (Jaipur) is 79.3% by population and 72.4% by area of Rajasthan and DDnews is 36.1% by population and 13.2% by area of the state.

Revenue earned by the Kendra is Rs 7.07 crores during the year 2011-12.

DDK, Ranchi

Doordarshan Kendra, Ranchi was commissioned on 25th September'1984. The Kendra produced "Area Specific Programmes" till 2nd April'2002 when the Kendra became a regional unit with its coverage extending to entire Jharkhand. On this very day, another remarkable event in the form of telecast of Regional News began from the Kendra. First Live Programme from DDK, Ranchi Studio was aired on 02.04.2002. Digitalisation of Earth Station was done on 2nd March, 2003. Later, a New Digital Studio was commissioned on 28.02.2007.Presently DD- National and DD News cover 96.7 % and 15.7% area and 97.4 % and 23.4% population of the state respectively. Most of the programmes are telecast in Hindi language (86.52%), followed by Tribal Languages (05.24%) and Other Languages(Bhojpuri, Bengali, Rajasthani, Punjabi etc. (08.24%).

Revenue earned by the Kendra during 2011-2012 is Rs. 1,97,23,907/-

DDK, Srinagar

DDK Srinagar is one of the oldest Kendra of Doordarshan which came up on 26th January 1973 after Delhi and Mumbai. It started RR-2 and DD-Kashir transmissions with 100W LPT in the year 1994 & 1995 respectively. Later on these two transmitters were upgraded with 1KW transmitter each in the years 1999 and 2000 respectively. Further both the transmitters were replaced with 10KW R&S transmitters alongwith the DD-I Transmitter in March, 2006. To enhance the infrastructure of the Kendra, Digital Earth Station was commissioned on 10th June 2005. Mostly Programmes are produced in the following Languages/ Dialects: Kashmiri (46%), Urdu (41%), Dogri (03%), Ladakhi & Hindi (02% each), Punjabi, Gojri, Pahari, Pushto, Sheena & Balti (01% each).

Keeping in view the importance of North-East region, Doordarshan Kendra-Guwahati was commissioned on 24th March 1985 which was shifted to permanent complex at R.G.Baruah Road on 07-02-92. All transmitters in Assam were linked to regional Service from 01-05-93. It covers 79% geographical area and 83% population of the whole Assam. To generate revenue for DD, commercial service started from 1st October, 1994.

A regional archiving facility is being set up at this Kendra for which work is in progress. In-House productions constitute 68% of the total telecast followed by sponsored programmes (15%), Commissioned programmes (7%) and others (10%). Content-wise, Informative programmes comprise the most (42%) followed by Educational programmes (30%) and Entertainment programmes (28%). Assamese as the prime language of the Kendra has occupied more telecast time (85%) compared to English (7%), Hindi (3%), Bodo (4%) and other dialects (1%).

Gross Revenue Earning of DDK, Guwahati for the period 2011-12 is Rs. 2.32 crores.

The first and second samaroh were organized during 2010-11, the third samaroh was organized at Udalguri of BTAD areas of Assam on 18/12/2011 and the fourth samaroh was organised at Barpeta road of Barpeta district on 11/2/2012.
- 04. Special live coverage of last tributes to Dr. Bhupen Hazarika on 08th November, 2011 and of cremation from Judges Field, Guwahati, on 09.11.2011 from Jalukbari Cremation Ground.A series based on Dr. Bhupen Hazarika's songs was also telecast during the whole month from time to time.

DDK, Bhopal

Doordarshan Bhopal started relaying Programmes from 19th November, 1982 with installation of LPT. However, it was commissioned on 20th October 1992. This was further upgraded to a 10 KW HPT on 24th October, 1984. This transmitter was later replaced by NEC transmitter on 28th December, 2003.

