CHAPTER I

PRASAR BHARATI

1.1. INTRODUCTION:

Prasar Bharati **(INDIA'S PUBLIC SERVICE BROADCASTER)** is the only public service broadcaster in the country, with Akashvani (All India Radio) and Doordarshan as its two constituents. It came into existence on 23rd November, 1997 with the mandate to organize and conduct public broadcasting services to inform, educate and entertain the public and to ensure a balanced development of broadcasting on radio and television.

1.2 OBJECTIVES:

The major objectives of Prasar Bharati as laid out in the Prasar Bharati Act, 1990 are as follows:-

- i) To uphold the unity, integrity of the country and the values enshrined in the Constitution.
- ii) To promote national integration.
- iii) To safeguard the citizen's right to be informed on all matters of public interest and presenting a fair and balanced flow of information.
- iv) To pay special attention to the fields of education and spread of literacy, agriculture, rural development, environment, health & family welfare and science & technology.
- v) To create the awareness about women's issues and to take special steps to protect the interests of the children, the aged and other vulnerable sections of the society.
- vi) To provide adequate coverage to the diverse cultures, sports &games and the youth affairs.
- vii) To promote social justice, safeguarding the rights of working classes, minorities and tribal communities.
- viii) To promote research and expand the broadcasting facilities and development in the broadcasting technologies.

THE PRASAR BHARATI BOARD

Prasar Bharati is governed by the Prasar Bharati Board, which comprises a Chairman, an Executive Member (Chief Executive Officer), a Member (Finance), a Member (Personnel), six parttime Members, a representative of the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting and the Director Generals of All India Radio and Doordarshan as its ex-officio Members. The tenure of Chairman is three years subject to the maximum age limit of 70 years. The Executive Member has tenure of five years, subject to an age-limit of sixty five years. The Member (Finance) and the Member (Personnel) are whole-time members with six year tenure, subject to the age-limit of 62 years. The Prasar Bharati Board meets at least six times in a year.

THE ORGANISATIONAL SET-UP

The Prasar Bharati Board functions at the apex level ensuring the formulation and implementation of the policies of the organization and fulfilment of the mandate in terms of Prasar Bharati Act, 1990. The Executive Member functions as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Prasar Bharati.

Officers from different streams working in the Prasar Bharati Secretariat assist the CEO, Member (Finance) and Member (Personnel) in integration of the actions, operations, plans and policy implementation as well as in looking after the budget, accounts and general financial matters of the organisation.

Prasar Bharati Commercial Revenue Divisions located at Mumbai, New Delhi, Kolkata, Chennai, Bengaluru, Thiruvananthapuram, Kochi, Guwahati and Hyderabad look after all the Marketing and Revenue activities of both All India Radio and Doordarshan. An independent Central Sales Unit along with 15 main Commercial Broadcasting Service Centres looks after the marketing of broadcast time in AIR.

Prasar Bharati also has a unified vigilance set-up at the headquarters, headed by a Chief Vigilance Officer.

The DG, AIR and DG, Doordarshan head the All India Radio Directorate and the Doordarshan Directorate respectively. While the News wing of All India Radio is headed by DG: News Services Division, DG: News and Current Affairs heads the News wing of Doordarshan.

ALL INDIA RADIO

The Directorate General, All India Radio functions under Prasar Bharati. Director General is the Head of the Department and is responsible for the overall administration and supervision of the entire AIR network. In performance of his duties and functions, the Director General, AIR is assisted by officers of the following wings.

PROGRAMME WING

The Additional Director Generals in the Headquarters and in different regions assist the Director General for proper supervision of the stations. The Headquarters of the Regional ADGs are situated at Kolkata (Eastern Region), Mumbai (Western Region-I), Lucknow (Central Region-I), Bhopal (Central Region-II) and Guwahati (North Eastern Region), Chennai (South Region-I), Bangalore (South Region-II), Delhi (North Region-I) and Chandigarh (North Region-II). Another office of ADG is to be set-up at Ahmedabad (Western Region-II).

ENGINEERING WING

In respect of the technical matters, Director General is assisted by an Engineer-in-Chief and Additional Directors General (Engineering) at the Headquarters and by the Zonal Chief Engineers. In addition, there is a Planning and Development Unit at the Headquarters in respect of the Development Plan Schemes of All India Radio. For the civil construction activities, the Director General is assisted by the Civil Construction Wing (CCW) of AIR, which is headed by a Chief Engineer. The CCW caters to the needs of Doordarshan also.

ADMINISTRATIVE WING

Additional Director General (Administration) assists the Director General on all matters of the administration, while the Deputy Director General (A&F) assists in administration and finance. One Director looks after the Engineering Administration and another Director looks after the administration and financial matters.

SECURITY WING

The Director General is assisted by a Deputy Director General (Security), an Assistant Director General (Security) and a Deputy Director (Security) on the matters relating to the security and safety of AIR installations viz., transmitters, studios, offices etc. The Security requirements of Doordarshan are also looked after by these officers.

AUDIENCE RESEARCH WING

There is a Director (Audience Research) to assist the Director General in carrying out feedback studies on the programmes broadcast by various stations of All India Radio.

ACTIVITIES OF SUB-ORDINATE OFFICES OF AIR IN BRIEF

There are a number of subordinate offices of All India Radio performing the distinct functions. The broad activities of various divisions are summarised as under:

NEWS SERVICES DIVISION

The News Services Division works round- the- clock and it broadcasts over 651 news bulletins both for Home and External Services. The bulletins are in Indian languages and various foreign languages. The Division is headed by the Director General (News). There are 46 Regional News Units in AIR. The bulletins vary from region to region according to the news worthiness of national, regional and local affairs.

EXTERNAL SERVICES DIVISION

The External Services Division of All India Radio broadcasts in 27 languages i.e., 15 foreign and 12 Indian languages. These services are radiated for an aggregate duration of 72 hours daily and are projected to over 100 countries.

TRANSCRIPTION & PROGRAMME EXCHANGE SERVICE

This service looks after the exchange of programmes among the stations, building up and maintenance of sound archives and also the commercial release of prestigious recordings of music maestros.

RESEARCH DEPARTMENT

The functions of the Research Department include Research and Development of equipment required by AIR and Doordarshan, investigation and studies relating to AIR and Doordarshan, development of prototype models of R&D equipment for limited use field trials in AIR and Doordarshan network.

CENTRAL STORE OFFICE

AIR's Central Stores Office, located at New Delhi, performs the functions relating to procurement,

stocking and distribution of the engineering stores required for the maintenance of technical equipment at All India Radio Stations.

NATIONAL ACADEMY OF BROADCASTING AND MULTIMEDIA (NABM) [PROGRAMME]

The NABM (Programme) [Earlier known as Staff Training Institute (Programme)] started functioning from the Directorate in 1948; it has two main branches functioning from Kingsway Camp, Delhi and Bhubaneswar. They impart in-service training to Programme Personnel and Administrative Staff and also conduct the induction courses and short-duration refresher courses for newly recruited staff. It also conducts the examinations for administrative staff.

In addition, five Regional Academy of Broadcasting and Multimedia (RABM) of AIR are also functioning at Hyderabad, Shillong, Lucknow, Ahmedabad and Thiruvananthapuram at present.

NATIONAL ACADEMY OF BROADCASTING AND MULTIMEDIA (NABM) (TECHNICAL)

The NABM (Technical) [Earlier known as Staff Training Institute (Technical)], part of the Directorate since 1985, now functions at Kingsway Camp, Delhi. The Institute organizes Training Courses for the engineering staff of All India Radio and Doordarshan from the level of Technicians to the Superintending Engineers. It also conducts the departmental, the qualifying and the competitive examinations. There is a Regional Academy of Broadcasting and Multimedia (Technical) at Bhubaneswar as well.

CBS CENTRES & VIVIDH BHARATI SERVICE (VBS):-

There are 37 Vividh Bharati-cum-Commercial Broadcasting Service (CBS) Centres including the exclusive VB Centres. The work relating to CBS is performed in two Wings i.e. Sales Wing and Production Wing. An independent Central Sales Unit along with 15 main Commercial Broadcasting Service Centres looks after the marketing of broadcast time in AIR.

DOORDARSHAN

Director General is the head of Doordarshan who is assisted by Additional Director Generals in the Programme Wing, Engineer-in-Chief in Engineering Wing, Additional Director Generals in Administration and Finance Wings. News Wing is headed by Director General (News).

PROGRAMME WING

Like All India Radio, Additional Directors General (ADGs) looks after all aspects relating to programme conceptualization, production and acquisition at national, regional and local level. They are assisted by Deputy Directors General (DDGs) programmes. These officers belong to programme cadre of Doordarshan.

NEWS WING

The News Wing of Doordarshan is responsible for procurement, editing and production of all news and current affairs programmes broadcast on Doordarshan Channels at the national and regional level. Director General (News) heads the News Wing of Doordarshan.

ENGINEERING WING

Engineering Wing is headed by Engineer-in-Chief. He is assisted by Additional Director General (ADG) and Deputy Director General (DDG) Engineering at Directorate and at the Zonal Offices which are located at Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai and Guwahati. Engineer-in-Chief is responsible for overall maintenance of technical activities including planning, system design, project implementation, operation and maintenance, human resource and training.

ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE WINGS

The Administration & Finance Wings of Doordarshan are headed by Additional Director Generals (ADGs), who also functions as Internal Financial Advisor and they assist the Director General on all matters of general administration, personnel management, budget & plan coordination and finance. ADG is assisted by the DDGs/Deputy Directors of Administration and Finance.

CHAPTER II

PRASAR BHARATI – PUBLIC SERVICE BROADCASTER

Prasar Bharati, through All India Radio and Doordarshan, provides maximum coverage of the population and is one of the largest terrestrial networks in the world. The immense social responsibility of the Prasar Bharati – AIR and Doordarshan is in consonance with the potential of the network as it reaches vast masses of the people throughout the country. Over the years, Prasar Bharati true to its role as India's Public Service Broadcaster has been successful to a great extent in fulfilling its statutory mandate as enshrined in Section 12 of the Prasar Bharati Act.

Doordarshan and All India Radio are, perhaps, the only media that are safeguarding the citizen's rights to be informed freely, truthfully and objectively on all matters of Public interest, national or international, and presenting a fair and balanced flow of information including the contrasting views without advocating any opinion or ideology of its own. Through its various programmes, the organization has always strived to uphold the unity and integrity of the country and the values enshrined in our Constitution.

The Organization has been paying special attention to the fields of education and spread of literacy, agriculture, rural development, environment, health and family welfare and the science and technology. It has been providing adequate coverage to the diverse cultures and languages of the various regions of the country by broadcasting appropriate programmes. It has been broadcasting appropriate programme keeping in view the special needs of the youth, the status and problems of women, social justice, welfare of working classes, special needs of the minorities and tribal communities, protecting the interest of the children and vulnerable sections of society, etc.

The need for a public service broadcaster like Prasar Bharati has further increased in view of more than 800 channels that are focussing on commercial programmes only. Prasar Bharati is the only counter-balancing force in a highly commercialized electronic media environment. In fact, the ethical norms and guidelines developed by Prasar Bharati over a period of time are serving as bench-marks for the industry.

Policy initiative of Prasar Bharati Board

During 2015-16, eight meetings of Prasar Bharati Board (127th to 134th) were held. A large number of policy, financial and administrative issues were deliberated upon in these meetings with the larger objective of creating a congenial working ambience within the organization, improving its performance and lifting up its image. While decisions were taken on many of them, some are under active consideration of the Board. A few of the important decisions taken are as under:

• SITC of Studio Console and Digital Cabling at AIR stations to provide stereo recording

and broadcast.

- Relaxation of Rules for filling up the post of STS (Station Director) in the Programme Cadre.
- Up-gradation of the 4 DVBT2 transmitters, one each at the 4 metro cities, for T-2 LITE operation on PAC basis as well as the procurement of the encoders.
- Procurement of Sony XDCAM HD 422 ENG Camcorders, Recorders/ Decks and XDCAM Drive Units
- Prasar Bharati Research Fellowship Scheme to encourage research by scholars.
- Slot Sale Policy to bring in quality software, attract viewership and, in the longer run, improve the sagging image of DD and arrest its declining commercial revenue.
- W.e.f. 01.02.2016, MPEG 2 SD TV Channels increased from 64 to 80. Radio Channels have been increased from 24 to 32.
- Classical Music Channel Raagam made operational by AIR on 26.01.2016.
- Popularising AIR FM through Apps.
- Vividh Bharati on FM in 4 Metros.
- Subscription to BARC Ratings.

Activities of International Relations Division of Prasar Bharati

Major activities (2015-2016)

- 1. Conducting seminars/conferences/symposia/summits relating to various broadcasting issues in India.
- 2. Sending delegations abroad to attend trainings, seminars, symposia, summits, etc. relating to various broadcasting issues at International levels.
- 3. Arrangements under MoU with foreign broadcasters relating to:
 - (a) Exchange of programme contents, co-production of programmes,
 - (b) Training of personnel,

- (c) Participation in significant cultural, economic, political and social events, festivals and competitions,
- (d) Carriage of Doordarshan channels for foreign viewership, etc.

Memorandum of Understanding

During the year (2015-2016), the Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) were signed with the Public Broadcasters of Russia, China, Belarus, Germany and Brazil for cooperation and collaboration in the broadcasting sector in the areas of mutual interest. Adequate steps were taken for implementation of various provisions of MoUs/CEPs between countries in consultation with Doordarshan and AIR.

In order to create a cooperative platform for exchange and joint production of television programmes, a revised MoU was signed with Digital Television Russia (DTR) in Moscow by the Indian Ambassador on 24.12.2015 during the visit of our PM to Russia. A Russian Cell was also established for better Coordination and implementation of MoU between Russia.

Prasar Bharati signed MoU with CCTV (China Central Television), in Beijing on 15.05.2015 on the initiative of Chinese side during the visit of our PM to China.

MoU was signed by the Ambassador of India at Minsk (Belarus) with National State Television and Radio Company of the Republic of Belarus at the initiative of Embassy of India in Belarus during the state visit of President of India to Belarus on 03.06.2015

Deutsche Welle (DW) Germany signed a few joint understandings with DD on 23.11.2015 to further strengthen the exchange of programmes and co-production.

At the initiative of Empresa Brasil De Communicacao (EBC), Brazil through Indian Mission, Prasar Bharati signed MoU with EBC in Brasilia on 18.02.2016. A two-member delegation headed by CEO visited Brazil during February 17-21, 2016.

Exchange of Programme/Content Exchange under the provisions of <u>MOU</u>

DD has been receiving Children programmes on gratis basis from Australia Broadcasting Corporation (ABC).

A list of 21 Programmes short-listed by Doordarshan has been sent for Belarus TV on 31st March, 2016. Eleven documentaries submitted by Belteleradiocompany, Belarus have been previewed by the Programmes wing of DD and it is felt that most of these may be considered for telecast by our network.

Deutsche Welle (DW) Germany has been providing "Manthan", a science programme, on gratis basis (resulting in a big saving on the production cost), which is broadcast from DD National every week.

Digital Television Russia (DTR) provided one documentary "Amur Leopard", which was telecast on DD National channel. DD is also pursuing for effective time-slots on DTR for airing their content.

Training Programmes

As per the request received from Indian Mission in Kabul and MEA, 5 editors from Radio Television Afghanistan (RTA), Afghanistan were trained on NLE and Graphics at STI (T), Delhi. Turkish Radio Television Corporation (TRT), Turkey had invited Doordarshan to participate in the 3rd International Media Training Program" between 7-14 December 2015 held in Antalya and DD participated in the event.

VVIP visits during the year

The delegations from Vietnam, Indonesia, Belarus, Russia, Germany and Turkmenistan visited Prasar Bharati in order to sign MoUs and exchange views on subjects of mutual interest and boost the bilateral relations. Ms. Ayuna Badmeava, Dy. CEO, Digital Television Russia (DTR), Russia visited Prasar Bharati and Doordarshan. A five-member High Level Delegation from Vietnam came on 22nd July, 2015 and met the higher officials of Doordarshan Directorate. Later, they visited DDK Delhi & DD News.



Asia Pacific Broadcasting Union (ABU) and AIBD activities

AIR is one of the founder members of ABU and has contributed a lot in its various technical activities to promote the development of broadcasting in Asia Pacific region. During the ABU General Assembly held in Istanbul, Turkey, Doordarshan was elected as a member of ABU Administrative Council for a 3 year-term with effect from 01.01.2016. AIR Producer bagged ABU Award 2015 & DD Engineer got ABU prize for best technical article. Three of AIR's technical documents have been selected by ABU for publication in the ABU Technical Review.

Prasar Bharati is also very active in the activities of AIBD. NABM (T) has conducted several training courses for participants from Asia-Pacific region on behalf of AIBD.

CHAPTER III

CHANNELS AND PROGRAMMES OF AIR

The phenomenal growth achieved by All India Radio over the past eight decades has made it one of the largest media organisations in the world. Now, it has 418 stations and 606 transmitters. To meet the communication needs of the plural society that India is, the network expanded gradually imbibing new technologies and programme production techniques. Continuing with the adoption of newer technology, All India Radio's services are being digitalized.

THE OBJECTIVES

With an aim to provide information, education and entertainment, for promoting the welfare and happiness of the masses (Bahujana Hitaya Bahujana Sukhaya), All India Radio strives to:-

- a) Uphold the unity of the country and the democratic values enshrined in the Constitution.
- b) Present a fair and balanced flow of information of national, regional, local and international interest, including contrasting views, without advocating any opinion or ideology of its own.
- c) Promote the interests and concerns of the entire nation, being mindful of the need for harmony and understanding within the country and ensuring that the programmes reflect the varied elements, which make the composite culture of India.
- d) Produce and transmit varied programmes designed to awaken, inform, enlighten, educate, entertain and enrich all sections of the people.
- e) Produce and transmit programmes relating to the developmental activities in all facets including extension work in agriculture, education, health and family welfare and science & technology.
- f) Serve the rural, illiterate and under-privileged population, keeping in mind the special needs and interests of the young, social and cultural minorities, the tribal population and those residing in border regions, backward or remote areas.
- g) Promote social justice and combat exploitation, inequality and such evils as untouchability and narrow parochial loyalties.
- h) Serve the rural population, minority communities, women, children, illiterate as well as other weaker and vulnerable sections of the society.
- i) Promote national integration.

THREE-TIER BROADCASTING

To realise its objectives AIR has evolved over the years, a three-tier system of broadcasting namely national, regional, and local. It caters to the information, education, and entertainment needs

of the audiences through its stations in this country of continental dimension and with a plural society. They provide news, music, spoken word and other programmes to almost the entire population of the country, 121.0 crore as per the 2011 census. Its vast reach especially in the rural and tribal areas make it the primary and sometimes the only source of information and entertainment.