At present the Kendra telecast programmes from 4 PM to 8 PM (Monday to Saturday) and from 6.30 PM to 8 PM on Sunday. The reach of DD-15 (Bhopal) is 79.2 % by population and 78.1 % by area of the State. In case of DD News it covers 37.0 % Population and 19.9 % area of the state. Apart from other programmes, the Kendra originates two Hindi News bulletins every day one of 10 minutes and another of 15 minutes duration. Although the main language of transmission is Hindi yet efforts are being made to include programmes in other dilects also besides Bagheli, Bundeli, Nimari and Malwi.

The Kendra has earned a commercial revenue of Rs. 1,75,75,500/-and Rs. 7,69,79,500/- from DCD in 2011-12.

DDK, Patna.

Doordarshan Kendra, Patna was inaugurated on 13th October, 1990 with an interim set- up at Chhajubagh, Patna. The new studio building with all the vmodern equipments and accessories was later inaugurated on 15th March, 1996.

The Kendra started its programme of one hour duration with 15 minutes Hindi News bulletin. 5 minutes Urdu News bulletin was subsequently included from May, 1992 which was increased to 10 minutes in the year 1993. A satellite Link with all the transmitters of Bihar was established in 1994. The Commercial Service for the Kendra was introduced in the year 1995. To enhance the infrastructure of the Kendra, Digital Earth Satellite Station was commissioned on 20.12.2003. At present Doordarshan is covering 93.4% of the total population. TV coverage to uncovered area is being provided through KU Band free to air DTH service of Doordarshan.

DDK, Thiruvananthapuram

Television was introduced in the state with the commissioning of a LPT on 19th November 1982 in Thiruvananthapuram. On 1st January 1985, regional television became a reality with the commissioning of a full-fledged Programme Production Center in Thiruvananthapuram. The first 10KW HPT in Kerala, set up in Doordarshan compound in Thiruvananthapuram was commissioned on 14th April 1985.Full fledged studio complex was setup on 18th March 1987. With the commissioning of regional networking on 24th October,1993 and subsequent commissioning of HPTs at Calicut and Kannur the whole of the State became capable to receive Malayalam TV signals from Doordarshan Kendra, Thiruvananthapuram.

Over the years the Kendra can take credit for several firsts in the state including the first live telecast of the inaugural ceremony of the Kendra in 1985, the first live news bulletin, the first Malayalam soap opera, the first Malayalam feature film on small screen etc. The illustrious list of programmes will be inconclusive without the latest addition to the profile the Green Kerala Express - the first Social Reality Show which received a great boost with the inauguration of the first fully automated Regional News Unit (RNU) of Doordarshan at Thiruvananthapuram on 6th September 2009. As per current content analysis, time allocation for entertainment is 31.13%, education is 35.13% and information is 33.56 %. Similarly 99.31% programmes are telecast in Local Language [Malayalam]

Total revenue earning of Kendra during 2011-12 is Rs. 22.56 Crores including Rs. 11.40 Crores from DCD.

DD Rajkot started functioning from 30th August,1984 and at present it has only one hour transmission from 5.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. (Monday to Thursday) and upto 5.30 p.m. on Fridays since 01.06.2011. All the Programmes are in-house productions in Gujarati language. It also contributes one hour programme to DD-Girnar for telecast on RLSC and also on Terrestrial Mode and RNU as and when required.

The Kendra has earned revenue of Rs.8,24,505/- from different sources during 2011-12.

Doordarshan Raipur was commissioned in the year 1977 with the installation of 1 KW HPT to telecast programmes for villagers as post SITE continuity Station. From 1.6.1987, Kendra started relaying the entire program of DDK Delhi via satellite. The Kendra started giving 90 minutes local transmission from 17.8.1998. Digital Earth station was commissioned in September, 2002 and with this the Regional service and Regional News for the Chhattisgarh state started. Kendra is relaying 4 hours Regional transmission from Monday to Saturday and 90 minutes transmission on every Sunday since 06.02.2006. The Regional News Unit, Doordarshan Kendra Raipur is telecasting daily news bulletin of 15 minutes duration at 7.00 PM since 20.09.2002. It is catering the media needs of 79.5 % Population and 69.2 % of total area of the state.

Commercial Revenue earned by the Kendra during 2011-12 is Rs.1,41,83,582/-. The Kendra also earned

revenue to the tune of Rs.50.95 Lakh towards production cost and telecast fees of the "Question Hour" during 2011-12.

At present, the Kendra produces and transmits 30 minutes Krishi Darshan Programme (Narrowcast) in local dialects like Chhattisgarhi from LPT Kanker Halbi, from HPT Jagdalpur and Gondi, and from LPT Bailadila and Narayanpur on 4 days a week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday) at 5.30 PM. The Kendra also contribute a 30 minutes programme "Bastar ke Anchal Se" to Regional Service of DDK, Raipur to be telecast on Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday at 5.00 PM. 100% of the programmes are produced in Hindi. During 2011-12, Doordarshan celebrated its Sthapana Diwas and awareness was generated among women about various diseases through Kalyani Health Club activities.

DDK (PGF), Thrissur

Doordarshan Kendra, Thrissur commenced its activities from 06th September, 2001. The Kendra conducted its decennary celebration from 29.09.2011 to 02.10.2011. The celebration includes media meet, staff meet, cultural programme, theatre sketches, workshop on various folk arts, Gandhi Kalolsavam, Karshaka Sangamam, Rural Development Meet and Exhibition.

As DDK, Thrissur is a PGF Centre, there is no independent telecast from this Kendra except 25 minutes Agricultural programmes (Narrowcast) twice a week (on Tuesday & Friday) at 05:05 PM from the LPT situated in the Kendra premises and from 5 other LPTs in different Districts. The Kendra is producing research docu-features on Mohiniyattam, Kathakali, Mudiyettu, Kalamezhuthu, Chavittunatakam, etc.

The main events of the Kendra during 2011-12 are the live telecast of Guruvayur Ekadasi Music festival and Thrissur Pooram festival.

DDK, Sambalpur

DDK: Sambalpur started its regular transmission from 30th April 1978. It is having two transmitters located on Brooks Hill which is a part of a reserve forest. At present there are two transmitters for relay of DD-1 and DD-2 programmes from 10KW power each which are fully operational since its day of up gradation in the year 2000.

General programme frequency is twice a week (Monday, Thursday) from 5.02 PM to 5.30 PM. Sambalpuri folk songs, folk dance, programmes on Eco-tourism, health & family welfare, legal awareness, sports, literature, women, children and various cultural aspects of the region are the main components of these slots.

DDK: Bhawanipatna was commissioned on 20.01.1992. The installation of Studio was done on 03.09.2000. The local transmission of this PGF Kendra started on 15.09.2004 on the occasion of DD foundation day. At present DDK Bhawanipatna transmits its own 58 minutes programme on Monday & Thursday at 5.02 P.M and 30 minutes programme on Tuesday, Wednesday & Friday at 5.30 P.M. All the programmes of this Kendra are in-house productions in Odia Language on Literature, Culture and Folk art of this Area.

DDK Bhawanipatna not only produces and telecast programmes for its own but it also contributes 30 minutes of its programmes for telecast by DDK: Bhubaneswar regularly. Further this Kendra made a tangible contribution of programmes for telecast on DD-6. This Kendra regularly sends its programmes of archival value to the Central Archives of Doordarshan at New Delhi to preserve them for posterity. DDK, Jammu

Doordarshan Kendra Jammu was commissioned as PGF in 1993. A spacious studio with digital equipment was commissioned and made functional from 2011. Doordarshan Kendra Jammu puts out a daily three and a half hour transmission except on Sunday when it puts out only one and half hour programme as National transmission continues up to 6.30 pm. It caters eight languages of the region i.e. Dogri, Urdu, Punjabi, Hindi, Gojri, Pahari, Bhaderwahi and Kashmiri.