In National Service thenational programmes, which are heard on the Medium Wave in most part of the country, cater the to the first-tier broadcasting. Recently, it has started airing on Short Wave also. The regional and Sub-regional stations provide the second-tier of broadcasting giving the programmes in the regional languages and promoting regional and cultural facets. In addition, FM Channels at metros cater to the modern needs of the people primarily the youth. The Vividh Bharati has also been shifted to FM broadcasting system at 35 places. The 413 stations on FM mode set up to cater to the needs and tastes of the audiences of small towns in various parts of the country are the Local Radio stations (LRS). In the last couple of years the community radio has become very popular among different electronic media available in the country and not surprisingly All India Radio has also set-up Community Radio Service at five places in the North Eastern Region as the voice of the local tribal population.

NATIONAL CHANNEL

All India Radio offers a 3 tier system of broadcasting, namely National, Regional and Local. National Channel forms the first stage of it and was started on 18th May, 1988. The National Channel of All India Radio works as a night service from 6.50 p.m. to 6.10 a.m. the next morning. Having the whole area of India as its zone, the programme composition of the Channel has been designed to make it representative of the varied cultural mosaic and ethos of the Nation as a whole.

REGIONAL CHANNELS

Regional Channels of AIR are located mostly in the state capitals and in major linguistic-cultural regions of every state. Altogether 127 such channels are spread over 29 states and 6 UTs states and Union territories of the country. The public service broadcasting arm of AIR, the Regional Channels put out infotainment programmes with the objective of enriching the lives of their listeners. The Regional Channels, broadcast largely on the Medium Wave frequency, follow a composite programming mix. They also promote art and culture with a major emphasis on Indian classical music. Around 40 percent of the total broadcast on primary channels comprises music, which includes Classical music, light music, folk music, film music and the music of various other languages. News and current affairs programmes constitute 20 to 30 percent of the broadcast time. Radio plays and drama, health & family welfare programmes, programmes for women and children, farm and home programmes aimed at empowering rural masses are the other important segments of the primary channels. These channels being the most accessible of all the AIR channels, strive to reach their audiences in the languages most understood.

LOCAL RADIO STATIONS (LRS)

At present 87 Local Radio Stations are located across the country. These stations are catering to the local population of the area, providing utility services and reach right into the heart of the community, which uses the microphone to reflect and enrich its life. What distinguishes Local

Radio from the regional network is its down to earth, intimate, and uninhibited approach. The programmes of the local radio are area- specific. They are flexible and spontaneous enough to enable the station to function as the mouthpiece of the local community.

In the present scenario, as most of the LRS of AIR are on FM, Vividh Bharati Programmes are relayed by a majority of them besides local content. At present most of the Local Radio Stations are broadcasting for the duration of 17 Hrs. Out of which, 7 hours are Vividh Bharati relay. The content is approximately 60% local and 40% relay (Including News and other relay programmes of regional stations). Thus, serving the purpose for which they were created.

COMMUNITY RADIO STATIONS

Community radio centres were set up at 5 places in the North Eastern Region to serve the local tribal population.

FM RAINBOW

FM Rainbow channel of All India Radio was launched at a time when radio listening was declining especially in big cities. People representing the higher economic strata of the society thought it out of fashion to listen to radio programmes which, according to them, were addressing to the needs of average middle class radio-listeners. Technological improvements made in the field of sound-recording tempted the young music lovers to opt for other modes of music players because reception quality of these songs on AM mode was not as lively as it was in stereophonic cinema halls or on digital electronic equipment. FM radio filled this gap effectively by ensuring disturbance-free high quality music to its listeners. Even the presentation style of the compere on FM channel was transformed to suit the changing tastes of listeners. Inter-personal chatting style of the comperes caught the pulse of youth and allured them to come close to their radio. In its round-the-clock broadcast, the radio listeners were served with a recipe of whole new gamut of entertainment. Soon FM radio acquired the status of modern radio because it was speaking in their style and providing them the listening pleasure. The old glory of radio was restored once again at least in terms of listening percentages.

At present AIR has 413 FM transmitters across the country, by which it covers 32.50% of the area and 45.00 % of the population of the country. Out of these, FM Rainbow channel is available at 23 places i.e. at Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Kolkata, Bangalore, Lucknow, Panaji, Jalandhar, Kanpur, Kochi, Puducherry, Shillong, Kasauli, Cuttack, Kodaikanal, Tiruchirapalli, Coimbatore, Hyderabad, Vishakhapatnam, Raebareli, Jammu, Srinagar and Vijayawada. Besides this, Delhi Rainbow is also relayed fully from Mussoorie, Aligarh, and partly from Dharamshala and Bhatinda. The FM channel includes Pop music, Film songs, and Classical & Devotional music, News Headlines, etc. The advantages of FM channel over Medium Wave channel and Short Wave are:-

- * High Quality sound.
- * Stereo transmission.
- * Greater freedom from interference and noise.
- * Uniform day and night coverage.
- * Capacity to provide value-added services.

FM GOLD

FM Gold channel is on air since on 1st September, 2001 at Delhi as a niche infotainment channel with 30% of News and Current affairs component and 70% of entertainment programming. At present, FM Gold channel is available daily round the clock. FM Gold channel is available at five places - four metros i.e. Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai and Ludhiana. This additional channel gave its listeners an option to choose between the two, besides listening to other parallel running AIR and Private FM channels in the area. This channel is trying to provide information interlinked with entertainment and brings information updates on Traffic, Airlines, Railways and weather, etc.

DTH SERVICE

DTH Radio Channel is a Satellite Service meant for the listeners, who own a TV set. The DTH Service is available through the DTH platform of Prasar Bharati with up linking facilities at Todapur, Delhi. It is not a terrestrial broadcast service and DTH programmes cannot be tuned in through the ordinary radio receiver sets. DTH will cover the entire country as well as neighbouring countries. DTH is a 24 hour service broadcast digitally. The programming is planned in such a way that the repetitions are kept at a minimum.

The DTH Service provides different language channels available in every nook and corner of the country. The most significant aspect of DTH broadcast is its digital quality.

4.	Bengali	:	AIR Kolkata is the originating station. Programmes from Kolkata 'A', FM Kolkata and Siliguri are the contents of Bangla DTH channel.
5.	Telugu	:	Uplink station is AIR Hyderabad. Besides Hyderabad main station programmes, CBS Hyderabad, Vijayawada, Cuddapah, and Visakhapatnam are the other programme contributing stations.
6.	Tamil	:	Uplink station is AIR Chennai. Programmes from Chennai FM Trichy, Puducherry, Madurai, CBS Chennai, and FM Rainbow Chennai are included in Tamil DTH Channel.
7.	Kannada	:	AIR Bangalore is the anchor station. Programmes from CBS Bangalore, FM Rainbow, Dharwad, Mysore, and Mangalore are included in Kannada DTH channel.
8.	Punjabi	:	AIR Jalandhar is the main contributor of programmes of Punjabi DTH channel. Besides this, the programmes of Jalandhar B, FM Jalandhar and Chandigarh will also be broadcast from this channel.

VIVIDH BHARATI

The popular Vividh Bharati Service provides entertainment for 15 hours a day from 37 CBS-VB centres. Beside this, Vividh Bharati Service is also relayed through 65 Local Radio Stations and 100 Watt FM transmitters located across the country.

The programmes are put out from Mumbai, and other AIR VB stations relay. Regional Stations originate a few programmes at some specified timings in their respective languages.

External Services Division of All India Radio ranks high among the external radio networks of the world both in its reach and range covering about 100 countries in 27 languages. The AIR, through its external broadcasts, aims to keep the overseas listeners in touch with the ethos of India. The languages in which AIR reaches its foreign audience are English, French, Russian, Swahili, Arabic, Persian, Pashto, Dari, Baluchi, Sinhalese, Nepali, Tibetan, Chinese, Thai, Burmese and Bhasha Indonesia. The services in Hindi, Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam and Gujarati are directed at overseas Indians, while those in Urdu, Punjabi, Sindhi, Saraiki, Kannada and Bengali are meant for listeners in the Indian sub-continent.

SARDAR PATEL MEMORIAL LECTURE-2015

SARV –BHASHA KAVI SAMMELAN -2015

Introduced in 1956, the Sarva Bhasha Kavi Sammelan (National Symposium of Poets) is an endeavour to provide a creative platform to national integration and linguistic harmony through mutual interaction and coordinated presentation of the best in contemporary poetry of all Indian languages. Its uniqueness is underlined by the fact that it is the only programme of its kind wherein eminent poets from 22 Indian languages come together on one stage to offer their creative best, before the invited audience, followed by the rendering their Hindi versions translated by eminent poets. A two hour recording of this programme is broadcast on the national network of AIR on 25th January, on the eve of the Republic Day at 10 P.M. At the same time, regional language versions of this programme are broadcast from concerned AIR stations. Thus, this programme reaches across the length and breadth of the nation.

In 2005, four new languages, namely, Dogri, Maithili, Santhali and Bodo were added to the list of languages taking the total to twenty two languages. This programme is a reflection of the rich cultural and literary heritage of Indian languages, incomparable with any other programme in its status and grandeur.

During this year "Sarva Bhasha Kavi Sammelan" was organized at Nagpur on 8th January, 2016, and was broadcast on 25th January, 2016.

SANSKAR GEET

All India Radio has embarked on a special project with the lofty objective of conserving our folk legacy and heritage. India is unique for its ethno-linguistic diversity. It is a daunting task to capture her cultural mosaic in all its variegated hues. It is best reflected in the abundant and rich

folklore of its numerous regions, communities and cultures. The scintillating lyrics and tunes have a distinct flavour but are under threat of extinction. AIR, as the nation's public service broadcaster, has decided to step in and record the folklore and ceremonial songs, in their pristine purity.

AIR's project envisages recording (i) songs associated with different rituals (sanskars)-stages/ milestones in the life span of a person (ii) a variety of lok geet such as Ritu geet, Parv geet, Shram geet, Nadi geet, Vriksh geet, Sthal geet and Andolan geet and (iii) lok gaathayein (legends). This will be one of the many major achievements of AIR in preserving the cultural heritage of India for the posterity.

During the year 2015-16, around 10000 geets have been recorded; out of which 700 geets has already been received in the directorate.

The programmes are broadcast daily in the morning, afternoon and evening with average duration of 60 to 100 Minutes per day for Rural Women, Children & Youth. The Farm & Home units of AIR broadcast composite programmes on subjects like Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Poultry & Dairy farming, Fisheries, Forestry, Environment Conservation and allied agriculture activities like food and agro processing, dry and wasteland agriculture and also on segments dwelling on employment schemes, loan, insurance and training facilities, sanitation, health hygiene and nutrition etc.

AIR has expanded its agriculture broadcasts with the launch of an exclusive project on **Mass Media Support to Agriculture Extension entitled 'Kisanvani'** since February 2004, in collaboration with the Department of Agriculture & Cooperation, Ministry of Agriculture, to keep local farmers informed about the daily market rates weather reports and day to day information in their respective areas at micro level. Presently, Kisanvani is being broadcast and relayed from identified 96 AIR stations across the country. Broadcast on a narrowcasting mode, the programme is mostly interactive in content involving field based recordings of farmers and studio dial outs and dial-ins with experts and farming community which are quite popular with the target audience. The successful country-wide execution of the Kisanvani Programme has resulted in the accrual of annual revenue of Rupees Thirty Eight Croreto the department during FY: 2015-2016.

CAMPAIGN ON SAFE AND JUDICIOUS USE OF PESTICIDES

Programmes creating awareness amongst the general public and the farming community in particular, have been broadcast about the safe and judicious use of pesticides and the ways and means of minimizing pesticide residues in fruits and vegetables before consumption.

Comprehensive guidelines have been issued to the stations in this regard detailing the Do's and Don'ts for the farmers while purchasing, storing, handling and spraying pesticides. Do's and Don'ts for the consumers and citizens for minimizing pesticide residues in food items, fruits and vegetables were also highlighted by stations in their programmes.

COMPREHENSIVE WEATHER FORECASTS FOR FARMERS

Comprehensive weather forecasts of five minutes duration for farmers are being broadcast in the daily Farm & Home programmes of all AIR stations and all 96 stations broadcasting Kisanvani programmes .The daily weather forecasts coverage includes details of crucial parameters like rainfall, temperature, soil and air moisture, radiation, hot, dry, cold and wet spells including extreme events like droughts, floods, thunder storms, cyclones, hail, frost etc. so as to alert farmers and help prevent crop failures.

ENVIRONMENT

In view of its importance, wildlife and forest conservation is treated by AIR as a challenge and emphasis is given on development activities as well as social rituals. All India Radio projects the success of government initiatives, which take place in forestry, wildlife conservation and ecological balance. As such, AIR is broadcasting programmes on themes such as wildlife and animal care through its various special audience programmes.

World Environment Day was observed by stations on 5th June 2015 by mounting special programmes to create awareness about preservation of environment. Issues of social forestry, preventing land degradation and desertification, ozone hole depletion, climate change, water harvesting and noise pollution were also addressed suitably in the programming schedules. All the AIR stations are giving wide publicity to the legal factors concerning environment and forestry. These programmes are monitored regularly by the Directorate, through monthly statements sent by AIR stations.

Stations have been mounting sustained publicity to the cleanliness drive 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan' launched by the Prime Minister, focusing on the significance of both rural and urban sanitation in ensuring a cleaner environment for all.

World Toilets Day was also observed by all AIR stations on 19th November, 2015 Stations were advised to mount programmes to highlight the socio-environmental perils of open defecation and the need for toilet access for all, especially women.

FLAGSHIP PROGRAMMES OVER THE AIR NETWORK

AIR Stations broadcasting Farm and Home and Kisanvani programmes were advised to mount suitable programmes in different formats, for creating awareness amongst the farming community,

about the use of organic solid waste as manure in agriculture operations, as part of media campaign under Swachh Bharat Missions. These AIR Stations were also instructed to broadcast audio spots on the different flagship programmes of the ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare.

All Stations had been broadcasting promos in respective regional languages on the following flagship schemes of the Government.

- 1. Soil Health Card
- 2. Crop Insurance Scheme
- 3. Paramparagat Krishi Yojana
- 4. Neem Coated Urea
- 5. Use of City Compost in Farming
- 6. PM's Krishi Sinchayee Yojana.

PUBLICITY TO CROP SPECIFIC ADVISORY TO FARMERS:

Stations located in the potato growing regions were advised to mount awareness programmes for the farmers for adopting preventive measures for the fungal diseases forecast for the seasonal potato crops predicted by the Central Potato Research Institute.

Stations located in the states of Haryana and Punjab were advised to mount awareness campaigns for the farmers in view of the incidence of infestation of white fly in the Kharif Cotton Crops as per advisory issued by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare.

Radio Kisan Diwas (15th February, 2016)

Progressive farmers who got benefited by the information disseminated through the Kisanvani programme on AIR, share their experiences with other fellow farmers in their own language/ dialect. AII India Radio observes 15th February as Radio Kisan Diwas over all its stations by mounting special programmes on the occasion. Stations broadcasting Kisanvani programme hosted special invited audience programmes on the day, in February, 2016 also, by inviting senior district administration authorities, senior state agriculture department officials, university experts and selected progressive farmers.

HEALTH & FAMILY WELFARE PROGRAMMES:

WOMEN'S PROGRAMMES

Women's programmes of All India Radio cover subjects related to socio – economic development of women, Health and Family Welfare, Food and Nutrition, Scientific Home Management, Women Entrepreneurship, Education including Adult Education, Women Empowerment, and Gender Issues, etc.

Beti Bachao Beti Padhao programme was launched by the Prime Minister on 24th January, 2015. After the launch of programme DG: AIR has issued instruction to all stations to pay special

attention while planning their programmes on the popularization of Beti Bachao Beti Padhao programme. Apart from this, All India Radio broadcast a number of programmes in different formats for the welfare of girl child. Programmes of the Family Welfare Section of the stations generally aim at creating social awareness on the issues relating to female foeticide and gender discrimination and awareness about the rights and privileges of women through the propagation of legal literacy. Different traditional folk forms were also used to communicate with the rural audience.

This year the theme of the **International Women's Day** was 'Empowering Women– Empowering Humanity'. DG: AIR issued special instruction to all AIR stations to focus on the theme, while taking up women issues in their programmes. **International Women's Week** was also observed with the view of empowering women in the society.

On the basis of references received form PM Office / Different Ministries regarding problems confronting women, Programme Heads of all AIR Stations were advised to incorporate the following subjects in the women's programme.

1. To create mass awareness about publicity to the legal provisions relating to sexual crimes and punishment for violation of such provisions.

2. To create awareness in public about the problem of Transgender Community, their Human Rights issues and ability to realize those rights.

3. Programmes to create awareness against Indecent Portrayal of women in media.

4. Programmes to sensitize the masses about the legal provisions and remedies available for women under existing laws/ Regulations.

- 5. Subjects relating to women's safety including Anti Rape Bill.
- 6. Awareness against Atrocities on women.
- 7. Awareness against Trafficking of Women.
- 8. Female foeticide and infanticide.
- 9. Education & Employment opportunities.
- 10. Maternity benefits, crèche, etc. for working women.
- 11. Equal wage for equal work.
- 12. Gender discrimination.
- 13. Awareness against malnutrition.

14. Awareness regarding ban on sale of acid in view of judgment of Supreme Court.

HEALTH PROGRAMMES

Health programmes are part of regular broadcasts of All India Radio. Almost every AIR station broadcasts health awareness programmes on weekly/fortnightly basis. These programmes are

planned and broadcast as per the health requirement of the area concerned, potential out-break of seasonal diseases and as per the instructions/advice of Ministry and the Directorate General of All India Radio. All the health related issues such as awareness about disease, their causes and prevention, information about available treatment, awareness about immunization information, government facilities for the treatment of different diseases, health related government scheme are the subject matter of health related programmes. Other subjects covered in regular broadcast of health programmes include topics like right age of marriage, delay the first child, space between two children, terminal methods, maternal care, child survival, promotion of inter-spouse communication / male responsibility, neutralizing male preference syndrome, medical termination of pregnancy, promotion of institutional legal provisions, management of reproductive tract infections (RTIs) and sexually transmitted infections (STIs), Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (Regulations and prevention of Misuse) Act- 1994, breast feeding, disability, T.B, Leprosy and reproductive child health etc.

During January-February, 2016 **Swine Flu** outbroke in many parts of the country and became a serious public health problem. Directorate General of All India Radio issued instructions to all AIR stations, particularly located in Swine Flu affected areas, to mount suitable programmes to create awareness about the disease.

Similarly, when Dengue out broke in some parts of the country in the month of August, September and October, special awareness programme on prevention of Dengue were broadcast across the network of All India Radio.