RNU at the Kendra began with a 10 minutes news bulletin in July, 1999 and its duration was increased to 15 minutes in 2002. Another News bulletin of 5 minutes duration started from 22.08.2007. It telecast two News Bulletins in Dogri Language. Special coverage is being given

to development programmes and Flagship programmes of the state.

Revenue earning by the Kendra during 2011-2012 is 55 lacs including 35 lacs from DCD.

Major Achievements during 2011-12

- 1. Covered two day Jashan-e-Faiz at Zorawar Singh Auditorium Jammu, where almost 15 Pakistani poets and intellectuals participated.

DDK, Daltonganj

An HPT was installed at Daltonganj on 10th March, 1991 for telecast of DD programmes. Later Programme Generating Facility (PGF) was inaugurated on 25.06.1995. At present the transmission timings of the Kendra is from 5.30 PM to 6.30 PM (Monday to Friday).

DDK,Port Blair

DDK,Port Blair commenced operation from November,1982 during Asian Games with a 100W LPT relaying Delhi programmes catering to people living in 10 km radius. Another LPT came up in Car Nicobar with 100W capacity covering ten km radius. With the inauguration of a new studio, regional programme production started from February, 1996. One more 100W LPT was commissioned in March, 1997 at Port Blair for DD metro service.In addition to these LPTs, 18 VLPTs were installed in various islands to take the signals to far flung areas. Earth station came into operation in the year 2005 and in the follow up to the tsunami, it started giving news feed for network programmes.

In 2007 automatic switching unit was commissioned in Andaman and Nicobar islands so that

regional programmes can be seen from 6.00 PM to 7.30 PM on all weekdays. Two 100W LPTs were converted to 1KW HPT Transmitters in March, 2008 to increase the coverage area of DD.

There is limitation in coverage areas due to hilly terrain and heavy vegetation. This has been overcome by DTH C-band uplinking for Port Blair on INSAT 4B carrying ten channels. 1000 DTH C-band TV sets were issued to Andaman and Nicobar administration to distribute it to various departments for uncovered pockets due to shadow zone. As Doordarshan is the only Television programme production centre in these islands, it is telecasting programmes in seven different languages (Hindi, Bengali, Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, Punjabi and Nicobari).

Redesigning the popular and commercial television genre of Reality shows, DDK Port Blair has proposed to produce the first ever farm reality show to select the best farmer in Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

First time commercial revenue crossed Rs.10.0 lakhs during 2011-12 from Nil.

Activities during 2011-12:

- Live telecast of Island Tourism Festival on DD Bharati, National Channel and DDK: Portblair.

DDK, Shantiniketan

Shantiniketan is the centre of International Art & Culture, because of the presence of Visva-Bharati, the Central University founded by Nobel laureate Poet Rabindranath Tagore. The Prime Minister of India is the Chancellor of this University. It is also the home town of another Nobel laureate Dr. Amartya Sen. Shantiniketian attracts tourists for its natural beauty, calm and pollution-free environment. Programmes on Agriculture, Music, Dance & Docu-feature with the involvement of talent from Visva-Bharati, Shantiniketan & adjoining Birbhum, Barddhaman, Murshidabad & Bankura districts are produced in Bangla language.

Produced serialized programme based on Tagore's Gitanjali "Simar Majhe Asim Tumi".

DDK: Hissar

DD: Hissar was inaugurated on 1st November, 2002 for serving the people of Haryana. The initial tape system for incorporating news stories from different districts has been replaced by E-mail, FTP System which has resulted in inclusion of latest update in daily news bulletins.

Commercial earning by the Kendra from different sources is Rs. 16.0 Lakhs.

At present this Kendra produces only in-house programmes and telecast them between 5.00 PM and 7.00 PM from Monday to Friday covering Health, Education, Rural, Current Affairs, film songs and clippings, Youth, Homes, and a chunk called Puduvaikkadir (city round-up). There is no sponsored or commissioned programmed. The language of the programme is Tamil.