Wide publicity is being given to blood donation and eye donation. Suitable programmes have also been mounted against drug abuse, tobacco consumption, illicit trafficking, AIDS and create awareness programme on the **Rehabilitation and facilities being provided to the leprosy affected persons/families.**

Awarenessprogrammes were mounted on global iodine deficiency disorders and malnutritionby All AIR stations. **Stations also mounted maximum possible suitable programmers on EBOLA, Dengue, Swine Flu, Glaucoma and Chikengunea under** "Arogaya Bharatam". Keeping in mind the slogan **"Ageing and Health",** programmes on eye care, and persons with disabilities were broadcast.

Programmes in various formats were broadcast from AIR Stations across the country to create awareness about **the adverse child sex ratio and to alter the negative mindsets leading to abortion of girl child foetus.** Publicity was also given to the Pre-Natal diagnostic techniques act and the penalties contained therein to create public opinion against violation of its provisions.

The **National Deworming Day** is an initiative focus on reducing and treating parasitic worming infection- a wide spread health issue effecting over 241 million children in India. All AIR stations were given instructions to mount suitable programmes on this serious issue of child health.

In order to improve the vaccine coverage, the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has launched **Mission Indradhanush in April 2015**. Wide coverage was given to the mission through AIR network.

On the directives/instructions received from the Ministry from time to time, programmes on the following subjects were broadcast during this year.

• Swachh Bharat Abhiyan to create awareness about cleanliness.

• Awareness amongst the general public about EBOLA virus disease in a manner that no panic is created.

- Awareness about Health Hazards of Consumption of Junk Food.
- Prevention & control of HIV AIDS.
- Awareness campaign on Mission Indradhanush launched from 7th April 2015.
- National Nutrition Week from 1st to 7th September, 2015

• World Glaucoma Day was observed on 6th March, 2016. AIR directed its stations to mount programmes in different formats to publicize the same.

In some of our special audience programmes like Rural/Women/Youth & Health, AIR has registered audience groups. These groups contribute towards spreading of general awareness on the health related subjects.

CHILDREN PROGRAMMES

All stations broadcast programmes for children on regular basis. AIR broadcast programmes from almost all its stations for children of three categories, viz. programmes for children between the age of 5 to 7 years, 8 to 14 years age and special programmes are also broadcast for rural children.

Some of the programmes are broadcast on weekly basis. Plays, Short Stories, Features, Choral Singing, Interviews; Stories from Epics etc. are part of these broadcasts.

Children's day was celebrated on 14th November, 2015 as Baal Diwas along with special children activities, stage shows and invited audience programmes were broadcast.

Programmes were planned keeping in mind the following action points:

1. Protection of rights of children particularly protection of identity of children in need of care and protection of juveniles in conflict law.

- 2. Care and support to disabled children.
- 3. Care and support to children under difficult circumstances.
- 4. Equal status of girls.
- 5. Universal access to basic education to children and more attention to girl's education.
- 6. Providing safe and supportive environment to children.
- 7. Improvement in the economic condition of family and self reliant society.
- 8. National and international cooperation for better future of the child.

9. Safe drinking water facility and sanitary means of excreta disposal.

10. Wide publicity was given to the approved "Guidelines for media reporting on children" issued by Hon'ble Delhi High Court as requested by Delhi Commission for protection of child rights.

MUSIC

All India Radio has been playing a very important role in the propagation and preservation of music in general and the rich Classical Music and Folk Music Traditions in particular. Many eminent artistes have been associated with this organization. With the initiative taken by the then Information & Broadcasting Minister, Shri B.V. Keskar, National Programme of Music, a 90 minutes feast of Classical Music was started in 1952 for broadcast over All India Radio on Saturdays from 9.30 p.m. to 11 p.m. Presently, it is broadcast on Sundays also. On the similar lines National Programme of Regional Light & Folk Music is broadcast on every 1st Thursday of the month from 9.30 pm to 10.30 pm.

In a pioneering effort and as an experimentation to harmonize the rich and beautiful Indian melodies and present them as orchestral compositions, Vadya Vrinda Unit was started in 1952 in Delhi and later in Chennai in 1975. The Vadya Vrinda Units had a number of artistes playing on different instruments which not only was an endeavour towards keeping alive and showcasing many rare instruments for posterity but also towards providing job opportunities to many artistes. It is again a matter of pride that many eminent artistes have been part of the Vadya Vrinda Units at Delhi and Chennai. Vadya Vrinda compositions of Pt. Ravi Shankar, Pt. Panna Lal Ghosh, T.K. Jayaram Iyer, Anil Biswas, Emani Shankar Shastri, H.L. Sehgal, M.Y. Kamashastri and others are preserved in the archives of All India Radio which stand as testimony to their creative excellence and mastery.

Akashvani Sangeet Sammelan is an annual music event organized all over the country featuring both eminent artistes and upcoming youngsters from the stream of Hindustani and Karnatic Classical Music. This was started in 1955 and is a very prestigious and much sought after event for both artistes and classical music lovers.

Thayagaraja Aradhana Music Festival – a live broadcast from Thiruvaiyaru, the *SAMADHI* place of Saint Thayagaraja is an annual event in the month of January.

The Trinity & other Vaggeyakara Festival is a three day event held in the month of April every year at different venues, featuring compositions of Karnatic Music Trinity – Thayagaraja, Muthuswamy Dikshatar and Shamashastry along with many other composers of post Trinity period in order to give variety of compositions to the committed and devoted listeners.

The Folk and Light Music Festival is again an annual event organized all over the country during the month of July to bring to fore varieties of Light and Folk formats across the country in all its splendor and grandeur.

With the aim and objective of serving the aficionados of Indian Classical Music for 24X7, on the Republic Day in 2016, 'Raagam', a niche' channel from All India Radio was launched. This is available on DTH as well as through Mobile app and on web streaming.

'Raagam' will offer to the vast listening public all over India and overseas a blend of Hindustani and Karnatic Classical Music, with contributions from all prominent regional Stations. Besides, broadcasting some of its rare recordings of the Old Masters as well as vibrant contemporary celebrities from the collection of Archives.

With a view to bringing in variety and enriching the content on the channel, 'Raagam' has started relaying the National Programme of Music as well as *Ravivaasariya Akhil Bharatiya Sangeet Sabha* since March, 2016.

This initiative of All India Radio is widely acclaimed and acknowledged by connoisseurs across the globe.

To scout young talents and give them encouragement AIR has been organizing the AIR music competition every year during August, in different disciplines – Classical, Light, Folk, Vocal and Instrumental and it is a matter of great pride that the present day stars in the field of music are mostly prize winners of the prestigious AIR Music Competition.

All India Radio has a time tested and much acclaimed Music Audition System in order to select artistes, grade them and offer broadcast engagements. The audition rules in vogue are available on this site. (The revised rules are being framed.)

There are four grades – B, B-High, A & Top awarded to artistes which is purely based on performance quality adjudged by a Committee of Eminent Musicians/Experts in the field. Recently, a few artistes have been awarded the National Artistes Honour, keeping in view, their seniority & contribution for the cause and promotion of Classical Music-Karnatic and Hindustani.

All India Radio has also Top Grade Western Music Artistes – Classical and Light from the Eastern Zone besides a few A Grade and B-High Grade artistes in different disciplines.

The Central Archives of All India Radio has a rich treasure of very valuable and rare recordings of Artistes preserved for posterity. These recordings are now being made available to music lovers through releases in the form of CDs as "Akashvani Sangeet"

HINDUSTANI MUSIC

Hindustani classical music is the Hindustani or North Indian style of Indian classical music. The style is sometimes called North Indian classical music or Shastriya Sangeet or Klasiki Mausiki. It is a tradition that originated in Vedic ritual chants and has been evolving since the 12th century, in North India and to some extent in Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Nepal and Pakistan. Today, it is one of the two sub-genres of Indian classical music, the other being Carnatic music, the classical tradition of South India.

The traditional popular music genre of Indonesia which is Dandut and its classical version is partly derived from Hindustani classical music, especially in the basis of instrumentation, melody, harmony, and beat. Its main instruments are Tabla and sometimes use Sitar and modernguitars. NEWS SERVICES DIVISION

The News Services Division (NSD) of All India radio has been expanding its presence across various domains with an aim to reaching diverse cross section of people. Efforts were made to use mobile technology to disseminate news to the public in their own language by launching Free AIR News SMS service. During 2015- 16, NSD has substantially increased its presence on the social media and has crossed major milestones in reaching out to audience far and wide.

NSD broadcasts 651 bulletins daily in 91 languages/ dialects in Home, Regional, External and DTH Services. The total duration of these bulletins is 56 hours. 346 news headlines are put up per hour on FM mode from various AIR stations. NSD broadcasts 179 news bulletins from headquarter Delhi every day which work out to 21 hours 42 minutes.

NSD carried important stories and discussion programmes including programmes on Budget session of Parliament, Rail and General Budget and Bihar Assembly Election- 2015. The economic topics covered include Atal Pension Yojana, Insurance protection for labourers in the unorganised sector, Housing for all by 2022, Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana, central assistance to mitigate the sufferings of farmers, especially cane growers, hike in minimum support price of agriculture produce. Programmes were also mounted on measures to check price rise of pulses and other essential commodities. 16 language units of NSD carried stories on specific topics in its centrally originated bulletins and issues relating to respective states.

REGIONAL NEWS UNITS

All India Radio's 46 Regional News Units (RNUs) play a vital role to cater to the information needs of the people. RNUs broadcast bulletins and programmes in 76 regional languages/ dialects to make news region-specific and people friendly. Each state has at least one RNU and bigger states have up to four RNUs for effective coverage of all events in the state. The RNUs originate 530 bulletins every day for a total duration of about 35 hours that includes regional, external, DTH services, FM headlines and News on Phone. RNUs also mount 1076 news- based programmes in a month for a total duration of nearly 140 hours besides broadcasting special programmes when State Assemblies are in session.

FM Headlines serve immediate needs of listeners during their daily busy schedule in cities and towns. At present 250 headline bulletins in 16 languages are being produced by RNUs. Also, News on Phone (NOP) service is available from five RNUs- Mumbai, Bangalore, Thiruvananthapuram, Jaipur and Raipur giving them hourly update of important events.

RNU of All India Radio started functioning at Sambalpur in Odisha on 23rd January, 2016. This 46th RNU aired its first ten minute news bulletin in Sambalpuri language at 8.15 pm. With this, the number of languages and dialects, in which AIR broadcast its news bulletins have gone up to 92. The Sambalpuri news particularly caters to the needs of the people of Western Odisha. Secretary, Ministry of Power, Shri P. K. Pujari and Director General (News), All India Radio, Shri Sitanshu Kar addressed the inaugural function.

The RNUs of AIR Guwahati and Shillong gave wide coverage of SAF games in their respective regional bulletins. Considering the magnitude of the event, extra manpower from NSD was deputed both at Guwahati and Shillong for smooth coverage. Daily stories and Voice cast with

players bytes, sound effects were filed for NSD and regional bulletins. Medal tally was updated from time to time to give latest figures. Regular pictures and tweets of the opening/ closing ceremonies and winning moments were promptly uploaded on social media. The two RNUs too gave pre-publicity to the event.

RNUs have about 90full- time correspondents/ editors (including Seven non-RNU Correspondents) working across the country. In addition, services of 515 Part Time Correspondents (PTCs) at district level are being utilized to get news stories from remote areas. They are provided guidance and professional support by regular correspondents and editors in the RNUs. With a view to strengthen the professional skills of PTCs for better quantitative and qualitative output, NSD organizes orientation workshops for them from time to time.

Extensive planning was made by NSD and RNU Patna for comprehensive coverage of Assembly Elections of Bihar. RNU Srinagar made contingency plan to inform people about flood threat by broadcasting additional bulletins. RNU Chennai did a remarkable job through its broadcasts during the floods in Chennai caused by heavy rains which was well appreciated by the mainstream media. RNUs also gave wide publicity to various social and developmental schemes launched by the government from time to time. On completion of one year of the Central Government, a comprehensive coverage was given to major initiatives by RNUs. The modified SBG (2015-16) for RNUs was Rs.18.19 crore.

REPORTING UNIT

Reporting Unit covered diverse news events and happenings during the period. New initiatives like Skill India, Digital India, MUDRA, Gold Monetization, launch of Sovereign Gold Bonds, Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchai Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Fasal Beema Yojana, and Prime Minister's Mann Ki Baat were covered extensively on All India Radio. Special Correspondents were sent abroad for extensive coverage of President, Vice President and Prime Ministers visits. These included President's visit to Sweden, Israel, Palestine and Jordan, Vice President's visit to Indonesia, Cambodia, Laos, Brunei and Thailand. Prime Minister's visit to France, Germany and Canada, his participation in BRICS Summit at UFA, Russia, his visit to Central Asian Countries of Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan, Kyrgyzstan Kazakhstan, United Nations General Assembly, G-20 Summit at Antalya in Turkey and ASEAN-India and East Asia Summits at Kuala Lumpur were widely covered in AIR's bulletins. India-Africa Forum Summit held in New Delhi was also covered prominently. Prime Minister's participation in Climate Conference at Paris, State visit to Singapore, India-Russia annual summit at Moscow, inauguration of new Parliament building at Kabul and visit to Lahore was also given suitable coverage.

Besides, Monsoon, winter and Budget (first part) Sessions of Parliament, Special Session of Delhi Assembly, 125th birth anniversary of Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru and birth centenary of Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay were other important news events covered by the Reporting Unit.

TALKS AND CURRENT AFFAIRS UNIT

The Talks & Current Affairs Unit has been assigned to broadcast analytical news based programmes on various topics. The idea is to help the listeners understand major news developments, put things in perspective and deal with a subject in detail. The following topics were discussed extensively in Current Affairs, Spotlight/News Analysis, Samayiki, Money Talk, Vaad Samvaad, Countrywide, Surkhiyon Se Pare, Public Speak and Charcha Ka Vishay Hai programmes.

Important programmes broadcast include, Pathankot terror attack, Measures to transfer new technology to farmers, Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana, Start-Up India, India-Pakistan Talks, Prime Minister's Development Agenda for North East, Restructuring of Central Board of Film Certification, Sufism in India, etc.

In the live bilingual programmes in Hindi and English NSD broadcast discussions on Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana, Role of Citizen and Community and Swacch Bharat Mission, New Crop Insurance Scheme, Atal Pension Yojana for Informal Sector Workers, Make in India week, Women's Rights, Real Estate Bill and Consumers Interest, Participation of People in Water Management and Conservation, People's Participation in Climate Preservation, Accessible India Campaign. Interview of eminent personalities were also broadcast. These include, AIIMS Director, Union Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas, Dharmendra Pradhan, Union Agriculture Minister, Radha Mohan Singh, Arvind Panagariya, Vice Chairman, NITI Ayog, Union Minister of Law and Justice, D.V. Sadananda Gowda, Union Minister of Human Resource Development, Smriti Zubin Irani, to name a few.

Special live bilingual programmes were mounted on presentation of Railway Budget and Budget2016.

Programmes 'Issues Before Parliament' in English and 'Sansad Ke Samaksh Mudde' in Hindi were broadcast on the eve of Budget session of Parliament.

MANN KI BAAT PROGRAMME

Seventeen episodes of Hon'ble Prime Minister's radio address to the nation have been done successfully by NSD, AIR. For Mann Ki Baat programme, Mann Ki Baat live webcasting is done on website newsonair.nic.in. Special window and page is created for the purpose. LIVE tweeting is done through the NSD's twitter account *@airnewsalerts*; addresses were being LIVE tweeted in English and Hindi Languages. The audios of programme are uploaded on Soundcloud soon after the broadcast.

MONITORING UNIT (ENGLISH/HINDI):

Monitoring Units Hindi and English of NSD: AIR is an important source of news on developments around the globe. The units monitor world radio/ TV stations like BBC, VOA, ABC, CRI, NHK, Sputnik, IRIB, Radio Pak, Al Jazeera. A special watch was kept over Radio Pakistan to counter anti India propaganda. The unit is always ahead of the news agencies to file the stories or developments of the globe. One of the important functions of the units included compilation of special expedition bulletins during mountaineering period after receiving inputs from the Met Office.

The unit regularly contributed important news items for inclusion in AIR news bulletin broadcast in its home, regional and external services. Some of the important coverage's on the international front included stampede in Mecca, Fighting in West Asia, US Presidential elections, North South Korea tension, Developments in SAARC nations and other neighbouring countries, EU refugee crises, Iran nuclear programme, important debate at the United Nations as well as European Union, international sports events etc.

The reporters also covered verbatim proceedings of Consultative Committee Meetings attached to the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting held during the year reported upon.

REFERENCE UNIT

Reference Unit supplies prior information about the various activities/ programmes of the government and political parties on daily basis to various units of NSD, AIR. The Unit is headed by a Deputy Director (News). Reference unit also deals with Library activities and feeds GNR/HNR with referral and computerized back- up facility. It deals with backgrounders, biographies, analysis of news bulletins and letters from the listeners etc. The Unit brings out a diary of forthcoming events every day and has a library with over 20,000 titles. Out of the total collection, it has about 800 books on mass media and broadcasting. The Library subscribes to about 26 newspapers and 52 magazines.

IT UNIT

The IT unit maintains and updates the NSD official website *newsonair.nic.in*. The social media platforms Facebook, Twitter and Sound cloud functions under this unit. The nationwide AIR's free SMS service is carried out by IT unit. NSD's AIR News mobile App is being maintained and upgraded by this unit.

Various National-International, sports, business news besides news based programmes, Features and Special programmes are uploaded on the website. Audio and text of news bulletins from NSD and Regional News Units are carried on the website. The Audio and text for Independence Day Address of PM, President's Addresses on eve of Independence Day and Republic Day, Union Budget, Railway Budget etc. were uploaded on website. Live webcasting of Mann Ki Baat programmes were mounted on NSD website through special window.

FACEBOOK AND TWITTER:

NSD has made its impressive presence on social media. Likes for NSD's Facebook page have crossed 27.7 lakhs. In terms of reliability on scale of 5, it has scored a massive 4.5 points with over 22000 reviews. NSD's official Twitter handle *@airnewsalerts* has crossed 8.1 lakh followers. LIVE tweeting is done on special events and awareness campaigns such as presentation of Rail Budget, Economic survey, General Budget and celebration of International Yoga Day and Rashtriya Ekta Diwas.

The official Twitter account of NSD, AIR *@airnewsalerts* had live tweet on the Bihar election results to keep the general public awareness up to date. The hash tag used by AIR News #Bihar Results had set the top Twitter trend in India during elections.

NEWS ON SMS

1. SMS service in English was launched on 9 September 2013. The service is now available in 16 languages. The number of people registered for this service has now reached over 10 lakh. NSD has been providing National/International news headlines in 16 languages namely:- English, 2.

2. Hindi, Gujarati, Assamese, Tamil, Malayalam, Marathi, Dogri, Sanskrit, Nepali, Bengali, Odia, Urdu, Punjabi, Arunachali and Kashmiri to the people through SMS.

3. LIVE news updates through SMS are sent during special events.

NSD WEBSITE

1. The IT unit maintains and updates the NSD official website newsonair.nic.in. Various National, International, Sports, Business News besides News based programmes, Features and Special programmes are uploaded on the website.

2. Audio and text of news bulletins from NSD and Regional News Units are carried on the website. The Audio and text for Independence Day Address of PM, President's Addresses on eve of Independence Day and Republic Day, Union Budget, Railway Budget, etc. were uploaded on website.

3. Live webcasting of Mann Ki Baat programme is done on NSD website through special window and page apart from uploading audio and text of programme on the website.

4. Links or NSD social media platforms are provided on website.

5. The download facility of AIR News Mobile App for Android phones is also available on website.

6. Live webcasting of PM's Mann Ki Baat programme, Independence Day, Republic Day, Budget and Election coverage

7. Awareness programmes carried on website- International yoga day, online services for voters, Coverage of campaigns such as Rashtriya Ekta Divas, Vigilance awareness week, Do's and Don'ts during Earthquake, News policy for broadcast media, Guidelines for coverage of Elections by AIR and Doordarshanand many more.

THE AIR MOBILE NEWS APP

To cater to the needs of moving population AIR app was launched. Listeners can listen to their news and news based programmes on their mobile phone. App is available on internet free of cost.

BUDGET

The final budget grant for 2015-16 under non plan head was Rs.27.69 crore only and under IEBR head (PP&SS) was Rs.20.81 crore only. The final budget grant (2015-16) for RNUs was Rs.16.98 crore only.

STAFF POSITION

News Services Division is having sanctioned strength of 516 posts out of which 279 posts are lying vacant in various cadres of NSD. The sanctioned strength of RNUs in the editorial cadre is 122 of which 88 are in position and against a 120 sanctioned posts of Newsreader cum translator

81 posts are vacant. The multiple activities of NSD, AIR are however being managed by engaging contractual staff/ Casual assignee etc. as per policy/ guidelines issued by Prasar Bharati Secretariat.

ADMINISTRATIVE WING

CVC guidelines are strictly followed in the posting of various staff on the sensitive posts. For transparency in the day to-day work of administration and accounts, a file tracking system is in operation. All 127 RTI replies were processed within the time limit as prescribed in RTI Act 2005. No order/judgement from the Hon'ble CAT for the cases being defended by NSD has been received till date for implementation for the corresponding period. Various orders issued by Department of official language are given due weightage for the implementation of official language Hindi. Guidelines issued by the government for welfare of SCs/STs/OBCs and minorities are being followed. An Internal Complaint Committee for women is working in NSD to address problems of women staff members. Officers are nominated for various training programmes initiated by the Ministry of I&B on regular basis.

COMMERCIAL WING OF AIR:

The Commercial Wing of the All India Radio is bestowed with the responsibility to generate revenue. AIR has witnessed the fast-changing scenario in the field of radio broadcasting during the last few years and the Commercial Wing of All India Radio through its Central Sales Unit at Mumbai, 15 main Commercial Broadcasting Service Centres located in different parts of the country, 10 Commercial Revenue Divisions(CRDs) at Mumbai, Delhi, Chennai, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Kochi, Thiruvananthapuram, Guwahati and Jalandhar has been successful in

keeping the pace with these changes and able to augment the overall commercial revenue of the organization year-after-year besides maintaining its basic identity as a Public Service Broadcaster.

A prescribed Code of Conduct governs the programmes as well as commercials broadcast on All India Radio. While strictly adhering to the Broadcast and Commercial Codes and facing budgetary and staff constraints at almost all the AIR Stations including CBS Centres, Vividh Bharati Stations and FM Channels, Commercial Wing has been able to procure business from major corporate clients/advertisers as well as Government Departments and the PSUs.

Some of the major initiatives undertaken towards revenue enhancement:-

In launching of an All India toll free No.15102 CBS, Ahmedabad generated additional revenue. CBS Bangalore and Primary Channel, Lucknow generated additional revenue on account of Cricket World Cup. CBS, Mumbai generated from Mann Ki Baat. CSU website was revamped.

Started on-line booking of advertisements and registered M/s Release My Ad as the first virtual advertising agency of AIR and also introduced new canvassers Grant of Registration status to new Agencies, Grant of Accreditation status to Registered Agencies. Recruitment of Marketing Executives in all 15 CBS Stations and CSU, AIR, Mumbai is also under consideration. R.K. Talib Award was given to the Best CBS Station. Several steps were taken to augment revenue generation. Targets were fixed for all Radio Stations.

MARKETING DIVISION

The overall revenue generation of Prasar Bharati has been growing remarkably ever since Marketing Divisions came into being way back in late 1990's. The first Marketing Division was established in Mumbai and at present Marketing Divisions are also functional at New Delhi, Chennai, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Guwahati, Kochi, Thiruvananthapuram and Jalandhar. All these divisions working towards generating commercial revenue for All India Radio have been renamed as Commercial and Revenue Divisions.

Commercial and Revenue Divisions of Prasar Bharati function as key flashpoints between the entire media market and the programming link to ensure that the best market practices are also taken forward on Radio and Doordarshan in a progressive manner. The planned, strategic and aggressive marketing methodology of these Divisions is contributing immensely to the overall

revenue generation of Prasar Bharati. A single window facility for all the channels of All India Radio and Doordarshan, CRDs cater to all the needs of advertising.

Some of our major clients include Ministry of Agriculture, Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation, Ministry of Minority Affairs, Ministry of Rural Development, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Directorate of Income Tax, Ministry of Human Resource Development, National Disaster Management Authority, Ministry of Home Affairs, Registrar General of Births and Deaths, DOPT, PCRA, BSNL & Private clients such as Coca Cola, Airtel, Vodafone, Pepsico, Glaxo SmithKline Health Care, Maruti Suzuki, Jindal Steel and Power Ltd., AIRCEL & Horlicks, etc.

Association of the Prime Minister of India with All India Radio through the programme Mann Ki Baat has not only given a boost to AIR's image but is also giving us good revenue. This year's highlights also include earning good revenue from State elections of Bihar and adding new private clients to our kitty such as Telenor, Apollo Tyres, HPL, Zee Media,V-Mart, SRL Diagnostics and JK Cement to name a few.

This year's achievements include successful marketing of Cricket events viz. India-Australia series, Asia Cup-2016 and ICC T-20 World Cup 2016. During the year 2015-16, the revenue earned by CRD Delhi, for All India Radio was 250 Crore against a given target of Rs.230 Crore.

TRANSCRIPTION & PROGRAMME EXCHANGE SERVICE:

CENTRAL ARCHIVES OF ALL INDIA RADIO

The Transcription Service was started on **3rd April, 1954** and entrusted with the main function of preparing transcription of speeches of all dignitaries with a special reference to the Presidents and Prime Ministers of India. This unit was also performing the duty of the processing of vinyl disc labelled 'AIR-TS records' for preservation of recordings for future broadcast. The nomenclature of the Service was changed to "Transcription & Programme Exchange Service" from **1st April, 1959** and the office was placed under the independent charge of a Director. As the processed records eventually proved uneconomical, the processing was closed down in June 1967 and new modes of preservation like analogue magnetic tapes etc. came into use. Informal archiving had been there in the country and this unit took this job later as an organized activity.

RELEASE FROM AIR ARCHIVES:

All India Radio got the opportunity to record, broadcast and preserve the renditions of all the major musicians over a period of time. Today it has a rich repertoire of Indian Classical Music, both in Hindustani and Carnatic. Since April 2003, AIR Archives has started releasing selection from its precious music collections under the banner 'Akashvani Sangeet'. So far 85 music albums have been released from the Central Archives. Sales counters were opened in 100 AIR stations and many of the Doordarshan Kendras. In addition, released albums are also available with a retail music stall in Dilli Haat, New Delhi.

CURRENT ACTIVITY

After completion of screening, selection, audio quality improvement and finalization, Gurbani, and Christian Carols are ready for release.

Simultaneously, screening, selection, audio quality improvement & finalization of a CD comprising Hamd, Naat & Manqabat is going on.

Screening, selection, audio quality improvement and finalization process in respect of Audio CDs of different artistes and audio programme forms are a continuous process.

NEW MARKETING STRATEGIES

AIR has been releasing authentic and original archival music under the banner of "Akashvani Sangeet". But due to lack of proper online and other modes of publicity, its availability in the market is not noticeable. In view of this lacuna, various options are being examined for the benefit of maximum marketing exposure to ensure proper delivery and prompt payment.

SOUND ARCHIVES

The Sound Archives of All India Radio can be called the National Audio Archives of the nation as it is the largest audio library of Indian Music recordings.

The library preserves voice recordings of eminent personalities, freedom fighters and national leaders. Besides, award-winning radio dramas, features, documentaries and memorial lectures are available in the library. The library also contains recordings of all the Presidents and Prime Ministers of India.

DIGITAL SOUND ARCHIVES

Transcription & Programme Exchange Service (T&PES) has taken up a mega project of digitizing all the analogue content. A special project was launched to digitize all Archival recordings in 2001

and the project is still continuing. By this Akashvani has become one of the major digital libraries in the broadcasting network with internationally accepted norms. Programme transferred so far into digital medium is 25300 hours approximately.

RADIO AUTOBIOGRAPHY

In the category of Radio Autobiography, recordings of eminent personalities from various walks of life are preserved. The Central Archives of All India Radio is a rich repository of priceless recordings of Radio Autobiographies of renowned musicians, public figures, litterateurs etc. like Sh. J.R.D Tata, Ustad Ali Akbar Khan, Sh. Harivansh Rai Bachchan and Dr. Verghese Kurien. Recently, eminent personalities like Pt. Hari Prasad Chaurasia, Sh. Ameen Sayani, Dr. Kedarnath Singh and Shri K.G. Subramaniyamhave been recorded. To enrich the collection further, the Central Archives is planning to record the luminaries from different walks of life.

PROGRAMME EXCHANGE UNIT (PEU)

The main purpose of this unit is to exchange good quality audio programmes among the stations as per their requirements. In PEU Library approx. 8000 tapes containing the recordings of music and spoken word programmes along with Radio Serials and Lessons on Languages and Community Singing Songs are used for this purpose.

Transcription & Programme Exchange Service has been allotted a fixed chunk between 1110 hrs and 1215 hrs on RN Channel for transmitting programmes to all AIR stations. These include programmes from Sound Archives, Programme Exchange Library, and also those contributed by stations. Programme Exchange Library circulates radio serials which are produced under software development projects of PP&D unit of DG: AIR to identified radio stations. Moreover, a monthly chain play produced by the Central Drama unit of DG: AIR is also circulated to identified radio stations after being fed through regular RN channel chunk.

TRANSCRIPTION UNIT

One of the important functions of this unit is to transcribe the recordings of speeches delivered by the President and the Prime Minister and preserve them in the form of volumes in chronological order. It is obligatory on the part of AIR stations to record all the speeches delivered by the President and the Prime Minister in public functions. The bound volumes of all such transcriptions were prepared and kept in the Archives. All the speeches of President and Prime Minister are preserved in CD form with detailed data entry.

REFURBISHING UNIT

In order to refurbish the vintage music recordings in Archives, this unit was installed some years back with the assistance of the United Nations Development Programme. Hundreds of hours of recordings of music and voice of Mahatma Gandhi, Pandit Nehru and others were refurbished here. At present this unit takes care of enhancing the audio quality of the recording to be released by AIR and Doordarshan Archives.

RELEASE OF RAM CHARITRA MANAS CD ON 31ST AUGUST, 2015

HIGHLIGHTS DURING APRIL 2015 TO MARCH 2016

EXTERNAL SERVICES DIVISION (ESD):

A. BRIEF INTRODUCTION

The cardinal role played by International/External Broadcasting as an instrument of Foreign Policy and Public Diplomacy needs no elaboration. Nations attach great importance to international broadcasting as a means of projecting their image and point of view abroad.

Due to its colonial link with England, broadcasting came almost simultaneously in England and India. Shortly after BBC started its first foreign language broadcast in Arabic in 1938, All India Radio entered the domain of external broadcast on 1st October, 1939 purely as a tool for propaganda for the Allies during the World War II with a service in Pushto language to counter the German Radio Blitzkrieg in the region and supplement the efforts by the BBC in this part of the world. At the dawn of Independence, ESD had to don a new avatar as the voice of an emerging nation, an old civilization, a tool for diplomacy and also effective propaganda machinery at the time of crises.

Since then,ESD has been a vital link between India and the rest of the World, especially with those countries where the interest of India are intertwined because of Indian population staying in those countries. Indians, who left their home decades ago in search of better life today live on every part of the globe and are still interested to know what "The Country of their birth" holds for them. Naturally External Services Broadcast has been projecting the Indian point of view on matters of national and international importance through its various programmes.

ESD ranks high among the External Radio networks of the world both in reach and range covering about 100 countries in 27 languages. An external broadcast aims to keep the overseas listeners in touch with the ethos of India. The languages in which AIR reaches its foreign audience are English, French, Russian, Swahili, Arabic, Persian, Tibetan, Chinese, Thai, Burmese, and Bhasha Indonesia. The services in Hindi, Bangla, Tamil, Telugu, Malayalam, Kannad and Gujarati are directed at overseas Indians, those in Urdu, Punjabi, Sindhi, Saraiki, Sinhala, Bangla and Nepali are meant for listeners in the Indian sub-continent and immediate neighbourhood. ESD follows a composite pattern that generally comprise of News Bulletins, Commentaries, Currents Events and Review of the Indian Press. Besides Newsreel, Magazine Programmes on sports and literature, talks and discussions on social economic, political, historical, scientific and cultural subjects, features on developmental activities, important events and institutions, classical, folk and modern music of India's diverse regions, form a major part of total programme output.

The dominant theme of all programmes in External Services Division is to present the reality of India as a strong secular, democratic, republic which is vibrant, forward looking and engaged in the task of rapid economic, industrial and technological progress. The facts about India's large technical manpower and its achievements and ecological balance are put across in easy and simple parlance.

Similarly, India's faith in non-violence, its commitment to universal human rights and international peace and its contribution to the creation of a new world economic order are frequently discussed. ESD continues to supply recordings of music, spoken word and composite programmes to about 25 foreign broadcasting organizations under the existing Cultural Exchange Programmes, in addition to this External Services Division continues to beam all across the globe commentaries on contemporary and relevant issues and press reviews in all its transmissions.

B. NEW INITIATIVES AND MODERNISATION EFFORTS

REVAMPING:

(1) Revamping and strengthening of ESD services particularly Nepali, Tibetan,Baluchi, Dari, Pushto, Sindhi and other services targeted to Af-Pak region have been initiated.

Programmes on perception management and countering anti-India propaganda are also broadcast regularly by different ESD services and particularly those services targeted to the Sub-Continent.

- (2) Steps have been initiated to strengthen the Talks Unit of the ESD to enable it to produce more area- specific news and current affairs based programmes.
- (3) A multi-media website with Live Internet Radio and Radio on Demand components at par with other international broadcasters has been launched for ESD which would go a long way to make ESD services available across the globe and particularly to the areas where the service was not reaching hither before.
- (4) Steps have also been initiated to start Live Internet Radio for all the 27 ESD services which will enhance its access globally. In this context, live streaming of five ESD services viz. GOS, Urdu, Hindi, Bangla and Nepali have been launched this year while the remaining services are in the pipeline.
- (5) A massive digitization work for all recordings of archival value has been initiated wherein about 20,000 tapes in different Indian and foreign languages have been digitized in a time bound manner and the remaining digitization work is under progress.
- (6) ESD has also taken steps towards computerizing all the foreign language units to slowly move towards a paperless system.
- (7) ESD has started using the other social media platforms like Facebook, Twitter,Whatsapp, etc. for propagation of its programmes and making them more interactive in nature. Whatsapp based request programme has been introduced in Urdu Service which is getting responses from all over the World.

C. <u>REVIVING CO-OPERATION AND CO-ORDINATION WITH MEA:</u>

To foster a greater understanding of India abroad, particularly in view of India's ever growing stature through the medium of Radio, recently steps have been taken to revive the coordination and cooperation with the MEA (XP Division in view of the commonality of purposes of XP Division of MEA and ESD, AIR)

NATIONAL ACADEMY OF BROADCASTING & MULTIMEDIA (NABM)

National Academy of Broadcasting & Multimedia (Programme) hitherto known as Staff Training Institute (Programme), is the apex training institute of Prasar Bharati, it is located at Kingsway Camp, Delhi, which is responsible for training of in-service Programme and Administrative personnel working at various stations /offices of All India Radio and Doordarshan. It was declared a subordinate office of DG, AIR, New Delhi on 1st January, 1990. Subsequently, six Regional Training Institutes namely, NABM (P) Bhubaneswar and RABM (P) s at Ahmedabad, Hyderabad, Lucknow, Shillong and Thiruvananthapuram came into existence in different zones covering the entire country with a module to impart training to the staff of AIR & Doordarshan. The Regional Training academies are controlled by NABM (P), Delhi for coordination of various training programmes. In order to expand the organization's potential; it was decided to rename the Staff Training Institute at Delhi & Bhubaneswar as National Academy of Broadcasting and Multimedia (Programme) w.e.f.7th April, 2015. It is proposed to make the training institute a centre excellence in the field of broadcasting and open it for outside channels so as to earn revenue for Prasar Bharati.

I: Induction Training Programme

Genesis

Creativity is harbinger of inherent imagination and innovation

Today contemporary and constantly shifting media industry prefer individuals, who can tap, understand, analyze and challenge the inherent creativity and come up with fresh and innovative interpretations. Induction Training matrix is devised with a vision to effectively capture and unravel this inherent creativity and to acquaint them with the Basics of Radio & TV production. It is driven by hosts of ubiquitous concepts and designs which come together to identify and enhance potential, capability, capacity and creativity and equip them to meet the challenges of changing media landscape.

In consonance with this vision, new incumbents of AIR and Doordarshan in the cadre of

Programme Executive, Transmission Executives, Production Assistants and Engineering Assistants are subjected to comprehensive and multi-modal training methodology at NABM in Delhi and Bhubaneswar.

Nine -Week module

Six - week theory and three- week practical training, both in Audio & Audio- visual medium have been specifically designed to give exposure to the appropriate vocational, practical and theoretical learning in broadcasting. A strong emphasis on programme production (content and technique) is present throughout the course, which addresses all facets of production and operations. The first three days are primarily an introduction to the organization and media world in general. Two weeks thereafter are Radio specific& subsequent three weeks cater to the TV related subjects. After this three weeks practical training is imparted both in Audio and Audio-Visual programme productions. The first three days and the last three weeks offer a common training platform to both programmers and engineers. Diversified approach is employed throughout on shaping Prasar Bharati workforce as media professionals with an understanding of all aspects of Radio and Television production, at the same time transforming them into responsible and independent Public Service Broadcasters.