A chunk is allotted in DD-Podhigai on Saturdays between 1.00 PM and 1.30 PM to telecast Health and Children programmes on every fourth Thursday for 25 mts. Both the programmes are in-house productions of Doordarshan Kendra, Puducherry.

Commercial earnings from different sources by the Kendra during 2011-12 is Rs.1,67,591/- .

The Kendra since its inception is striving to promote local talent of Malwa Region.

DDK: Warangal:

Nalgonda & Karimnagar Districts in addition to its coverage in Warangal District. Doordarshan Studio was inaugurated on 14.04.2005. After the inauguration, Studio recordings started from the month of August, 2005. It is catering to the needs of the Warangal City and surrounding areas.

DDK: Chandigarh

Doordarshan Chandigarh started functioning from 3rd September 2001 with half an hour Transmission at 6.00 pm from Monday to Friday which has been enhanced to two hours (5.00 pm to 7.00 pm) from 24th April 2006. Coverage Area of the Kendra is 25km (Chandigarh & Surrounding area).

Local News Bulletins started from Doordarshan Kendra, Chandigarh with the establishment of News Unit from 24th April 2006. Now the Regional News in Hindi is being telecast at 5.45 PM on Tuesday, Thursday and at 5.30 pm on Friday and in Punjabi language at 5.30 pm on Monday and Wednesday. Hindi News Bulletins telecast on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday are also hot switched for DD News Channel under the caption "Rajyon Ke Samachar".

DDK,Nagpur

Doordarshan Kendra Nagpur came on the telecast map of India on 15th August 1982 when it started relaying programmes originated from Delhi through 1KW transmitter. The commencement of area specific programmes produced by DDK Nagpur and telecast through INSAT from New-Delhi end for districts of Nagpur, Chandrapur, Gadchiroli & Gondia started from 1983. Enhancement of transmitter power from 1 KW to 10 KW took place in October, 1985 and it started contributing programmes to DDK, Mumbai from 1988 onward. A studio was constructed in late nineties and commissioned on 20.05.1999 which has programme

production facilities. The Kendra started regular contribution to DDK, Mumbai from September, 2011. MIB has set up an up-linking facility at Nagpur. Major events of this area can be directly up-linked to anywhere in Indian Sub-continent with this up-linking facility. It has two 10 KW transmitters for transmitting National programmes & News Programmes. On first transmitter, DD-1 the National Hindi channel programmes, Regional Sahyadri programmes in Marathi and also one hour local programmes are being telecast between 1800 to 1900 hours. DD News programme is telecast on second transmitter containing News and current affairs programme. Local programmes are produced and telecast on:

All the programmes are in-house production of the Kendra, 90% of which are Information & Educational and 10% are entertainment programmes.

A liquid cooled 10 KW R & S transmitter was commissioned on 10.06.2005 in place of the transmitter meant for National programmes and it radiates excellent picture quality. Details of Commercial Revenue earned during 2011-12 from different sources is as follows:-

Doordarshan launched its free-to-air DTH service "DD Direct +" in December, 2004 with a bouquet of 33 TV channels. Capacity of DTH Platform was subsequently augmented to 59 TV channels. DTH signals can be received anywhere in the country (except Andaman & Nicobar Islands) with the help of small sized dish receive units. For A&N Islands, DTH service in C-band with a bouquet of 10 channels was started with effect from September, 2009. At present Project for upgradation of capacity of DD's DTH platform to 97 channels was approved by the Government at a cost of Rs. 75.43 crore, as a part of 11th Plan. All channels would be free and no subscription would be payable by the viewers.

Order placed for SITC of five Earth stations in North East region. These Earth stations are expected to be commissioned by February., 2012. Remaining 5 Earth stations will be upgraded by 2012. Upgradation of these Earth stations will enable the programme contribution and distribution simultaneously.