The entire Induction Training Programme is primarily dependent on two components



The theory component of ITP spreads over wide range of topics in both audio & audio-Visual medium. Both medium are further diversified into



In the beginning trainees are imparted knowledge on all these aspects of production and planning in both Radio and TV. Through familiarization and comprehensive teaching on plethora of subjects, they are given opportunities to translate the learning by independently producing programmes in different genres of Radio/Television.

Preview and review is an essential part of this phase, where participants are asked to critically analyze the programmes produced by them and submit feedback at the end. DDG (Programme), Course Director and other faculty members present in the session make a threadbare analysis of the programme and offer valuable suggestion to the trainees for the qualitative improvement of the programme produced.

Conclusion

At the end of Nine weeks exhaustive and elaborate training programme, the trainees are trans-

formed and well equipped to undertake the challenges associated with the media world.

2:- In-house Training Courses for AIR & DD staff

NABMs and RABMs of Prasar Bharati aim towards creating an effective workforce by developing competence, expanding horizon and sharpening the inherent prowess by planning and executing courses which are appropriate, useful and relevant. The courses are designed with a vision to foster and facilitate the attributes of the staff and also to increase awareness and equip them to meet the challenges of changing times vis-a-vis media. These workshops are meant for Programme and Administrative staff of AIR & Doordarshan. Combined courses for Programme, Engineering & Administrative Wings are also organised in order to achieve the goal of close coordination and cooperation amongst the technical and programme staff. Comprehensive training programmes are based on varied subjects which include Programme courses like, Redesigning Youth & children Programme, Gender issues & Gender related Programmes, Training for Vani Trainers, a Relook at Radio Drama, Digitisation of Archival content, Radio Agrivision, Participatory Special Audience Programme, Duty Room Management, Social Media & Programming, Ethics & work Culture, HandlingAudition, Broadcast Journalism, New Trends in sports Coverage, Automation& Digitisation of Libraries, Agriculture School on AIR, Marketing Strategy and Communication, Commentary on sports & non sports events, etc.

The administrative courses are also organised for the Administrative staff as well as for the staff posted in Programme and Engineering wings of AIR & Doordarshan and include subjects like, RTI and Record Management, Disciplinary Procedures and Departmental enquiries, Financial Administration, Reservation in Services, Establishment Rules, Purchase Management, Handling Court /CAT Cases and RTI Matters, Retirement Benefits and Model Calculations, Procurement Procedures & Stores Management ,Social Media for stenographers, Skill upgradation for MTS,Refresher Course on office Management, Superannuation Planning, Administrative Vigilance, Security of installations, Budgeting and Accounting System, etc. covering all the work requirements for due discharge of their duties.



Inauguration of Induction Training Programme

1. OUTSIDE PAID COURSES:-

VANI (Voice Articulation and Nurturing Initiative) Certificate Course):

All India Radio is the first electronic media in the country where Announcers/ Presenters/ Comperes and News Readers have set the style in presentation. Based on this unique expertise, NABM (P), Delhi has specifically designed courses for the performers in broadcast media. VANI Certificate Course is one such course which is helpful in honing the skills of programme presenters, announcers and anchors.

The five day VANI Certificate Course is conducted by AIR Stations. Candidates for this course are selected after auditions at each station and then trained. Total number of courses conducted during April 2015-March 2016 was 76 in which 1849 participants were trained earning net revenue of Rs 69,64,548 (Sixty Nine Lakh Sixty Four Thousand and Five Hundred Forty Eight). Meanwhile efforts are on in the direction of bringing out Hindi and regional version of Vani Handbook in other Indian languages, which is so far available in English only.

2. Mass Communication (Practical Training) :

Internship (Practical Training) is imparted to the students of mass media of recognized institutes/ universities on payment at Capital/ Regional Stations. Total number of 8 courses were conducted at different AIR Stations in which 52 students were trained during April 2015 –March2016, earning a net revenue of Rs.2, 10,000 (Two Lakh TenThousand Only).

3. Voice Culture Workshop for AIR INDIA Crew Members:-

AUDIENCE RESEARCH UNIT

With the changing mass communication scenario, Audience Research has occupied the centre stage. Worldover almost all the big media organizations do in-house audience research in one form or the other or 'Market Research' in marketing parlance as no media organization can afford to put their scarce resource at stake without knowing the potential audience(consumers) and market for their media content. Besides, they are also subscribing to syndicated research done by the various media and market research organizations. The secret behind the success of private TV and Radio channels lies in their capability to feel the pulse of audience through continuous audience research and to design and modify the programme content including presentation accordingly.

All India Radio has been the pioneer in this field. It has a wide network of Audience Research Units (ARUs) across the country operational since 1946. It provides programme feedback to programme producers to plan, design, and modify the programmes according to the needs, tastes, and aspiration of the target audience. Programme ratings/listenership data are provided to sponsors, advertisers, and marketers to fulfil their commercial objectives. ARU also functions as the data bank and a reference section for the organization.

ENGINEERING

(A) Growth of Network & Coverage

All India Radio is one of the largest broadcasting networks in the world. At the time of independence there were six Radio Stations and 18 Transmitters (6 MW & 12 SW) which covered 11% population and 2.5% area of the country.

By 31st March, 2016, AIR network has grown to 418 stations and 606 transmitters (145 MW, 48 SW and 413 FM) which provide coverage to 99.20% of the population spread over 92.00% area of the country. This includes 194 nos. of 100 W FM transmitters installed for localized coverage of about 8-10 km radius.

6. A training was arranged in collaboration with NABM, Delhi, for the newly recruited EAs, in the field of software programming.

10. A basic structure of the PRASARNET has been developed. Applications and modules are being developed.

8. National Academy of Broadcasting & Multimedia (Tech.)

The National Academy of Broadcasting & Multimedia (Tech.) is a premier training academy in the field of Radio and Television broadcasting. Academy primarily imparts training to officers and staff of All India Radio & Doordarshan in various areas of broadcasting at Delhi and Bhubaneswar. Regional Academy established at Shillong and Mumbai to further help in strengthening & supplementing the training activities at regional level augment the training facilities.

The Academy at Delhi was established in 1948 and has since grown into a centre of excellence for technical training in electronic media. For quality training academy is well equipped with state of art Television & Radio Transmission, Production & post production setup. A well-organized library, a fully equipped Computer Centre, Conference Hall & Computer Networking Lab with advanced multi-media equipment and broadcast related jigs are part of the Academy.

The Academy conducts training courses not only for departmental candidates but also imparts international training programs on emerging broadcast technologies. It is continuously expanding its activities beyond India by regularly organising international training programme for Asia - Pacific region in collaboration with Asia - Pacific Institute of Broadcasting Development (AIBD) Malaysia& Asia- Pacific Broadcasting union (ABU). Further realising its emerging role, recently ABU has also nominated ADG, NABM in its training panel. Beyond this NABM has been developing as training hub for broadcasters of neighbouring friendly countries.

9. Activities of 'AIR Resources':

AIR Resources was established in May'2001 with the aim to generate revenue through the sharing of Prasar Bharati resources/ infrastructure. Prasar Bharati has vast reserve of infrastructure in the form of land, building, tower, transmitters, studios, DTH platform, satellite up-link/down-link facilities, training facilities etc. Prasar Bharati also has vast reserve of expertise in the planning, system-design, installation, testing/commissioning and operation & maintenance of broadcasting setup.

Prasar Bharati has shared infrastructure viz. land, building and tower on rental basis with Private FM Broadcasters under the Phase-I and Phase-II schemes of the Ministry of I&B at 85 cities where 243 FM channels have been allocated to Private FM Broadcasters and is under process to share Infrastructure facilities with Private FM Operator under Phase-III scheme.

Prasar Bharati has also shared tower, building and land on rental basis with 76 Mobile service providers at 46 cities for mounting their GSM/CDMA/WLL antenna on FM/TV/STL Towers and BTS Equipment for their mobile service operations.

Under Phase-III Scheme, migration of 152 channels have been done from Phase-II to Phase-III. Prasar Bharati has also signed Infrastructure Agreement with 87 fresh LOI holders under Batch – I of Phase III scheme as the scheme was divided into three batches i.e. Batch-I, Batch-II and Batch – III.

AIR Resources is also generating revenue by providing training to engineering/ Diploma students (AIR & Doordarshan Stations) on weekly/monthly fee basis.

AIR Resources was also earning revenue by a joint venture agreement with IGNOU for operation & maintenance of Gyanvani FM transmitters at 37 places in India. Efforts are being made to restart IGNOU at the earliest.

AIR Resources has been generating revenue right from the year of its inception (2001-02). The Progressive revenue generated from 2001 – 2002 till 2015-16 is Rs.6,23,66,52,083/-as tabulated below:

10. Research Department, AIR & Doordarshan:

Research Department of All India Radio & Doordarshan is a premier national R&D Department involved in research and development activities in the field of Sound and TV Broadcasting, since its inception, to incorporate latest state-of-the-art technologies in the network. The primary objective

of the department is to assist the broadcasting network in the country by way of developing systems/sub-systems which are not readily available and also by playing key role in inducting new services and new technologies to maintain Indian Broadcasting at par with International standards. In addition, a number of studies and research programmes are also undertaken as part of international activities associated with ABU, EBU, CBA, ITU etc. from time to time.

Design & Development of "SMS based Remote control and Monitoring(Telemetry) of VLPT's & 100 watt FM Transmitter, Development of DTH Radio & DVB-T2 Radio, Propagation studies & surveys on VHF and UHF band, regular acoustic material testing and evaluation, regular activities of IMRC Todapur are some of the highlights of prestigious projects/activities undertaken during the year.

In this Annual Report, the efforts have been made to cover all these developments and studies including other achievements of R&D during the year 2015-16 in forth coming pages.

ALL INDIA RADIO PROJECTS/ACTIVITIES

A. Telemetry System Group

1. Advance Telemetry System for Medium Wave Transmitters

- To introduce IT Technology in Telemetry of Broadcasting transmitters, R&D is working on a project namely development of Advance Telemetry System.
- Comprehensive study is in progress to understand the technology.
- A Web based Telemetry System has been developed and tested in the lab and further experimentation is in progress to develop the full-fledged advance telemetry system.

• R&D is also keeping a vigil on latest development in the field of IP based technologies which pertains to sound broadcasting.

• Canopy has been procured & installed at AIR, Rohtak.

2. Provision of Remote Monitoring and Control (Telemetry) System for MW/FM Transmitters under I.O.F. Scheme.

2.1 AM Telemetry System forMedium Wave Transmitters (I.O.F)

• A detailed drawing with some modification was used in installation of Telemetry System at stations for easiest way.

• Two Nos. of power supply for Signal conditioning Unit were fabricated with all its wiring, test point and LED etc., then after fitted in the signal conditioning Unit.

• All card of one signal conditioning unit were tested and fitted in unit with mother board and tested in circuit.

• Installation and commissioning of AM Telemetry System completed at 5 AIR Stations viz.

Chhatarpur, Tirunelveli, Ambikapur, Rohtak& Thiruvananthapuram. The system is working properly at all places. The System operations (control and monitoring) have been tested in R&D also.

• One No. of junction box got fabricated and wired for interconnection between transmitter parameters, auxiliary units and signal conditioning unit.

• One No. L.T.RMS unit fabricated and tested.

• Transducers like temperature, Humidity, LTRMS and smoke detector calibrated for their proper value display.

• Testing and wiring of all parts/equipments has been completed for installation at AIR, Brahmavar.

2.2 FM Telemetry System for FM Transmitters (I.O.F)

• Installation, testing and commissioning of FM Telemetry System at AIR, Rohtak has been completed.

• One Nos. Modified Unit has been designed and fabricated for FM Telemetry for R&S Make FM Transmitter has been installed.

3. SMS Based Remote monitoring for 100 watt FM Transmitters

• R&D has already developed a system to provide this facility for 100 watt BEL Make FM Transmitter.

• The basic system developed in the laboratory is tested for performance which was found to be satisfactory.

B. <u>Antenna lab</u>

In antenna lab, work on the Project 'Development of High Power 20KW to 40 KW FM Transmitting Antenna' is in progress. Civil work is completed. The equipments costing Rs. 73.3 lakhs has been procured. Following activities were carried out in FY 2015-16.

• The design work of 20 KW to 40 KW high power FM antenna using RF Coaxial splitter (Rigid line) for 4 bay & 6 bay cross V antenna is in progress.

• Procurement of basic material, connectors etc. are in progress.

• The project is delayed due to scarcity of technical manpower.

C. Propagation Lab

Propagation lab is one of the oldest laboratories of Research Department, established to carry out field strength measurement & other propagation related studies on broadcast signal. This lab has carried out propagation studies on RF Signal radiated by Terrestrial Transmitters of AIR & Doordarshan located in different part of the country & also have prepared technical reports which are very useful for SMS & Planning division. This year (2015-till date) the lab has performed following activities:

1. Regular monitoring of DRM transmission in Full DRM/Simulcast / Multicast mode.

2. Reception survey of DELHI 'A' (819 kHz), HPT AIR Transmitter in the month of April-15 in simulcast DRM Transmission mode.

3. Reception Survey of HPT, AIR Bengaluru Transmitter in the month of June-15 in simulcast &Pure DRM Transmission mode.

4. Reception Survey of 20kW, HPT MW AM-DRM Transmitter (Delhi-C) at Mall Road(Multi channel) in September-15 in Pure DRM Transmission Mode.

5. Reception survey of 10kW HPT AIR Transmitter (FM Vividh Bharati) has been completed in Nov-Dec. 15.

D. Acoustic Group

Research Department of All India Radio and Doordarshan has vast R&D experience in the field of acoustic engineering. The acoustic laboratory is continuously engaged in carrying out various acoustic measurements of AIR & DD stations, testing and evaluation (NRC, STC, FIIC etc) of acoustic materials in accordance with existing national and international standards. Further upgradation of Acoustic measurement infrastructure is in process under plan project.

1. Testing of Acoustic Materials

Testing of various Acoustical Materials carried out in the acoustic lab during year 2015 given as under:

The Acoustic lab has been carrying out various acoustic measurements of acoustic materials with existing national and international standards. Acoustic measurement in respect of following private firms, were made on payment basis.

11. Absound Overseas

During the year 2015-16, 52 acoustic tests excluding departmental tests have been done and an amount of Rs.5,07,599/- has been received from various firms against testing charges at the rate of Rs. 5,618/- each test of various acoustic material/transducers till March, 2016. The revision of fees for commercial testing has now been approved by DG, AIR w.e.f. Nov. 2015. New rates are Rs. 12100/- with service tax applicable extra.

Demonstration was given to Engg. students during summer vacations & also to trainees of Induction course for newly recruited PEX./TREX/EA's of AIR& DD.

E. DRM Lab

The study, design and development of indigenous DRM Receiver is in progress. During the period of report, efforts were made to find out integrated circuit compatible to DRM signal reception. So far few manufacturers are available in the market but their chips are not readily available in the market.

F. DTH/DVB-T Lab

DTH Receiver, DVB-T2 Radio receiver and RF Splitter have been developed in the lab. DTH Radio proto type model with front panel display of various channels has been shown in the BES Expo 2016. The performance of this receiver is found to be satisfactory. Further study on DVBT-2 Receiver/modification is in progress.

G. DTH Signal Monitoring Lab

R&D has established a complete set up to monitor DD Must Carry Channels on various private DTH platforms. Presently, Twenty five channels are being monitored on six private DTH platforms. The monthly report is being sent to Doordarshan Directorate for onward submission to Prasar Bharati and I&B Ministry.

H. International Monitoring& Receiving Station, Todapur, New Delhi

International Monitoring & Receiving centre situated at Todapur, Inderpuri, New Delhi, is engaged in carrying out broadcast signal monitoring of MW, SW, FM and DTH signal carrying internal and external services of AIR. The activities carried out during the period April 2015 to March, 2016 are detailed below:

I. FREQUENCY CHECKING OF MF & HF TRANSMITTERS OF ALL INDIA RADIO

a. Carried out monitoring of all SW & MW transmitters, viz. Kingsway, Khampur, Aligarh, Bengaluru, Chennai, Panaji, Mumbai, Chinsurah(SPT), Rajkot(SPT), Jalandhar(HPT), Tuticorin(HPT), which carry external, internal and Vividh Bharati services of All India Radio with the following objectives:-

(i) Performance of the transmitters i.e. breakdown, modulation, distortion, cross talk, excessive frequency deviation etc.

(ii) Checking the correct scheduling of programme and their technical quality.Carried out monitoring of regional Short wave transmitters located at Lucknow, Bhopal, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Shimla, Gangtok, Srinagar, Leh, Jammu, Chennai and Mumbai.

b. Carried out monitoring of AIR DRM transmitter (MW & SW) both analog mode and digital mode transmission from Kingsway Camp-Delhi-C (2 channel), Khampur-DKH-17 (2 channel), Bengaluru-BL-1(2 channel), Foreign DRM service from Radio New Zealand Int., Radio R-Romania Int., KBS world Radio, Radio Australia, NHK world Radio-Japan, BBC Radio, Vatican Radio, Voice of Nigeria Radio which carries Indian programmes.

c. Three days special watch observed on HF schedule of All India Radio for co-channel and adjacent channel interference (+) & (-) 5Hz. This watch was observed in the beginning and middle of HF schedule.

d. Kept watch on most Northern Indian medium wave channels of All India Radio from the point of undue interference emanating from foreign broadcasting stations during the night time.

e. Frequency deviation measurement carried out for about 50 Nos. of various Frequencies including both medium wave and shortwave transmitters. Reports were sent by email.

2. <u>CLEAR CHANNEL WATCHES AND IDENTIFICATION OF INTERFERENCE</u> OF SHORTWAVE CHANNEL OF ALL INDIA RADIO

Clear channel watches and identification of interfering stations of All India Radio channels carrying internal, external, Vividh Bharati and regional SW services were carried out regularly. The observations from these watches were used for taking remedialaction. Special monitoring of various channels was carried out for arriving at a decision before finalizing each seasonal aerial/frequency schedule for programme finalization on Republic Day, Sports, National events, VVIP broadcasts and other important events. During 2015-2016 special watches and VVIP transmission monitoring were carried out as per details below:-

3. MONITORING OF RN CHANNELS / FM CHANNELS

Monitoring of all "C" band RN channels of INSAT-4B originating from Broadcasting House, New Delhi. These channels were monitored round the clock on hourly basis daily. The abnormalities observed regarding the quality and contents of programme were communicated to Broadcasting House, New Delhi in real time for taking immediate necessary action and the report emailed.

Monitoring of all the regional RN channels thrice daily for overall performance and report emailed.

4. DTH RADIO MONITORING

Regular monitoring of 21 Nos of DTH Radio channels were carried out on hourly basis daily. The abnormalities observed were communicated to concerned stations and DTH-DD immediately for taking necessary action and the report emailed.

5. MONITORING OF THE TRANSMISSIONS OF FOREIGN ORGANISATIONS

Technical monitoring of the transmissions of countries beamed towards India was carrieout regularly on a reciprocal basis. Periodic reports were prepared and sent to respective broadcasting organizations by email.