New Earth stations:

Projects for establishment of five new Earth Stations at Vijaywada, Indore, Gwalior, Rajkot & Gorakhpur have been taken up and are at the different stages of implementation.

New Initiatives

Digitalization

Doordarshan's scheme of digitalization involving an outlay of Rs. 620 crore was approved in April'10. Major projects approved, as part of this scheme are as under:

- Full digitalisation of 39 Studio centres
 (31 partially digital & 8 analog Studio centres)
- Establishment of digital HPTs at 40 places

Location of the Studios (39 nos.), which are to be fully digitalised are given at Annexure IV. Location of proposed digital HPTs (40 nos.) are given at Annexure V. Implementation of the above projects has been taken up. Studio centres are expected to be made fully digital by 2012. Digital HPTs are expected to be installed in phases during 2013-14.

HDTV:

HDTV refers to video having resolution 5 times higher than traditional television systems (Standard-Definition TV). Main features of HDTV are - Crystal clear & noise free picture; more realistic colors; wide screen picture and more viewing realism.

Following HDTV Projects are under implementation, as part of 11th plan:

- (i) HDTV Studios at Delhi and Mumbai
- (ii) HDTV Field production, Post production and Preview facilities at Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai & Chennai
- (iii) HDTV transmitters at Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai.
- (iv) Multi Camera OB van (2 nos.) for outdoor production at Delhi and Mumbai.

The above mentioned projects are at different stages of implementation and are expected to be completed by 2013, in phases.

Modernization of Studio and Transmitter equipment.

Scheme of "Modernization, Augmentation and Replacement of Transmitter and Studio equipment" involving an outlay of Rs 299 crore was approved in February, 2011. Major projects

approved as part of this scheme, are as under:

- (i) Replacement of existing old HPTs at 15 locations.
- (ii) Replacement of existing 60 LPTs by automode (1+1) 500 Watt LPTs.
- (iii) Modernization of 20 Studio centres by way of replacement of old equipments like Camera chains, Production Switchers, Logo Generators, Colour monitors etc.

PRASAR BHARATI – FINANCE AND ACCOUNTS

Accounting System & Accounts

Prasar Bharati switched over from the Government budgeting and accounting system to accrual accounting system with effect from 1st April, 2000. Pursuant to this, Prasar Bharati started receiving financial support from the Central Government in the form of Grant-in-Aid to cover part of its Revenue Expenditure (Plan & Non-Plan) and loan to cover part of its Capital Expenditure (Plan). The revenue earnings of Prasar Bharati which were required to be credited into the Consolidated Fund of India prior to its de-linking from Government budgeting system are now retained by Prasar Bharati. A part of Prasar Bharati's Operating Expenditure is met out of the revenue earnings of Prasar Bharati i.e, IEBR (Internal & Extra Budgetary Resources).

In terms of a Memorandum of Understanding signed between Prasar Bharati and the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting on 22nd May, 2000, Prasar Bharati is required to render monthly account of expenditure and receipts to the government. Annual statement of accounts is also required to be prepared and audited by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India. The accounts of Prasar Bharati certified by C&AG is forwarded annually to the Central Government to be laid in both the Houses of Parliament.

By the end of March 2012, Prasar Bharati had laid its accounts up to the year 2008-09 in Parliament. Audited accounts of Prasar Bharati for the year 2010-11 are given at Annexure-III

Proforma Accounts

Prior to Corporatization of Prasar Bharati, Doordarshan and All India Radio were preparing Proforma Accounts to reflect transactions related to their commercial activities. Special efforts were made to complete these accounts. All India Radio and Doordarshan have now completed Proforma Accounts upto 31st March, 2000. These Proforma Accounts were submitted to respective AG Offices for audit.

Taxes levied on the Corporation

Consequent upon becoming a Corporation, Prasar Bharati has been subject to various taxes by State Governments and Municipal Bodies such as property tax, enhanced tariff for power consumption, Electricity Tax, Road Tax, Entry Tax/ Octroi, etc. Due to additional liabilities on these account, Prasar Bharati is facing problems in discharging its role as a public broadcaster.

Section 22 of the Prasar Bharati Act gave exemption to Prasar Bharati from payment of Income tax or any other tax on income, profits or gains. However, Finance Bill, 2002 withdrew this exemption. As a result, Prasar Bharati became liable to pay income tax and service tax.

Income Tax

Prasar Bharati got itself registered under Section 12A (read with Section 12AA (1) (b)

of the Income Tax Act, 1961 as a charitable organization engaged in the advancement of object of general public utility. Income Tax Assessment Proceedings of Prasar Bharati for the AY 2009-10 were held during ther year. While the TDS Refunds upto AY 2009-10 have been received, the Registration of PB under section 12A as a 'Charitable Trust' was however withdrawn vide Order No. DIT(E)/12AA(3)/2011-12/1275 dated 13.02.2012 due to amendment in section 2(15) of the IT Act. Income Tax Reurn for AY 2010-11 (FY 2009-10) was filed in March 2012.

Service Tax

As regards, Demand-cum Show Cause Notice for the years 2003-04 to 2007-08, one hearing was held in Nov.2010 in the chamber of Commissioner of Service TA (CST), who advised to represent to CBEC for claiming CENVAT Credit for the relevant years. While the matter was under process, CST passed Order in May 2011 for payment of shortpaid service tax alongwith penalties and Interest accrued thereon till the date of payment to Service Tax Deptt.. In compliance thereof an amount of Rs.160.28 crore was deposited on 8.6.2011. (in addition to Rs.10 crore deposited earlier in May 2009). However, an appeal was filed with CESTAT in Aug.2011 for refund of excess amount paid to the Service Tax Deptt. Short paid service tax for subsequent three years was also deposited during July, Aug. & Sept.2011 as per details given hereunder:

The contract of M/s SK Mittal & Co. for compilation of data collected from about 600 DDOs under Prasar Bharati and filing of half yearly return was extended for a further period of one year so that there is no default in fulfilling the statutory requirements envisaged under the Service Tax Act.

Works Contract Tax on CWG works

A Notice dated 29.12.2011 u/s 59(2) was received from Trade & Tax Deptt. regarding non-deduction of TDS (WCT) in CWG works contracts. The hearings are being held in the office of VATO.Internal audit

Under the Government Budgetary System, internal audit functions were discharged by Chief Controller of Accounts, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting through its PAOs (Pay and Accounts Offices) identified for the purpose. Prasar Bharati is in the process of developing its own internal audit system. Pending finalization of its own internal audit set up, which would be possible only on transfer of posts of Accounts Personnel to Prasar Bharati, provisional arrangement has been made with the existing staff of PAOs for continuing the same system of internal audit as was being followed before coporatization of Prasar Bharati. Special Audit of 49 local DDOs in Delhi in respect of their accounts of the past 5 years from 2005-06 to 2009-10 was however got conducted by outsourcing a CA firm namely M/s NC Mittal & Co. Report submitted by the firm has been forwarded to the Directorates for compliance.

NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

1. Prasar Bharati Broadcasting Corporation of India is established as general public utility institution and fall under the category of "Not-for-Profit Organization". Accordingly, based on Generally accepted accounting practices, and Section 145 of Income Tax Act, it can follow either cash or mercantile system of accounting. Considering the organization structure and prevalent past practices and the simplicity aspects, cash basis of accounting was being adopted. As per advice of Director General of Audit Central Revenue, from 01.04.2005 the accounts are initially compiled on cash basis at field unit level and subsequently converted into accrual basis, to the extent possible based on the information collected from both the Directorates. Prasar Bharati Board however, decided to give effect to complete switch over from cash to accrual accounting at field units also. However, it would take time due to complex nature of organisational structure and lack of trained accounting staff at field units.