Research Department participated and well managed the 'PRASAR BHARATI' stall in BES Expo 2016 exhibition held at Ambience Hotel, New Delhi during February 2016 and presented the achievements and future plans of All India Radio & Doordarshan using live demonstrations, LCDs, leaflets and brochure etc.

Prasar Bharati Stall was given different look under the guidance and supervision of R&D Office. Large number of visitors visited the stall and got aware of the present & future developmental activities of Prasar Bharati. At the Prasar Bharati stall R&D team successfully demonstrated the DTH Radio Receiver with front panel Webcasting along with AIR & Doordarshan archival material.

In addition AIR Resources, IT Division, NABM (T) and DTP&S sections of Prasar Bharati had made meaningful presence at Prasar Bharati stall. The stall was visited and appreciated by a number of dignitaries and professionals from all over the country and abroad.

ADMININISTRATION

1. <u>Reservation for SCs/STs/OBCs</u>

AIR has taken all requisite measures for implementation of reservation policy in respect of SCs/ STs/ OBCs categories by setting up a dedicated SC/ST Cell. All relevant policy directions and instructions issued by Nodal Ministries/ Departments for extending benefits to SCs/STs/ OBCs in Government Service were circulated to all offices and field units of AIR for compliance.

2. Public Grievance and Redressal Mechanism

Grievance Redressal and Access Mechanism has been set up at the Station Level, Zonal Headquarters & the Central Headquarter level in accordance with the guidelines of Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances and monitored through the Centralized Public Grievances Redressal and Monitoring System (CPGRAMS). Information and Facilitation Counters have also been set up at all offices of AIR. As per Directorate's Order No.A-11013/4/2015-IWSU dated 23.06.2015, a Taxation Cell has been set up in the Directorate for addressing all tax related aspects pertaining to DG:AIR. Regular status reports on disposal of Grievances are being submitted to the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and Prasar Bharati Secretariat. Further, the ATRs of disposed cases are being uploaded online on DARPG portal as part of e-commerce activities of this Unit.

3. Implementation of Right to Information Act 2005

All AIR Stations have broadcast a number of programmes in different formats to inform the people regarding various provisions of the Right to Information Act, 2005 in order to empower people and contribute to transparency and accountability in governance. Programme Heads of all AIR Stations have been asked to highlight the salient feature of this Act in the programme. This Act has also been covered under Flagship Programme since September, 2008. AIR will continue with the publicity of this Act in future also.

In AIR, 46 CPIOs and 18 Appellate Authorities in Directorate and 295 CPIOs and 20 Appellate Authorities at field level have been designated for implementation of RTI Act. In the year 2015-2016, 1202 RTI applications were received and were replied within the stipulated time. Besides, 220 appeals were received by the Appellate Authority during the period and all were disposed of.

4. <u>Welfare Section, DG:AIR</u>

(i) AIR has a vast network consisting of 320 stations/offices spread all over the country. There are about 14,157 personnel working in three streams viz., Programme, Engineering and Administration in AIR.

(ii) In All India Radio, the percentage of working women in Group 'A', 'B' and 'C' taken together is about 25% of the total strength of human resources. All AIR Stations/Offices have been instructed to set up a Complaints Committee to look into the grievances/complaints of sexual harassment. The Internal Complaints Committee has been set up at all the AIR Stations/Offices accordingly. It has also been directed that the said Internal Complaints Committee will be chaired by senior level woman officer and half of its members should be female.

(iii) Aadhar Enabled Biometric Attendance System (AEBAS) has been made operational in AIR Directorate and all Offices of AIR in Delhi with the registration of over 2500 Delhi based employees. New Bio Metric Attendance Machines have been installed at many AIR Stations throughout the country. Process is going on to install such machines on the remaining Stations.

(iv) In line with the Government directions, All India Radio has started using the e-tendering process for procurement of goods and services.

(v) With the approval of DG: AIR, a 3-4 member Committee is formed in this Directorate to supervise service, discipline and quality of service rendered by the Contractor in the Departmental Canteen. The Committee will also comment on present rates and offer their recommendations.

(vi) Awareness Workshop for Directors, Deputy Directors and Section Officers of AIR Directorate on prevention of sexual harassment at workplace and to ensure prohibition and prevention of sexual harassment was conducted on 17th July, 2015 under the leadership of Chairperson, ICC, DG: AIR. In the workshop, besides sensitizing all present about the provisions of the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013, some case studies were also discussed for effective implementation of the Act.

Days Celebrated in DG: AIR, New Delhi:

(a) **30th January, 2015:** A two minutes silence was observed at all the Stations of All India Radio on 30th January, 2015 in memory of those martyrs who sacrificed their lives for the freedom of the country. Accordingly, a two-minute silence was observed in this Directorate administered by Director General, All India Radio.

(b) 8th March, 2015: Women's Day: As 8th March, 2015 had fallen on Sunday, Women's Day was celebrated on 9th March, 2015 (Monday) at 11.30 A.M in the Conference Hall, 1st Floor, Akashvani Bhawan, New Delhi. Around 200 women employees working in this Directorate took part in the Programme organized by Welfare Section of this Directorate. During the interaction, women employees were encouraged to come forward with suggestions and/or complaints for improvement in the working environment in AIR Directorate.

(c) 14th April, 2015: Birth Anniversary of Baba Saheb Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar: A Programme was also organized to pay homage by DG:AIR in this Directorate on 14th April, 2015 at 10.30 A.M in Conference Hall, Akashvani Bhawan, New Delhi. Circular as well as Satellite Message from Welfare Section, DG:AIR was issued to all the Stations of All India Radio to celebrate birth anniversary of Baba Saheb Dr. B.R.Ambedkar on 14th April, 2015.

(d) **21st May, 2015:** Anti Terrorism Day:21st May of every year is observed as Anti Terrorism Day. The objective behind the observance of this day is to wean people, especially the youth, away from the cult of terrorism and violence. An important feature of the observance of the Anti Terrorism Day was the Pledge Taking Ceremony conducted in the Conference Hall, Akashvani Bhawan, and New Delhi in which all the officers/staff members assembled in full strength and took pledge administered by DG:AIR.

(e) **20th August, 2015**: Sadbhavana Diwas:It was observed at all the Stations of All India Radio on 20th August this year. Necessary circular as well as Satellite Message was issued from this Section on 17th August, 2015. The theme of Sadbhavana is to promote National Integration and Communal Harmony among people of all religions, languages and regions. The idea behind observance of Sadbhavana Diwas is to eschew violence and to promote goodwill among the people.

(f) 19th November to 25th November, 2015: Communal Harmony Week: Qaumi Ekta Week (National Integration Week) was observed from 19th to 25th November 2015, to foster the spirit of patriotism, communal harmony and national integration. Quami Ekta Week commenced with PLEDGE TAKING CEREMONY on 19th November, 2015 at 11.00 A.M and was attended by all officers/staff members working in DG, AIR.

5. <u>Renovation Work Carried in this Directorate:</u>

(a) **Renovation of Departmental Canteen**: Senior Officers of this Directorate visited the Departmental Canteen and found that there is need to spruce it up immediately. Accordingly, renovation work in the Departmental Canteen is being done by the CCW of this Directorate in consultation with the Canteen Committee.

(b) **Renovation of Toilets and Corridors**: The renovation work of toilets and Corridors of Akashvani Bhawan is also being undertaken by the Civil Construction Wing of AIR.

(c) **Renovation of Reception Office**: The common Reception office of Akashvani Bhawan, Broadcasting House and New Broadcasting House is also being refurbished.

(d) **Display Board**: Display Boards have been put up at some places around Akashvani Bhawan prominently displaying the key programmes of AIR.

6. <u>Welfare activities:-</u>

- a) A number of the offices of AIR are located in the buildings owned by Prasar Bharati. There is adequate arrangement for their sitting, drinking water etc. The work place is adequately illuminated. Proper toilets are available to the staff, with a provision for separate toilet for women employees.
- b) At many places, AIR has its own staff quarters. These are allotted to the staff as per All India Radio (Allotment of Residential Quarters) Rules.
- c) In accordance with the instructions of the Department of Personnel and Training, appointment on compassionate grounds is offered to the close relatives of AIR employees who expired while in service.
- d) AIR Staff like Technicians, Sr. Technicians, Engineering Assistants, Sr. Engineering Assistants etc. are shift duty staff. To the extent possible, arrangements are made for dropping and picking up of employees, including women employees, during late night shift duty at odd hours.
- e) All the staff members are paid their salary as per the pay scales approved by the Government of India. AIR employees including female employees are granted leave in accordance with the government rules.
- f) AIR employees including female employees are entitled to terminal benefits at par with the government employees.
- g) At places where Central Government Health Scheme is working, AIR employees are entitled to obtain its services. At other places, AIR employees are given the benefit of Central Services (Medical Attendance) Rules. Under these Rules even Private Medical Practitioners are

appointed as Authorized Medical Attendants for the employees and their families. Wherever requested separate Authorized Medical Attendants are appointed for women.

- h) AIR has a system of nurturing and recognizing excellence through Akashvani Annual Awards for Programming as well as Technical personnel and a number of women are awarded prizes under this scheme.
- i) Accepting the recommendations of the Committee on Women Empowerment, a new category of Awards i.e. Best Women's Programme has been introduced under Akashvani Annual Awards from 2009. Majority of producers of the Women Programmes are women and are benefitted through this new category of awards.

7. Implementation of the Judgements / Orders of CAT

As per the instructions received from Department of Personnel and Training, information in respect of Implementation of the Judgements / Orders of CAT Cases in AIR for the year 2015-16is given here under:

8. <u>Reservation for Persons with Disabilities</u>

(a) The Constitution of India ensures equality, freedom, justice and dignity of all individuals and implicitly mandates an inclusive society for all including the persons with disabilities. The Government of India enacted "The Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995", in an effort to ensure equal opportunities for persons with disabilities and their full participation in nation building.

(b) The PWD Act has come into force in 1996. However it was latter in November, 1997 the reservation for persons with disabilities was introduced in case of direct recruitment to Group 'C' and 'D' posts. It was extended to the cases of promotion to Group 'C' and 'D' post in 1989. With the enactment of the Act, reservation for persons with disabilities was made applicable in identified Group A and B posts also in case of direct recruitment.

(c) The Department of Personnel & Training, Government of India had issued consolidated instructions on the subject in December, 2005. As per the instructions, reservation for persons with disability is now available in all groups of posts in case of direct recruitment. In case of promotion it is available when promotions are made with from Group 'D' to Group 'C' and within Group 'C' identified posts.

(d) Prasar Bharati has taken all requisite measures for implementation of reservation for PWDs, all relevant policy decisions and instructions issued by DOP&T from time to time.

(e) All India Radio broadcasts programmes on Persons with Disabilities through the AIR Stations spread across the country. In these programmes, apart from the Schemes of Welfare of Persons with Disabilities being implemented by the Central and State Governments; programmes relating to their health, social and cultural concerns are also included. The content of programmes is so designed that it not only helps them to get benefits of welfare schemes of the Government but also encourages them to live with dignity. The programmes are crucial from the point of view of social awareness and also useful in changing the callous attitude of society towards Persons with Disabilities.

(f) Although there is no specific Budget Head in Directorate for the benefit of Persons with Disabilities, activities like making of ramp, special toilets, preferably on ground floor are undertaken from 'Minor Works' budget Head of CCW, AIR.

9. <u>RAJBHASHA</u>

DG: AIR (Hqrs.)

The Hindi Unit of AIR Directorate (Headquarters) is dedicated wholly in implementing the Official Language Policy of Union of India and constantly strives to implement the orders/ instructions issued from time to time by Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home and implementing targets mentioned in Annual Programme in Various AIR stations/offices. Apart from implementing the Official Language Policy in the year 2015-16 by Hindi Unit, following works were carried out to encourage the officients to work in Official Language Hindi.

Reports of Hindi Divas/ Hindi Fortnight organized in the year 2015-16 and other specific works:-

Organising Lecture Series/Kaviyitri Sammelan:-

"Akhil Bhartiya Kaviyitri Sammelan" was organized by DG: AIR on 13th May, 2015 at 6:00 p.m. at Bhartiya Vidya Bhavan, Copernicus Lane, Kasturba Gandhi Marg, New Delhi to promote Official Language Hindi. One more lecture was organized on 18th December, 2015 in memory of "Shri Girja Kumar Mathur" in which Shri Tarun Vijay, Hon'ble Minister of Parliament delivered the lecture.

Hindi Seminar

To promote Hindi as an Official Language, a Hindi Seminar was organised at Nagpur on 03 and 04 September, 2015 for AIR stations/offices situated in Maharashtra.

Hindi Divas/ Hindi Fortnight organized in 2015-16

According to the orders issued by Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, Department of Official Language, 14 September is to be observed as Hindi Diwas every year. AIR Directorate always strives to organise this. In keeping with this tradition "Hindi Diwas" was observed on 14
September, 2015 and "Hindi Fortnight" was organised from 15.09.2015 to 30.09.2015 under the guidance of Director General, Shri. F. Sheheryar. Various officers/ officials participated with great enthusiasm and the messages of Home Minister, Minister of Information & Broadcasting and CEO, Prasar Bharati were read out on this occasion.

Nineteen competitions in Hindi were organized during Hindi Fortnight. In these competitions, it was ensured that officers/ officials of Non-Hindi speaking areas take part in large number and separate Hindi competitions were organized for them. Many officers/officials participated in the competition. 114 officers/ officials were awarded with prizes and certificates. A total of Rs.1, 99,500/- were spent on these awards.

Shri Amitabh Shukla, ADG distributed the prizes. DDG (A&F), Shri Rashid Abbas Ansari, DDG also participated in the prize distribution ceremony and they requested the officers present in the prize distribution ceremony to work in Hindi so that officials working under them are encouraged to work in Hindi.

Hindi Workshop

This year five Hindi Workshops have been organized so far, in which solutions were provided for the problems being faced while working in Hindi. A workshop on "Use of Unicode on computers" was organized on 10th June, 2015 in which Sh. Rajesh Srivastava, Assistant Director gave training on how to use Unicode on computers to the officials. Richa Banerjee, Joint Director (O.L.) discussed "Usefulness of Language and status of Official Language Hindi" with officials present in the workshop. Yet another workshop was organised on 04thand 05thFebruary, 2016 for Data Entry Operators working in DG: AIR in which Sh. Rakesh Babu Dubey, Deputy Director (O.L.) gave lecture on "To create awareness among Government officials for implementation of Official Language".

Work of Town Official Language Implementation Committee Delhi (Centre)

Town Official Language Implementation Committee Delhi (Centre) has 150 offices/ members and DG, AIR is the Chairman. A workshop was organized on 17th April, 2015 by DG:AIR in memory of "Shri Jay Shankar Prasad" in which Sh. Laxmi Shankar Vajpayee, famous Poet and Writer was invited as the Speaker.

Akhil Akashvani Rajbhasha Sammelan

Akhil Akashvani Rajbhasha Sammelan was organized on 29thMarch, 2016 in Delhi for all the Stations/Offices of AIR. Director General: AIR, Shri. F. Sheheryar was the Chief Guest. Additional Director General Sh. Amitabh Shukla, Additional Director General Dr. Shailendra Kumar, Deputy Director General Sh. Rashid Abbas Ansari, Deputy Director General Sh. Rajeev Kumar Shukla, Joint Director (O.L.) Mrs. Richa Banerjee, Director (Central Store) Sh. P. K. Singh and Assistant Director (O.L.), Ministry of Information & Broadcasting Sh. Dilip Kumar Nigam gave lectures before the participants.

CHAPTER IV

DOORDARSHAN

From an experimental service at Delhi in September 1959, Doordarshan over the years has grown to become one of the leading TV organizations of the world. Doordarshan has not only expanded its network throughout length and breadth of the country but also kept pace with new technological developments in the field of TV broadcasting.

DD: National: The Flagship Channel

DD: National Channel, a Public Service Broadcasting, is the largest terrestrial network in the world, covering 92.6 % population and 81.0 % land area of the country. Being the main face, the channel lends a healthy mix of entertainment, information and education. The service is available in terrestrial mode from 05.30 a.m. till midnight. In the satellite mode it is available round the clock.

Doordarshan procures content through various notified schemes such as Self-Finance-Commissioning (SFC), Revenue Sharing Mode (RSM), and Advertisement Funded Programme (AFP) as approved in the 123rd Board Meeting. In the revenue sharing schemes Doordarshan collaborate with some private channels for sourcing some high quality software on favourable terms.

Doordarshan/Directorate has set up a National Resource Exchange Pool with the purpose of creating a common store house of important programmes to be kept on record and for telecast in the future by RLSS Kendras.

Live programmes:

All major national events like Republic Day, Independence Day Celebration, President's and Prime Minister's addresses to the Nation, Important Parliament debates, and Sports events are covered and telecast on DD National.

Birth Anniversaries/Death Anniversaries of important personalities are covered and telecast on DD-National. Rashtriya Ekta Diwas, Birth Anniversary of Sardar Patel have also been covered and telecast on Doordarshan. Doordarshan made elaborate arrangements with ISRO for live telecast of launch of GSAT-16 Communications Satellites.

Along with coverage, developmental programmes, socially relevant special programmes e.g. Healthy India, Pulse Polio Campaign, Anti cancer, Leprosy, Tuberculosis, dengue, Swine Flu and other health related issues, Special Campaign for primary Education for all, AIDS, consumer education, Road Safety, free legal aid to weaker section of the society etc. have been the major planks of telecast on DD-National.

DD-National has been completely rebranded with (i) new programmes and (ii) iconic old serials made by reputed film makers. DD-National competes for eyeball with other General Entertainments channels. Therefore, all programmes in this band typically are soaps and serials including reality shows and literary classics and folk dances. The objective is to put high quality contents, maximum viewership and to enhance revenue generation to Doordarshan.

The Education Component is continued to be drawn from the contributions from varied sources such as Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), University Grant Commission (UGC), Central Institute of Educational Technology (SIET)/NCERT, Vigyan Prasar.

Programmes/Serials:

'Manthan' in collaboration with German TV programme is a new Innovation on Science.

'Gali Gali Sim Sim' being telecast on Doordarshan is an animation series for children.

Doordarshan has stepped up efforts for cross channel promotions and publicity including the use of social media.

So far DD: National is concerned, a fresh colours scheme with a new tagline entitled "Desh Ka Apna Channel" has been initiated. New SFC programmes have been launched from 15th August, 2015 and October, 2015.

Some of the popular evening serials being telecast on DD: National are: Pavitra Bandhan Do Dilon Ka, Khwabon Ke Darmiyan, Zindagi Ek Bhanwar, Dard Ka Rishta, Janmo Ka Bandhan, 40 Plus, Rannbheri, Dil Ko-Aaj Phir Jeene Ki Tammana Hai, Albeli-Kahnai Pyar Ki, Beti Ka Farz, IPS Dairy and Mashaal.