Bank Gurantee of Rs. 24.60 crore of M/s SIS Live was invoked. In this regard arbitration proceedings has already been started. M/s SIS live submitted their claim to the tune of Rs. 106.88 crore as per contract, 24.60 towards BG and Damages of GBP 9381,098. The amount of Rs. 106.88 crore has also been included in the liabilities. Damages claimed by M/s SIS Live are not acknowledged as liability as the Corporation has also submitted a counter claim for the amount of Rs.147.60 crore.

3. Grants received from Central Government are treated as Income, which were utilized for Capital Assets formation and other Revenue expenses.

4. Interest rate on Loan in Perpetuity granted by Government is 7% p.a. and on Capital Loan received from Government during 1.4.2000 to 31.03.2006 is 14.5% p.a and Capital Loan received after 1.4.2006 is 11.5% p.a.

5. The Group of Minister on Prasar Bharati has decided to convert the Loan in Perpetuity & Capital Loan into grant and to waive off interest there on. However, Notification in this regard is still awaited.

6. The amount of Fixed Assets transferred at book value to Prasar Bharati by the Central Government has been considered based on Chief Controller of Accounts' letter No. CCA/I&B/2002 dated 3.09.02 and is also subject of physical verification and valuation.

7. Taxation

Prasar Bharati is registered under section 12A read with section 12AA(1)(b) of Income Tax Act as Non-Profit Organization . However, the same has been withdrawn by Income Tax Deptt. from the financial year 2008-09 vide their letter dt.13.02.2012

8. Leave salary and Pension contribution are paid to Government of India as Prasar Bharati's contribution towards employees pensionery benefits as notification of transfer of employees to the Entity has not been issued.

9. Inter Office Transactions Accounts

These represent remittances in transit on the end of financial year, accordingly they are shown as such in the accounts. On a review it was noted that this and the figures under "Capital work and Progress" require immediate reconciliation. Accordingly, it has been decided to outsource the work of reconciliation, zone wise, to a firm of Chartared Accountant

for completing the work in a time bound manner, which is under process.

10. Deposit Works

Amounts received from parties for deposit work is after adjusting expenditure against such work.

11. CAG's fee for auditing of accounts of Prasar Bharti has been provided for.

12. The figures of Sundry debtors-good also includes interest component of Rs. 60.76 crore13. No provision has been made in the Accounts for doubtful debts in respect of

legal action initiated by the corporation for recovery, as the extent of doubtfulness is not ascertainable in the current situation. However, to ascertain the confirm figures of doubtful debts

reconciliation exercise is under process.

14. A special agreement was made with Organising Committee (OC) of CWG in respect of revenue sharing. Accordingly amount of Rs.15.54crore and Rs.20.58crore are receivable from OC on account of International Rights and sale of air time respectively. An amount of Rs.22.46crore is also payable to OC on account of their share from commercial revenue earned by Corporation. The net amount of Rs. 13.66 crore receivable from OC is included in the figure of Sundry debtors-good.

15. Provision for Spectrum & Space Segment Charges have been provided on estimated basis. The Group of Minister on Prasar Bharati has decided to recommend waive off the accumulated

arrears upto 31.03.2010 of Spectrum & Space Segment charges. However, Notification in this regard

is still awaited.

16. Service Tax Deptt. raised a demand cum show cause notice for Rs. 87.10 crore on account of Service tax for the period 2003-04 to 2007-08. However, as per Management assessment, an excess amount of Rs. 1.86 crore has been claimed and the matter was taken up with the Service Tax Deptt. to refund the same after allowing for corresponding CENVAT credit not availed off and gross calculation errors in the computation made by the Service Tax Deptt.

17. Income includes Service Tax compomnent as and where applicable.

18. Sch. 27 included to show the accounts of CWG seprately as per Govt. instructions.