Narrow-casting:

Since 2004, Doordarshan has been producing the flagship project of Ministry of Agriculture, Govt. of India. The project has three tier approaches.

1. On the National Channel: The Agriculture programmes are telecast six days week (Monday to Saturday), between 6.30 am to 7.00 am.

2. On 18 Regional Channels: State specific Agriculture programmes are telecast five days a week (Monday to Friday) for the duration of 30 minutes in the respective Regional Language of the state on State network, from 5.30 to 6.00 pm (due to change of National Telecast Timing).

3. In "Narrowcasting mode (36 Kendra's): Area specific information, produced twice a week up to 30.06.2015 and w.e.f. 01.07.2015 one programme once a week, is being telecast five days a week (Monday to Friday), covering more than 140 districts across the country.

The date-wise schedule of programmes of each of the 55 production centres are uploaded on a specific portal (www.dacnet.nic/csms), so that extension workers, planners and the farmers can receive advance information about the programmes that would be telecast each day.

<u>Films</u>

Film unit of Directorate of Doordarshan procures Hindi Feature Films for various slots of National Network on Royalty basis for its viewers from all walks of life. Latest Blockbuster films are being telecast on all Friday slot at 10.00 PM and super hit films are being shown on all Saturday's slots at 10.00 PM on National Network. Retrospective of eminent directors, actors etc. are shown on all Sundays slots at 12.00 noon, classic/popular films are being shown on all Sundays at 03.00 PM. Old popular films are being telecast in serialized format under Bioscope slot on Tuesdays and Wednesdays at 11.00 PM. Best of Indian Cinema produced in Indian Languages with English subtitles are telecast on Sundays and Mondays at 10.00 PM & 11.00 PM on Doordarshan.

The Gross revenue earned from the telecast of five Hindi Feature Films on Doordarshan's National Network every week is around Rs. 1.24 Crore. Doordarshan has branded the feature film slot as "Friday Houseful" to show latest blockbusters, "Saturday Jubilee" to show super hit popular films.

The Best of Indian Cinema project was launched by DD on 10.11.2013. The spectrum of films screened under Best of Indian Cinema, every Sunday and Monday at 10.00 PM and 11.00 PM varies from English to rare dialects like Mising, Tulu & Kokborok. 76 Films have been telecast till date.

It has been planned to do promotional activities of this ambitious project by using all the means. Few are mentioned below:-

- 1. To do intensive campaign during international Film Festival being held in India.
- 2. These films are being telecast on Regional Channels, DD-Urdu, DD-Bharati & DD-India.
- 3. Intensive marketing efforts being undertaken to generate revenue for these films.

4. Film Section has organised BIC Film Festivals at IGNCA New Delhi, Hyderabad, Banga Bhawan, New Delhi, SRFTI, Kolkata and CSMVS Mumbai. A series of such BIC film festival has been planned in Major Grade B cities and important metros.

DD News

DD-News channel was launched on 3rd November, 2003 by converting DD-Metro into a 24-hours news channel. Its satellite footprint is available across the country. DD News terrestrial reach is 49% area of the country. DD News is currently producing news content in Hindi, English, Urdu and Sanskrit languages. Over 18 hours of live transmission include telecast of more than 30 news bulletins in these languages and special programmes on Government schemes and initiatives. The channel telecast daily three sports bulletins, one business show, daily current affairs programmes, special shows on health, youth issues, cinema, art and culture, world news magazine and country's only Sanskrit news magazine, etc.

DD News has made earnest efforts to give wide publicity and disseminate information on various government initiatives for welfare of people. Exhaustive and live coverage of launch of the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Yojana, Atal Pension Yojana, Mission Indradhanush, Smart Cities, Housing for all by 2022, Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT),

Mudra Bank, Digital Locker initiative, National Policy for Skill Development and Entrepreneurship and Deen Dayal Gram Jyoti Yojana. Number of special programmes were also mounted on these initiatives highlighting benefits of these schemes for common people. Launch of country's first television channel for farmers 'DD Kisan' channel was covered and DD News is also producing 30 minute Kisan Samachar for DD Kisan daily.

Hon'ble Prime Ministers' visits in country and abroad were given special focus because of their significance. Prime Minister's foreign visits through continents in all these months were covered with curtain raiser programmes, live coverage and follow-up programmes. These coverage included importance of the visits and issues of India's interests and the emerging role of India in global perspective. DD News did wide coverage of Prime Minister's three nation tour to Germany, France and Canada from 9th to 18th April 2015. Curtain raiser programmes were telecast focusing on bilateral ties with these countries and importance of PM's visit with live inputs from correspondents from France, Germany and Canada. Prime Minister's three nation visit to China, Mongolia and South Korea from 14th to 19th May 2015 was also widely covered. Prime Minister's visit to Bangladesh in June, Russia and 5 Central Asian Countries in July and UAE in August was given exhaustive coverage. Prime Minister's historic visit to Ireland and USA in September and UK in November were prominently covered with live inputs from reporters and special programmes. Prime Minister engagements in various world and multinational forums like G 20 summit held at Antalya in Turkey and Conference of Parties (COP21) on Climate Change at Paris in November were exhaustively covered by DD News. PM's visits to various developmental projects in different parts of the country as well as political engagements were also widely covered during the period.

DD News also prominently covered President's visits to Belarus, Sweden, Israel, Palestine and Jordan and Vice President Visits to Cambodia, Laos, Indonesia, Brunei and Turkmenistan. External Affairs Minister's visits to New York in October and Pakistan in December were exhaustively covered. DD news also covered visits of President of Tanzania, Mozambique and Seychelles, Prime Minister of Sri Lanka, German Chancellor and Prime Minister of Japan to India. DD News did exhaustive coverage of rescue and relief operations in Nepal and evacuations from Yemen with expert discussions, special programs and live inputs.

DD has visualized and adopted for television PM's radio broadcast "Mann Ki Baat". DD news adopted PM's Mann Ki Baat for simultaneous TV telecast with radio broadcast, which was taken and carried by several private channels also. This was supported by package stories and thorough coverage of peoples' reactions. In September one year of Mann Ki Baat was marked with special programmes and stories that included snippets from previous editions of Mann Ki Baat.

DD News exhaustively planned commemoration of 125th Birth Anniversary of Dr. B.R.Ambedkar. Number of programmes were produced, promoted and telecast to mark Birth Anniversary of Baba Saheb from 9th to 14th April and repeated later in the week. A one hour documentary "Yug Pravartak" on life, thoughts and work of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar and Govt. programmes and policies for weaker section was telecast on 14th April 2015. A 30 minute documentary "Adhikar" on Baba Saheb Contribution to the Constitution was telecast on 11th April 2015. A one hour audience based discussion programme "Dr. Ambedkar Vyaktitva Aur Vichar" was telecast on 13th April 2015. Two half an hour interviews with Prof. Vivek Kumar, JNU and Dalit Women Entrepreneur Kalpana Saroj were telecast on 9th and 10th April 2015. Besides this special episodes of "Ehsaas" and "Mehnat Rang Layegi" were telecast on 12th April 2105 highlighting issues related to weaker sections and success stories of Dalit farmers.

Comprehensive planning for programmes on one year of the government was done. A number of special programmes were produced, promoted and telecast to mark the occasion. A special half an hour programme titled "Pehla Saal Modi Sarkar" was telecast daily from 12th May to 31st May 2015 and repeated

on next day. Five special audience based programme of one hour duration each were also aired. A one hour documentary on achievements of government "Ek Majboot Kadam Naye Bhavishya Ki Ore" was telecast on 25th May 2015 and repeated three times on 26th May 2015. Special interviews of around 20 Union Ministers on achievement of their Ministries were telecast from 1st May 2015 to 31st May 2015.



International Yoga Day : 21.06.2015

DD News did exhaustive coverage of International Yoga Day. The main function at Janpath on 21st June was carried live on DD News. Special stories from all corners of the country and across the globe on IYD were carried. The event organized at UN, HQ in New York to mark first International Yoga Day was also carried live. In a 14 day long series special programmes, national and international stories, interviews and discussions on International Yoga Day were telecast. DD News also carried special episodes of Total Health, Tejaswani, Charcha Mein and GenNext on Yoga. Special interviews of eminent Yoga Guru e.g. Shri H R Nagendra, Swami Ved Bharati, Baba Ramdev, Shri Shri Ravi Shankar and AYUSH Minister Shri Shripad Nayak were also carried. A special documentary "Yoga-Gatha" was also telecast. Regional News Units (RNUs) also did special stories/programmes on IYD.

Special programmes on Centenary Birth Celebration of Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay, Demise of former President Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam and tribute to departed leader and his last rites ceremony in Rameshwaram, Sardar Patel's 140th birth anniversary, World Environment Day, World Tourism Day, World Sanskrit Conference at Bangkok, 10th World Hindi Conference at Bhopal, 'Global Call to Action' Summit 2015 and Forum for India - Pacific Islands Cooperation (FIPIC) Summit in Jaipur and India-Africa Summit at New Delhi were mounted. Special series on 40 years of emergency was carried. A special documentary "Aapatkal Ka Sach" was telecast in five parts from 23rd to 27th June 2015. Special discussion and audience based programmes on emergency were also mounted.

DD news also did a number of special programmes on Bihar assembly elections, Special programmes on Golden Jubilee of 1965 war, Special episodes of Total Health on Dengue, Yoga, World Heart Day, Treatment of earthquake victims, Thalassemia, Mission Indradhanush etc. were mounted. DD News has covered launch of PSLV C28, launch of GSAT-6 and indigenous Astronomy satellite ASTROSAT and special programme on MH-370 crash.

DD News launched the first Sanskrit TV News magazine of India, "Vaartaavali" in June. Two new weekly programmes on international news/events "WorldKonnect" in English and "Khabar Duniya Ki" in Hindi were started in October 2015.

DD News recently completed 600 episodes of its popular show, Total Health.

For fast collection of audio-visual feed, it is integrating its studio panels with latest internet tools. In recent international coverage, it has used cost-effective mobile transmission of feeds in place of satellite feeds, wherever possible.

In its effort to make the refurbished channel available far and wide, especially on new ICT platforms, DD News has been posting more and more audio-visual material on YouTube and other social media entities. The latest in this direction is a mobile app to provide live television and other videos to smart phone users.

Independence Day, Republic Day celebration, Hon'ble Prime Minister massages, special programmes on the state leaders. A daily programme titled "Sargarmiyan" gives a roundup of all important happening with visual footage in and around Delhi.

DD-India carries News bulletins, Features on Topical Events, Entertainment Programmes, Feature Films, Music and Dance, Serials, Documentaries, News and Current Affairs, Events and Tourism.

The DD-India programmes are reaching 38 countries of the world through submarine cable, satellite and DTH platforms. It is available on GSAT-10 which has its coverage in SAARC, ASEAN, FIPIC and East African coastal countries. It is available in Canada on ATN network in US as part of ITV and in Europe as part of DW bouquet. It is available in the country on Cable by most MSOs and DTH platform on TataSky. A strategy for further expansion of its distribution and to have global footprint is underway in consultation with Ministry.

At present 8 hour programme loop is being telecast and the same is being repeated twice in 24 hours to suit the prime time zone of the world.

Inauguration of DD-Kisan Channel

.DD Kisan has following segments:

Kisan Samachar:- shows news that have direct impact on the farmers of the Rural India on a daily basis.

Talks and Discussions- Experts listen to the problems and difficulties of the farmers and try to find solution for them.

Kisan Prashnmanch:- Team of DD Kisan travel from one village to another to find out the solution of farmers queries. In this farmers are quizzed and the winner gets Prizes. Agricultural Experts is also a part of this programme.

Chaupal Charcha:- farmers are made aware of Village developmental programmes including village cleanliness and health issues.

Hello Kisan- farmers directly talk to the experts on phone.

Khet Khalihaan- this one hour daily show provide information about agriculture, seed, soil, vegetable market, weather, marketing, food processing etc. Experts from different places provide opinion on the above issues as well as made aware of various agricultural planning.

Doordarshan Commercial Service

Doordarshan Commercial Service is an independent wing to co-ordinate all the commercial activities being performed at the Headquarter, Doordarshan Kendras, Marketing Divisions and DCD towards sale of airtime as well as collection of revenue from agencies/clients/producers. DCS is responsible for framing of Commercial policies and updating of rate card as per inputs received from Marketing Divisions and regional Kendras, with the approval of Prasar Bharati Board.

This wing allows registration and accreditation status to various advertising agencies and interacts with

them for selling of air time. Rules and policies in this regard are framed and reviewed from time to time in the changing market scenario.

During the year 2013-14 Doordarshan earned gross revenue of Rs.1295.96 crore. In the financial year 2014-15 it has earned gross revenue of Rs.1124.43 crores and in the financial year 2015-16 its net earnings (including service tax) is Rs.856.61 crore from different Doordarshan Kendras including DCD (Annexure – IV).

Development Communication Division (DCD)

Keeping in view the communication needs of Govt. Depts./Ministries/PSUs, Development Communication Division (DCD) established in March, 2001 to function as a single window marketing division and a production house with innovative development communication model. Development Communication Division provides as a single window facility for:-

- Marketing of Doordarshan airtime and production capability
- Consultancy and customized media planning
- Production of programmes in countrywide stations in regional languages; and
- Feedback and research surveys to the clients.

DCD with proactive approach, dynamic marketing tools and strategies, and on-time launch and completion has recorded revenue that contributed over 43% to Doordarshan's total revenue.

DCD has launched the production & telecast of "Swachh Bharat Abhiyan" from DD-1. Swachh Bharat Abhiyan campaign is being produced and telecast on behalf of the Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation and it is an ongoing campaign.

Ayushman Bharat' – Doordarshan has collaborated with Ministry of AYUSH in achieving their goal of educating and creating healthy India through revival of traditional system of medicine.

Revenue Strategy Division (RSD)

A Revenue Strategy Division (RSD) was set up on 7th October,2015 under Prasar Bharati headed by ADG(Commercial) AIR and co-opting a suitable senior officer from Data strengthen this Division on 2nd Feburary,2016 a Revenue Services Division was set up in Prasar Bharati to look into the following issues in a time bound manner:-

- Setting up of Professional Advertisement Sales Teams;
- Outsourcing of Revenue of specific channels or bands like DD News;
- Undertaking 'Syndicated Content Sale';
- Optimising Revenue from Free Dish through revised agreements;
- Focussing on all advertisements and sponsorship of DD Kisan;
- Reworking and sale of Advertisement Sales inventory for three hours of DD National (controlled by DDK, Delhi) and linkages to DD National;
- On-line sales of archival materials through e-retailers;
- Any other matter referred to RSD.

The RSD will work on strategies to augment commercial revenue of AIR and DD. Its tasks would inter-alia include:

• Ascertain state by state and city by city, who actually collects revenue for the three verticals, (DD-Corporate, DD-Government and AIR) and also to pin-point, where there absolutely no machinery for this purpose.

• Assess the work of these units thoroughly and give recommendations for repatriation of Programme personnel, who have not shown any effectiveness in commercial operations.

• Locate Programme personnel with interest and/or experience, suitable new recruits, to serve either in Mumbai or in Delhi or in some other stations directly under a determined authority, to monitor his/her work.

• Locate qualified and willing Engineering officers for two or three year stints in any of the Revenue Divisions.

• Suggest and implement strategies for improving the efficiency of the Revenue collection machinery and for reaching out to smaller advertisers.

• Innovate on newer sources of additional revenue.

• Study the commercial impact of each programme that is being telecast or is likely to be telecast, especially through the reception it gets from private advertisers and non-Central Government bodies.

In the meetings of RSD and BDC under Prasar Bharati major decision taken up during the year 2015-16:-

- On-line sales of archival materials through e-retailers;
- Revenue target for DD (Rs.899.19 cr.)&AIR (Rs.525.00 cr.) for FY 2016-17 set up.
- Proposal for engagement of Sales Agents in Doordarshan.

- Proposal put up on slot sale policy of Doordarshan.
- Proposal for undertaking 'Syndicated Content Sale'.
- Incentive policy for DD & AIR commercial personnel.
- Preparation for felicitation of outstanding achievers in commercial domain.

Commercial & Revenue Division

Prasar Bharati set up marketing divisions in 2001, later on renamed as Commercial & Revenue Division, at various places in the country for facilitating a professional interface between clients /advertising agencies/sponsors. These marketing divisions are responsible for air time marketing and sales of both Doordarshan and All India Radio. These marketing divisions are operating at Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai, Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Thiruvananthapuram, Guwahati and Jalandhar. The Marketing Division at Thiruvananthapuram is having a branch office at Kochi as well. Details of areas of operation of various Doordarshanmarketing divisions with revenue earned during 2015-16 are as follows:-

DD-Archives

From 1959 to 2003, DD Archives was more or less a storehouse and archiving was only a process of not erasing recordings which were deemed to be important by individuals. Doordarshan Archives reinvented itself in 2003 with a new approach and prepared itself to meet the challenges of Audio Visual Digital World. AIR and DD under Prasar Bharati (India's Public Service Broadcaster) is operating 218 radio stations and 67 DD Kendras producing audio & audio visual programs over several decades pertaining to eminent leaders, great scholars, artists, historians, sports and other events, etc. Also manuscript, Journals, photographs,

brochures of yesteryears are available with AIR & DD.

Preservation of the rich heritage, art and culture of this great country over the years is not only the duty but also the responsibility of Prasar Bharati by digitizing and creating a world class archive for the use of generations to come.

Prasar Bharati has taken various initiatives to digitise and preserve these content by cataloguing, digitising, creating metadata, Meta tagging and preserve by deep archiving. The technical infrastructure is in position at Delhi, Kolkata for Doordarshan and at five locations in AIR namely Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai, Hyderabad and Chennai. All brochures, manuscripts and journals are collected from all stations and are in the process of digitisation. 4000 hrs of content in Doordarshan and 6500 hrs of content in AIR have been digitised and deep archived. Approximately 35000 legacy tapes are digitized into DVC Pro 50 format. Action to develop a Web portal is also under progress and through which research institutes, universities and other academics can access these content besides public in large.

In order to speed up the mission of digitization and archiving, Prasar Bharati has created five Zones in Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai, Chennai and Guwahati. The infrastructure facilities with manpower are being created at all these Zones to carry out digitization in a time bound manner.

A centralised PB Archives having state of the art technology and world class facilities are under planning.

Media Publicity Division

MPD, previously known as PR Section, primarily has two teams in place; one is the Print & Outdoor team and second is the Social Media team. Print & Outdoor team is responsible for planning and execution of Print campaigns and out of Home/ Hoarding campaigns on pan-India basis.

The two major multi media campaigns undertaken during this time period are, one- pertaining to the promotion of mid-prime time slot of DD National (12:00- 3:00 pm) and second the wide spread publicity of the prime time slot of DD National (7:00- 11:00 pm). For the first time, the DD National campaign was executed in Delhi Metro (in the in-coach panels) and Ho Ho buses. A Press Conference pertaining to the launch of prime time serials on DD National was also arranged on a mega scale, which resulted in noteworthy media coverage in top English& Hindi newspapers and also on online portals. The team also develops and executes TV Listings of DD National, DD Bharati and DD Urdu, which is being published in Times of India, Hindustan Times and Indian Express, on daily basis. Electronic Program Guide (EPG) of the six national channels and the regional channels is also furnished by the team to NDTV, which is then shared with the Cable and DTH operators, across the length and breadth of the country. Organizing Press Conferences on timely subjects like MOU signings, major achievements and developments etc, issuing of Press Releases and maintaining positive media relations is also been taken care of. A pioneer project was implemented, wherein Unipoles were constructed in and around Doordarshan premises of Mandi House, AIR, Todapur and Pitampura. Initially, these sites were used to publicise Doordarshan programmes, however plans are underway to monetize these sites to earn revenue.

Social Media Team at Doordarshan is responsible for daily updates across official pages of Facebook, Twitter and YouTube. The constant efforts have resulted in 13.0 lakh likes on the official Facebook page of Doordarshan.

Progressive use of Hindi in DG: Doordarshan

To ensure the compliance of the Official Language policy and instructions relating to the progressive use of Hindi, there is a separate Hindi Section in the Doordarshan Directorate. This section reviews the position relating to the progressive use of Hindi in the Directorate and its subordinate offices and makes all efforts to promote the progressive use of Hindi.

Main activities of the section during the year 2015-16:-

• All documents under Section 3(3) of the Official Language Act 1963, were issued in bi-lingual form and all letters received in Hindi were replied to in Hindi during the year.

• To review the position of the compliance of the Official Language policy in the Directorate, two meetings of the Official Language Implementation Committee were held, one meeting of the committee in December, 2015 and the other meeting in March, 2016.

• Hindi workshops were organized from time to time to create awareness among the officers/employees in Official Language Hindi and to motivate them to do their work in Hindi.

• Hindi Month was organized from 01st to 30th September, 2015 and various competitions held.

• Committee of Parliament on Official Languages inspected 6 Doordarshan Kendras/offices during the year.

• A Regional Official Language Conference of the head of offices of DDKs/DMCS/HPTs situated in east and north east region held in January, 2016.

DDK: Delhi

Doordarshan Kendra Delhi is the primary Kendra of the country and has the credit of not only originating and launching television in India in September 1959 but also of presenting the National Transmission to the rest of the country, since its inception. It is responsible for 24 x 7 hour transmission of DD-I and DD Bharati while simultaneously functioning as a regional centre for Delhi, its adjoining areas and Low Power Transmitters (LPTs) scattered in remote areas of the country.

The Kendra also originates over 160 live outdoor broadcasts annually on the National Programme. Besides being carried terrestrially by all other Doordarshan Kendra, many of these events being of national and international importance are also utilized by satellite channels based in India and other international channels.

The Kendra also coordinates the state-of-the art archiving and restoration equipment with playback facilities of DD Archives at Akashvani Bhawan. In addition, the Kendra provides technical facilities and support for DD News.

Doordarshan, Kolkata was commissioned on 9th August, 1975. Colour transmission including outside coverages through OB Van started on 6th June, 1983. Doordarshan Mumbai came on Television map of India on 2nd October 1972, whereas Regional Service was commissioned on 9th August, 1986. At present DDK Mumbai manages transmission of two 24 hours channels namely DD National and DD Sahyadri (RLSC). HD Studio was inaugurated on 8th July, 2013. RNU Regional started on YouTube from 15th January, 2015, having 67000 views, 810 subscribers and 18%

views outside India (9 % from US) in 2015-16. Digital Terrestrial Transmission of Doordarshan for Mobile Users was inaugurated with effect from 1.1.2016 at DDK, Mumbai. Viewers of Mumbai and suburbs can receive 5 Video channels viz. DD National, DD News, DD Sports, DD Bharati and DD Sahyadri with 3 Radio channels viz. FM Rainbow, FM Gold and Vividh Bharati.

A 10 KW HPT was commissioned on 14th January, 1987 at Kodaikanal Hill. 'Direct to Home' was commissioned on 16th December 2004 with DD Direct Plus on Doordarshan's DTH platform. Tamil (Regional Language) is the major language of telecast occupying first position with 91.1%, followed by Slide/ Filler/ Announcement (4.2%),Commercial (3.0%), No language programme (0.9%), English(0.5%), Malayalam, Urdu and Hindi each having 0.1% share of total languages.

Doordarshan Network

Programme Production centres

For in house Programme production, there are 67 Studio centres in the country. These include 17 major Studio centres at state capitals, a Regional Production Centre at Guwahati and 49 other Studio centres located at various places in the country. State-wise list of Studio centres is given at Annexure-I.

Terrestrial Transmitters

For terrestrial transmission, 1416 transmitters of varying power, installed throughout length and breadth of the country, are in operation. Break up of these transmitters is as under:

State wise no. of transmitters is given at Annexure II. In terrestrial mode, DD 1 (National) Channel coverage is estimated to be available to about 92.6% population of the country. Terrestrial coverage of DD News Channel is estimated to be available to about 49% population. Area-wise coverage of DD 1 and DD News Channel is 81% and 26%, respectively.

Free-to-air DTH "DD Direct +"

Doordarshan launched its free-to-air DTH service "DD Free Dish" (Earlier DD Direct+) in December, 2004 with a bouquet of 33 TV channels. This service was started with the primary objective of providing TV coverage to the areas hitherto uncovered by terrestrial transmitters. Capacity of DTH Platform was subsequently augmented to 59 TV channels. DTH signals can be received anywhere in the country (except Andaman & Nicobar Islands) with the help of small sized dish receive units. For A&N Islands, DTH service in C-band with a bouquet of 10 channels was started with effect from September, 2009. Upgradation of Doordarshan's DTH Platform "DD FREE DISH" from 59 to 112 channels has recently been completed and Commissioning of upgraded platform is dependent upon implementation of Conditional Access System (CAS).Presently, 64 TV channels are available on DTH platform.

Developmental activities during 2015-16:

Digitalisation

Projects for establishment of 40 digital high power transmitters as part of continuing scheme of 11th Plan are being implemented in two phases. In first phase, 19 digital transmitters are under implementation. Installation completed for 16 digital HPTs and these are ready for commissioning and the remaining 03 digital HPTs are at advanced stage of completion. These 19 digital HPTs are expected to be commissioned during the current Plan period.

Remaining 21 digital high power transmitters are to be set up along with 23 additional digital high power transmitters approved as part of 12th Plan new schemes. Action has been initiated for setting up of these 44 digital HPTs (21 DTTs as part of 11th Plan & 23 DTTs approved as part of 12th Plan). Specifications for transmitter equipment are under finalization. These 44 digital HPTs are expected to be setup, in phases, in about 2 years' time.

Locations of 40 digital HPTs approved in 11th Plan and 23 digital HPTs approved in 12th Plan are given at Annexure-III.

New 24 hrs Satellite Channel

A new 24 hrs Satellite channel "DD Kisan", Doordarshan's farmer-centric channel, was launched on 26.05.2015. This channel is available in the bouquet of Doordarshan's DTH Service "Free Dish". Number of DD Channels now stands at 36.

<u>DTH</u>

Installation of equipment for upgradation of Doordarshan's DTH Platform "DD FREE DISH" from 59 to 112 channels has been completed. Commissioning of upgraded platform is dependent upon implementation of

Conditional Access System (CAS). All the channels would be free and no subscription would be payable by the viewers. Presently, there are 64 channels on DTH Platform.

Prasar Bharati Board, in its 129th meeting held on 16.10.2015, has approved engagement of Deity approved Indian CAS vendor, M/s By Design, for implementation of CAS on "DD Free Dish".

High Definition Television (HDTV)

HDTV refers to video having resolution 5 times higher than traditional television systems (Standard-Definition TV). Main features of HDTV are - Crystal clear & noise free picture; more realistic colours; wide screen picture and more viewing realism.

Following HDTV projects are presently under implementation:

HDTV transmitters at Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai (Installation of transmitters has been completed at all locations and ready for commissioning.)

Multi-Camera mobile production facility at Delhi

HDTV Studios at Kolkata & Chennai (Layout Plan & Specifications are under finalization).

Modernization, Augmentation and Replacement

It has been the constant endeavour of Doordarshan to modernize its network by replacing old equipment by the state-of-art equipment and augment the existing facilities. At present, following major projects have been implemented/are under implementation for modernization and augmentation of Doordarshan network.

Setting up of five high power transmitters (10 KW) at Rajouri (DD1 & DD News), Green Ridge (DD1), Himbotingla Top (DD1) &Patni Top (DD 1) in J&K for expansion of terrestrial coverage. At Rajouri, transmitters are to be installed in the existing AIR building. Building modification has been completed. Action for procurement of transmitters at Rajouri in progress. Tenders have been invited, opened& tech. evaluation completed. Order is to be placed. Sites at other 3 locations finalized and taken over &building construction is in progress.

12th Plan of Doordarshan

Doordarshan's 12th Plan scheme "Broadcasting Infrastructure Network Development" has been approved at an outlay of Rs.1893.14 crore. This includes Rs.1215 crore for continuing schemes and an amount of Rs.678.14 crore has been allocated for new schemes. Main thrust areas in 12th Plan are –expansion of DTH; expansion of HDTV; digitalization of Doordarshan network; modernization of Doordarshan's Studio, Transmitter and Satellite broadcast equipment.

CHAPTER V

PRASAR BHARATI – FINANCE & ACCOUNTS

ACCOUNTING SYSTEM AND ACCOUNTS

Prasar Bharati has switched over from the Government budgeting and accounting system to accrual accounting system with effect from 01.04.2005. Pursuant to this, Prasar Bharati started receiving the financial support from the Central Government in the form of Grant-in-Aid to cover part of its Revenue Expenditure (Plan & Non-Plan) and loans hitherto received to cover the part of its Capital Expenditure (Plan) are also being received as grants w.e.f. 2012-13 onwards. The revenue-earnings of Prasar Bharati, which were required to be credited into the Consolidated Fund of India prior to its de-linking from the Government budgeting system are now retained by Prasar Bharati in its IEBR (Internal & Extra-Budgetary Resources).

In terms of a Memorandum of Understanding signed between Prasar Bharati and the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting on 22nd May, 2000, Prasar Bharati is required to render the monthly account of expenditure and receipts to the Government. Annual statement of accounts is also required to be prepared and got audited by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India. The accounts of Prasar Bharati certified by C&AG are forwarded annually to the Central Government for being laid in both the Houses of Parliament.

PROFORMA ACCOUNTS

Prior to the corporatization of Prasar Bharati, both Doordarshan and All India Radio were preparing Proforma Accounts to reflect the transactions related to their commercial activities. Special efforts were made to complete these accounts. All India Radio and Doordarshan have now completed the Proforma Accounts upto 31st March, 2000. These Proforma Accounts were submitted to the respective AG offices for audit.

TAXES LEVIED ON PRASAR BHARATI

INCOME TAX

Exemption from Income Tax has been granted to Prasar Bharati vide Finance Bill 2012-CBDT Circular No.3/2012 dated 12.06.2012 by insertion of a NEW CLAUSE 23BBH Under Section 10 of the IT Act with effect from 1.4.2013. The clause reads as under:

Clause 23BBH [any income of the Prasar Bharati (Broadcasting Corporation of India) established under sub- section (1) of section 3 of the Prasar Bharati (Broadcasting Corporation of India) Act, 1990].

Apart from having received Income Tax Refunds for more than Rs.20 crores in past, Prasar Bharati has been able to get another refund of Rs.4,03,14,540/- for A.Y.2014-15 (FY 2013-14) vide DD No. 931653 dated 29.03.2016.

On having received Certification of Audit by C&AG, Income Tax Return of Prasar Bharati for the Financial Year 2014-15 has been filed on 14.3.2016.

SERVICE TAX

Prasar Bharati was not liable to be taxed earlier by virtue of Section 22 of Prasar Bharati Act, 1990 which was subsequently omitted vide Finance Act, 2002 and Prasar Bharati was made liable to collect & pay Service Tax w.e.f. 01.04.2003 onwards. Since then Prasar Bharati has been depositing Service Tax each month regularly.

In the absence of dedicated financial cadre with requisite expertise in Service Tax, compliances vis-à-vis Service Tax rules have sometimes suffered. Further timely availability of input credit vouchers from over 600 DDOs of AIR & DD spread across the country especially during Tax Audit by authorities may become difficult. Resultantly some notices have been received from Service Tax Authorities which are being dealt with either by making the necessary details available or through Appeals to CESTAT, wherever required. A hearing on 'Stay Application' for the Year 2008-09 has been held by CESTAT on 28.9.2015 wherein the requirement of further pre-deposit has been waived and Stay recovery has been ordered by the Tribunal in favour of Prasar Bharati during pendency of the appeal.

INTERNAL AUDIT

Under the Government Budgetary System, internal audit functions were discharged by the Chief Controller of Accounts, Ministry of Information & Broadcasting through its PAOs (Pay and Accounts Offices) identified for the purpose. Prasar Bharati is in the process of developing its own internal audit system by creating its own Finance & Accounts cadre. Internal Audit of 100 selected DDOs of Prasar Bharati scattered all over India for the years 2012-13 & 2013-14 was however, got conducted by outsourcing a Chartered Accountant firm namely M/s Sushil Jeetpuria & Co. The Report for the years 2012-13 and 2013-14 submitted by the firm has been forwarded to the Directorates for compliance.

SCHEDULE 25- SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Method of accounting

The accounts of the Corporation are prepared under the historical cost convention using the accrual method of accounting. On this basis revenue and related assets are recognised when earned and expenses are recognised when the obligation is incurred.

2. Inventory Valuation

Stores and Spares (including machinery spares) are valued at cost.

3. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at transfer amount in respect of assets transferred to Prasar Bharati and the corresponding credit is to "Loan In Perpetuity". Transfer of Assets by the Central Government are subject to actual valuation and verifications.

In respect of capital expenditure incurred on different Plan schemes undertaken by AIR and DD all related &associated expenses are capitalized.

4.Method of depreciation

Depreciation is charged on straight line method at rates computed on useful life of the assets prescribed based on the IMG recommendations. Accordingly, the rates adopted are: Building-2%, Studio, Transmitter, Machinery & Equipments and Other Fixed assets-10%, Electrical installation-4%, Vehicles-20%, Furniture & Fixtures-6.25%, Office Equipments-16.67% and Computers-33.33%.

5. Foreign Currency Transactions

Transaction in foreign currencies are accounted for at the prevailing exchange rates at the date of transactions.

6. License Fee and Consultancy fee

License fee and consultancy fee is recognized when receivable.

1. Prasar Bharati Broadcasting Corporation of India is established as general public utility institution and fall under the category of "Not-for-Profit Organization". Accordingly, based on Generally accepted accounting practices, and Section 145 of Income Tax Act, it can follow either cash or mercantile system of accounting. Considering the organization structure and prevalent past practices and the simplicity aspects, cash basis of accounting was being adopted upto 31.03.2005. From 01.04.2005 the accounts are initially compiled on cash basis at field unit level and subsequently converted into accrual basis to the extent possible, based on the information collected from both the Directorates. Prasar Bharati Board however, decided to give effect to complete switch over from cash to accrual accounting at field unit also. However, it would take time due to complex nature of organizational structure and lack of trained accounting staff at field units.

Bank Guarantee of Rs. 24.60 crore of M/s SIS Live was invoked and the matter is under arbitration. M/s SIS live submitted their claims for Rs. 106.88 crore as per contract, Rs. 24.60 crore towards BG and for damages GBP 9381,098. Out of that, an amount of Rs. 106.88 crore has been included in the liabilities. However, Damages claimed by M/s SIS Live are not acknowledged as liability as the Corporation has also lodged a counter claim of Rs. 147.60 crore.

3. The amount of Fixed Assets transferred at book value to Prasar Bharati by the Central Government is based on Chief Controller of Accounts' letter No. CCA/I&B/2002 dated 3.09.02 and is also subject of physical verification and valuation

4. The value of the assets sold/disposed of during the year has not been deducted from the Gross Block of Assets due to non-availability of details

5. Grants received from Central Government are treated as Income, which together with internal revenue is utilized to meet expenses.

Major proportion of deficit is represented by non-cash transactions such as depreciation, Loans due & interest thereon and Spectrum & Space Segment Charges.

6. The Group of Ministers on Prasar Bharati has decided to convert the Loan in Perpetuity & Capital Loan into grant and to waive off interest there on. However, Notification in this regard is yet to be issued by Ministry.

7. Interest rate on Loan in Perpetuity granted by Government is 7% p.a. and on Capital Loan received from Government during 1.4.2000 to 31.03.2006 is 14.5% p.a. and received after 1.4.2006 is 11.5% p.a.

8. Taxation

Prasar Bharati is exempt from Income Tax as per Clause 23BBH under Section-10 of Income Tax Act.

- 9. Prasar Bharati's contribution towards Leave salary and Pension in respect of employees on deemed deputation is charged as expenditure.
- 10. Inter Office Transactions Accounts

On review it was noted that 'Inter Office Transactions Accounts' and the figures under 'Capital Work in Progress' require immediate reconciliation. Accordingly, the work of reconciliation, zone-wise, outsourced to the firms of Chartered Accountant for completing the work. The firm of Chartered Accountants has submitted their report accordingly the following transaction has been incorporated in financial reports of 2014-15.

- a. Remittance in Transit of Rs 1.95 crores has been reconciled and accordingly this amount is reduced from overall deficit of revenue over expenditure during the year.
- 11. Deposit Works Amounts received from parties for deposit work, is after adjusting expenditure against such work.
- 12. Audit fee payable to C&AG for auditing Prasar Bharati's Accounts has been provided for.
- 13. Sundry debtors-good includes interest component of Rs.44.06 crore.
- 14. Provision for Rs.26.66 crore to the extent of 50% of Doubtful Sundry Debtors has been provided.
- 15. Provision for Spectrum & Space Segment charges and some other liabilities have been provided on estimated basis.
- 16. Income from Services (Commercial Revenue), License Fee for AIR/DD Towers and DTH income includes Service Tax component of Rs. 133.55 crore, Rs.8.18 crore and Rs. 9.61 crore respectively.
- 17. Interest on Fixed deposit of Field offices and on Advances to staff is accounted for as and when received. The quantum of accrued interest cannot be computed due to flexible tenure and interest rates on CLTD accounts and advances.
- 18. Provision of Rs.16.02 crore and Rs.12.49 crore in respect of "Other Departmental Loans/Advances" and "Inventories" respectively under Current Assets has been provided as item/party wise details of these are not available and the amount was being carried forward without any change for the last three years.
